## ACTIVITY LOG

### WEEK OF January 20, 2022 to January 26, 2023

#### January 20 (24 Calls for Service)

- Welfare check on the 1000 block of Burgundy Place, a female advised dispatch she had been kicked out of her place, and was screaming "help me" on the phone. Another female got on the line and advised nothing was wrong. Officers contacted the residence, the dispute had only been verbal.
- Traffic stop conducted in the area of Petra Ave and North River Road, a vehicle was seen driving with no lights on in the dark, the vehicle was also seen striking the sidewalk and when turning turned into the on-coming lane. Officers conducted the traffic stop and spoke with the driver, the driver was arrested for driving under the influence. The driver was transported to Benton County Jail.

#### January 21 (14 Calls for Service)

- Welfare check requested in the area of the Grant Street bridge, the RP advised there was a flattened tent under the bridge where a transient male has been previous seen, and advised that next to the tent there was trash and what appeared like a pile of bedding. The RP wanted officers to check that the male was not under the pile. Officers checked the pile and did not locate anyone under the pile nor in the area.
- Field contact on the 300 block of Gap Road, officers made contact with a male who was loading pallets onto his truck. The male advised he had permission from a worker from the construction site to collect them. Officers made contact with the property owner who was advised no one had permission to take the pallets. The male was told to unload the pallets and was sent on his way.
- 911 hang up received on the 1400 block of Grant, officers made contact with a female who had scratch marks and her children were crying as a male left the residence. Officers attempted to speak with the female and her children but no one from the residence would cooperate with officers. Domestic violence information pamphlets were left with the female.
- Suspicious person reported in the area of 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Spokane Ave, the RP reported seeing a male walking around the area with a camera and was recording houses. Officers made contact with the RP and advised since the male was on public property, it was not a crime.

#### January 22 (21 Calls for Service)

- Malicious mischief reported on the 1400 block of Paterson Road, the RP stated his house had been egged and beans had been poured on the RP's front steps. Officers are investigating this incident.
- Alarm call at Farm Supply, an employee had accidently set off the alarm when they opened a door at the business. Officers made contact with the employee, no further issues arose.
- Suspicious activity reported at Red Pawn, a male was seen digging through items at the business. The male advised officers that he had permission from the owner to do so. Officers contacted the owner who requested the male be asked to leave the premise. Officers requested the male leave, the male left with no issues.

- Suspicious activity reported on the 200 block of Ladera Street, the RP advised his wife and daughter thought they heard someone in their back yard. Officers checked the area and did not locate anyone in the area.

## **January 23** (14 Calls for Service)

- Loitering reported at the Grant Street Bridge, report received of a homeless camp underneath the bridge. Officers checked the area and found an abandoned tent underneath the bridge. Officers did not observe any activity underneath the bridge.
- Information reported at the Prosser PD, the RP advised her elderly brother was walking around and was refusing to get into her vehicle. Officers advised the RP that no crime has occurred and the RP's brother was not in any danger.

## **January 24** (21 Calls for Service)

- Assault reported at the Prosser PD, a juvenile and her mother made contact with officers and reported an incident that had occurred at Prosser High School, the parent stated her daughter was in class when one of her classmates reached over and cut her hair off. The parent advised she wanted officers to be aware of this incident in case further incidents occur.
- Disturbance reported on the 500 block of Wine Country Road, the RP advised a male was refusing to leave her property. Officers made contact with the male and RP, the male advised he had gone to the residence to retrieve a few of his belongings. The RP gave the male his belongings and advised she did not to press charges just for the male to leave the property. The male agreed to leave, no further issues arose.

## **January 25** (27 Calls for Service)

- Assistance requested on the 1100 block of Sheridan Ave, the RP advised he had been staying at his son in law's home. The RP advised he wasn't sure what was occurring with the residence because the residence will be really hot and suddenly extremely cold, the RP advised he also had previously attempted to turn on a vehicle at the property and fire came out of the back of the vehicle. Officers advised they are unable to assist with these issues, since they are not a criminal matter.
- Suspicious activity reported on the 600 block of Market Street, the RP stated he went to Yakima Federal bank and believed that the bank clerk had thoughts of shooting him because he felt a tingle and a twitch. The RP also advised he also believed the clerk had shot him with her mind because he felt another tingle but didn't have any bullet holes because he had checked. The RP stated he wanted officers to check if the clerk had a pistol on her person, he male also denied assistance from medics. Officers advised they would not do that, since no crime had actually occurred.
- Suspicious activity reported at the City Park, the RP advised a male was at the park and was possibly filming children at the park. Officers advised it is not illegal to film in a public park.
- Assistance requested at the Prosser PD, the RP advised officers she believed someone has been harassing her by using different phone numbers. Officers advised the RP to change her phone number and apply for a no contact order through the courts.

## **January 26** (17 Calls for Service)

- Traffic stop in the area of Market Street and Colena Street, an officer observed a vehicle failing to maintain their lane and also observed the vehicle almost cause an accident due to failing to yield to oncoming traffic. An officer made contact with the driver who advised she had been drinking prior to driving. The female was arrested for driving under the influence and was transported to Benton County Jail.
