**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
PROSSER APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT NUMBER 2010-WPC-
283 FOR STATE PURCHASING COOPERATIVE**

WHEREAS, the State Purchasing Cooperative allows its members access to State contracts for goods and services resulting in cost savings for Cooperative members; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council approved an Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Washington Department of General Administration for State Purchasing Cooperative in 2010; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Prosser's membership expired on December 31, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, State Legislature approved the consolidation of all or portions of the Washington State Department of Information Services, Department of Personnel, State Printer, General Administration, and the Office of Financial Management (Agencies) into the Department of Enterprise Services; and,


WHEREAS, the Department of Enterprise Services has allowed State Purchasing Cooperative members to extend 2010-2011 Co-op memberships for an additional year at the same yearly membership rate.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Prosser that:


1. The City of Prosser, as a Cooperative Member, consents to the assignment of the Intergovernmental Agreement 2010-WPC-283 to the Department of Enterprise Services, effective October 1, 2011.
2. The Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement Number 2010-WPC-283 for State Purchasing Cooperative extending the City of Prosser's membership by one year, to expire on December 31, 2012, is hereby approved and the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement Amendment.
