ACTIVITY LOG

Week of January 05 to January 11, 2024

January 05 (37 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to an assist call at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. RP stated that his bathroom was flooded from the upstairs neighbor. He was advised to call his landlord.
- Officer assist with tow pickup of vehicle in the river from previous traffic accident report.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP stated that she believes there are people in her apartment. She is waiting outside. Officers checked her apartment and there was no one in there. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of a court order violation taken at the PPD. RP stated that his ex is following him (going against a court order). Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to a report of narcotics at the 100 block of N Wamba Road. Management found a mail item containing narcotics and searched the recipient's room, finding more drugs. The drugs were confiscated.
- Officers responded to a report of destruction of property at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated they saw a male passenger of a truck get out and write on a trash can with a marker. The trash can was cleaned up by an employee. Subject appeared to be with a crew of workers and was in a white Ford F150.
- BCSO officer assist with a domestic between a mother and daughter at the 800 block of Higdon. Verbal only. No crime at this time.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Wine Country Road/Wittkopf Loop Road. The RP stated that a black and white husky type dog was at large in the area. Officer was able to locate the owner, who was given a verbal warning for dog at large.
- Officer responded to an informational report at N Albro Road/W Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that there is an individual at the location who is parked near work vehicles at a construction site, loading his truck with lumber. Officers contacted the male who was only loading broken branches. The subject was advised that they need to contact the property owners prior to collecting anything from the site. No lumber was taken.
- Officers responded to a report of dumping at Wine Country Road / I 82. RP state that there are boxes and construction debris in the road at the location. City works was contacted to clear the debris.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1800 block of Highland Road. RP stated that there is a dog at the location who is injured and the RP is unable to contact the owner. Officers tried to contact the owner to no avail. The officers found a German Shepard tightly tangled in a cable with no food, water, or shelter. The dog was impounded until owner was able to provide for the needs of the dog. The dog owner was able to provide all necessary needs and the dog was taken home.
- Officer responded to a report of a vehicle prowl at the 1300 block of Sommers Ave. RP stated that some juveniles were trying to pull on handles of vehicles in the area and took off. Officers were unable to locate them.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

January 06 (29 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a runaway on Molly Rose Court. RP stated that their son had left home in the wee hours of the morning. Son was located at a friend's house and was returned home.
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that one male had started hitting another at the location. Video of the incident was collected and the aggressor was charged with assault. No medics were needed.
- Officers responded to a report of destruction of property at the 1400 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that her daughter's windshield and back window had been broken into at some point in the night. Investigation is ongoing.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a disturbance on W North River Road. 1 subject was arrested and transported to BC jail.
- Officer responded to a report of a court order violation at the 1500 block of Paterson Road. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to finding a vehicle parked in a no parking zone on Petra Avenue/Basalt Loop. Driver was given a warning to not park there or face vehicle impound.
- Officers contacted 2 occupants in a vehicle at Crawford Park after closing hours. They were advised to move along.
- BCSO officer assist with a transport of a male to BC jail for a warrant.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

January 07 (33 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a domestic-no assault on W Foisy Road. Husband and wife were arguing as the husband wanted to leave the house and the wife did not want him to as she was worried about it being cold. This upset the husband. The husband eventually went to his mother's for the evening.
- Officers served paperwork on W. Johnson Road. No issues.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 300 block of Basalt Loop. A vehicle's horn was going off non-stop. The vehicle appeared to be abandoned and the registration was expired. The owner was contacted and advised that the vehicle would need to be towed as there were no other viable options.
- Officers responded to a report of a suicidal subject at the 400 block of North River Road. The RP stated that he was concerned about his girlfriend who was saying that she had taken pills or that she would hurt herself. Officers contacted the female who was fine and never made such comments. Female stated that the male was upset that she had blocked his phone number so he was making false allegations. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of threats at the 1400 block of Riverside Drive. RP stated that her ex stated he was going to shoot up her house but had deleted any texts or proof that he was threatening her.
- Officers responded to a non-injury traffic accident at the 1800 block of Highland Drive. 1 vehicle hit another that was stopped. Minor damage and no injuries. Information was exchanged.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 700 block of Memorial Street. RP stated that a patient had walked out even though they were not supposed to. Subject was assisted back to the hospital to await transport to another facility.
- BCSO officer assist with locating a vehicle owner for a suspicious car. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

January 08 (30 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a request for assistance at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated an occupied vehicle was parked in the parking lot after hours and they would like the driver to be moved along. The vehicle had left prior to officer arrival.
- BCSO officer assist for a DV assault at the 500 block of Albro Road. A male and female were witnessed verbally and physically fighting at the location. Both parties left the scene prior to officer arrival and the two subjects fighting were not identified with certainty.
- Prosser Police Officers were dispatched to a residence on the 1400 block of Riverside Drive for a possible drive-by shooting. Upon further investigation, Officers found the home struck multiple times by gunfire. There were no reported injuries and it was determined the suspect was known to the victim.

Prosser PD quickly identified a suspect and requested assistance from neighboring agencies. The 17-year old male juvenile suspect was located north of Sunnyside and fled from officers. Efforts from the Sunnyside Police Department, Yakima County Sheriff's Office and the Mabton Police Department later led to an arrest.

The juvenile was transported to the Benton County Juvenile Justice Center where he was booked for:

RCW 9A.36.011 Assault 1st Degree - Domestic Violence

RCW 9A.36.045 Drive-by Shooting - Domestic Violence

RCW 9A.36.021 Assault 2nd Degree (four counts)

The juvenile is facing additional felony charges out of Yakima County. The Prosser Police Department would like to thank its law enforcement partners from the Yakima County Sheriff's Office, Sunnyside Police Department and the Mabton Police Department for their assistance during this investigation.

- Officers responded to an audible alarm at the 2000 block of Wine Country Road. Officers were able to contact staff on site, no problems were found.
- Officers responded to a report of graffiti at the 1000 block of Parker Court. RP did not want to file a report but asked that it be covered.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint on Wine Country Road / I 82. RP state that there is a husky type dog running around the location. Officer was unable to locate the dog upon arrival.
- EMS officer assist with a medical incident. No issues.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1000 block of Bennett Avenue. A large husky was wandering around in the area.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at SW Montecito Drive/SW SR 22. RP stated that a white Toyota SUV is brake checking them. Due to the area and direction of travel incident was transferred to WSP.
- Officers responded to a request for civil assistance at the police department. RP was completing a parental custody exchange and 1 half of the exchange has an NCO in place. Parties parked across the parking lot from one another and the exchange took place.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

January 09 (32 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 300 block of Chardonnay Avenue. RP stated that there are two individuals at the location that have been given previous warnings about loitering

in the area. Officers contacted the subjects, who stated that their battery is dead and a friend is on the way to help. They advised they will be gone as soon as possible.

- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1500 block of Paterson Road. A husky with an eye injury was found in the location. Dog was assessed for health condition and then impounded at the police department while officer tries to locate an owner.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1800 block of Benson Avenue. RP stated that an at large dog bit them, (only after being spooked). The RP had secured the dog at the locations. Officers were able to return the dog to its home and will contact the owner.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1400 block of Grant Avenue. An at large dog was detained and returned to its home.
- Officer responded to a request for assist concerning a possible court order violation at the 1800 block of Highland Drive. RP stated that her ex was texting her. This is the second incident where the court order came back as not active. RP was advised to contact the issuing court (which she did).
- Multiple agency officers assist with a report (originally) of lewd conduct on N. Dallas Road. RP stated that someone was urinating on the side of the road and then just standing beside his car with his pants down. After the vehicle took off, officers attempted to pull the vehicle over as the vehicle was reported stolen. The vehicle was eventually stopped (via tire spikes) in Grandview where the three individuals in the stolen vehicle were detained/arrested.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1300 block of Scenic Drive following a 911 hang up. No issues were found.
- Officers discovered a student driver car with the rear lights on at Prosser High School. The car was secure and the officer will contact the school in the morning.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

January 10 (31 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to an open storage unit at the 200 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. Officer contacted a female inside the storage unit who stated that it is her unit and she had fallen asleep. No other issues.
- Officer responded to a report of a one-vehicle traffic accident on I82 and Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle had spun off of the road into the median and that the driver was ok except for his shoulder hurting. Officers attempted to locate the vehicle in a two mile stretch of the reported area to no avail.
- Officer responded to a parking violation at Park Avenue/Market Street. Officer noted a vehicle parked on the sidewalk. The responsible owner was contacted and they moved the vehicle.
- Officers responded to a report of a domestic assault at the 900 block of Florence Street. A male verbally and physically assaulted a female. The male was arrested for DV and transported to BC jail.
- Officers responded to an informational report for Wine Country Road and S Wamba Road. RP stated that the traffic lights are not working properly. Officer contacted the streets department to take care of the issue.
- Officer responded to a request for a disturbance at the 300 block of 7th Street. RP wanted a male trespassed following a disturbance at the location. Male was gone prior to officer arrival. RP was advised to call if the male returns.
- Officer responded to a report of theft at the 2000 block of Highland Drive. RP stated that her daughter had her right earbud with the case stolen from school on the 8th. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of an alarm at the 600 block of Frontier Rd. Officer met with employees. No issues found.
