
Rental Information and Fees*

The Prosser City Council is currently recruiting to fill the Position No. 7 vacancy. City Council meets regularly on the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Tuesdays of each month, starting at 7:00 p.m. Council members may also participate on committees, in community events, or other needs of the City. Typically, City Council meetings run approximately one hour.

Councilors are provided a monthly stipend of \$250, a City-issued tablet, and given access to many training opportunities. City Council Goals Public Input Session

The City of Prosser has scheduled a meeting to receive public feedback and further discussion on the City Council's Proposed Goals for 2016 through 2019. Your input will greatly influence the finalization of these goals.

The meeting will take place on Tuesday, August 16, 2016, at City Hall (601 7th St.) beginning at 7:00 p.m. and go until 8:30 p.m. It will be an open discussion format meeting where the public can express their support, concerns, ideas, or opinions on other goals that ought to be included. City staff members will be present to gather your feedback for inclusion in the final discussions with City Council.

The Prosser City Council is expected to finalize their goals in September. These goals will help guide the City, in correlation with the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan and other planning documents, for more than two years.


