ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF JANUARY 24, 2020 TO JANUARY 30, 2020

JANUARY 24 (28 calls for service)

- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 700 block of 6th Street. Reporting Party (RP) advised of a pickup truck that was unoccupied and left running in the area for over an hour. Officer contacted the owner who was nearby and advised that the truck was left running due to it having a weak battery.
- Civil issue in the 500 block of Evans Ave. RP called, advised that a male who was supposed to be purchasing her vehicle, but had not paid for it yet was on his way to the DMV to change the title over to his name. RP was advised that it was a civil issue and was told to go to the nearest DMV to request a lost title replacement for her vehicle.
- Warrant service in the area of Dudley Ave and Meade Ave. Officers on patrol saw a male known to have felony warrants in the area. When they tried to contact the male, he took off running. The male was caught about 15 minutes later in the 1100 block of Bennett Ave and taken into custody.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP wanted officers to tell her boyfriend to leave their residence. RP was advised that it was not a criminal matter and the PD did not have the authority to kick him out.
- Suspicious vehicle observed in the Chuckar Cherries parking lot after hours. Vehicle was observed stopped, then creeping forward along the building, stopping every few feet. Officer made contact with the driver who stated she was just turning around and while eating her Burking King fries.
- Fireworks complaint received in the 1200 block of Prosser Ave. RP advised two juveniles had set off fireworks near their vehicle and then took off running towards Paterson Road. Officers checked the area, but were not able to locate the juveniles.

JANUARY 25 (29 calls for service)

- Report of a possible vehicle prowling in progress received in the 1000 block of Alexander Ct. RP thought someone was breaking into her car because she could hear gravel moving outside. Responding officer found nothing out of place.
- Officers assisted Grandview PD with a vehicle pursuit that came into the Prosser area. Officers were not able to locate the vehicle.
- Animal complaint received in the 1500 block of Sheridan Ave. RP reported that their neighbor's Pit-Bull had jumped the fence and went after their cat. RP advised this is an ongoing issue. Officer contacted the dog's owner who brought the dog inside and advised that they were moving from the location in a few days so there wouldn't be any further problems.
- Fire alarm at Housel Middle School, responding officers found there were no problems and that the alarm had been pulled by a child.
- Dispatch advised of an open 911 line in the 600 block of New Gate Drive. Dispatcher could hear juveniles talking, but could not understand what they were saying. Officers contacted a residence and found kids playing outside. Officer spoke with an adult who advised they were trying to fix a broken phone and didn't realize they had called 911.
- Report of malicious mischief received in the 400 block of 8th Street. RP advised that someone had just thrown a rock through a window of their residence.
- Warrant service in the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Male was found to have an active warrant and was taken into custody.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a traffic stop in the area of W Old Inland Empire Hwy and N Pioneer Road. Suspected narcotics and a handgun were observed in the vehicle. Vehicle occupants were taken into custody by BCSO.
- Suspicious circumstances received in the 600 block of Wine Country Road. Report of a pickup truck left running in the area. Officer found the truck running, unlocked and with the keys inside. Officer attempted to contact the registered owner, but was not able to reach them.

Officers assisted BCSO with a DV malicious mischief report in the area of Pump Road. BCSO took one into custody.

JANUARY 26 (24 calls for service)

- Officers assisted WSP and BCSO with a felony stop in the area of Milepost 81. Vehicle was stopped in connection with a drive by shooting. Six individuals were detained and a weapon was recovered.
- Traffic stop in the 200 block of Gap Road resulted in a DUI arrest. Male driver was booked into the Benton County Jail.
- Malicious mischief report received in the 800 block of Main Street. RP advised they found a rock had been thrown through their vehicle's window some time during the evening, but it did not appear that any items had been taken.
- Assist in the area of Benson Ave. RP called advising they did not have any power. Officer contacted Benton PUD and advised them of the issue.
- Report of a disturbance received in the 1500 block of Sheridan Ave. Responding officers determined there was a verbal only argument between neighbors.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of N Rothrock Road with a no contact order violation. Suspect was not located at the time, but was captured a short time after.
- Animal complaint received in the 900 block of Campbell Drive. RP advising that their neighbor's Pit-Bull continually comes into their yard. Information was passed onto the Community Service Officer for follow up.
- Officers assisted Fire in the 700 block of 6th Street for a report of a carbon monoxide alarm going off. The area was checked and no problems were found.

JANUARY 27 (23 calls for service)

- Traffic stop in the area of N Gap Road and Merlot Drive. During contact, multiple items of drug paraphernalia and suspected narcotics were observed inside of the vehicle. Officer seized 2.2 grams of suspected methamphetamine along with the paraphernalia. Charges of Possession of Controlled Substance and Paraphernalia forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office for one adult male.
- Dispatch advised of a 911 hang up in the 300 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. Officers made contact with the homeowners who had just woken up, and were unaware of the call. All was determined to be fine.
- Found property reported in the 1800 block of Benson Ave. RP found a small girl's bike in their yard that they did not recognize. RP said it was ok to leave the bike where it was in case someone had come over to play and forgotten it.
- Request for a welfare check received at Prosser Food Depot. RP called saying there was a male who was having trouble walking at the location. Officers made contact with the male as he was getting into the passenger's side of a vehicle, the male did not wish to speak to officers. The driver of the vehicle said she would take the male to the hospital to get checked out.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of N Hinzerling Road and W King Tull Road. Officer assisted Deputy on arrest until other Deputies could arrive.
- Civil issue in the 1500 block of Sheridan Ave. RP advised he had his truck parked on another person's property and he was concerned that they were trying to steal it or take items from it. Officers spoke with the people at the property who said they had not taken anything from the vehicle, but were just cleaning up the property because they had been evicted. RP advised he would just be moving his vehicle.
- Civil complaint received in the area of Merlot Drive. RP advised he had been at Chevron earlier in the day when he was approached by a male. The male provided a sob story to the RP about having his family in his vehicle, being from California, losing his wallet, and needing money to get back to California. RP advised that the male offered to sell him jewelry in exchange for money. RP agreed and bought some jewelry for \$490, but later learned that the jewelry was fake and he had been scammed. RP was informed that since he willingly purchased the jewelry, it was a civil issue and not criminal.

JANUARY 28 (31 calls for service)

- Reckless traffic reported near exit 82. RP said that a dark colored Infinity was traveling at a high rate of speed over 100 mph and had taken exit 82. After that, they lost sight of it. Officers checked surrounding areas but could not locate the vehicle.
- 911 hang up reported in the area of Housel Middle School. Dispatch said they had a 911 hang up and could only hear someone saying get off me. The number was called back several times, but nobody would answer. Officers

and school staff checked the school and it was recess time so there were a lot of kids out and about. Nothing out of the ordinary was found and school staff said they would call us if they found out any more.

- Suspicious circumstances reported at Love's. RP was approached by two females and a male in a black Escalade with Colorado plates who said they were from Arabia and were trying to sell gold for \$800. RP said the gold was fake and that the subjects had left the area. Officers were not able to locate the vehicle.
- While on patrol in the area of Chardonnay Ave and Wine Country Road, Officer observed a physical assault occurring within a vehicle. Officers pulled the vehicle over and contacted a male and female. It was determined they had been in an argument and the female had assaulted the male. Female was taken into custody and booked into the Benton County Jail for Assault 4th DV.
- Suspicious circumstances in the 400 block of Wine Country Road. Employee at Katie's Country Floral said a man came in that smelled of alcohol and demanded that she give him flowers. Male left the area in a green van with a gold driver's door before officers arrived. Officers checked the area, but could not locate the vehicle.
- Phone scam reported in the 1200 block of Mustang Ct. RP called saying she received a phone call and they were trying to tell her that her Social Security card was no longer good. Officer advised RP to not answer those calls.
- Disturbance reported in the 1300 block of Sommers Ave and 6th Street and Meade Ave. Two large groups of kids were being verbal with each other, trying to start a fight. One of the juveniles made it to the police department to report what was going on. At no point had it been physical according to several adult witnesses.
- Lobby contacted regarding a fraud. RP stated his credit cards had been used at Burger King in Prosser as well as numerous other places from Toppenish to Boardman Oregon. Investigation is ongoing.
- Theft report received in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP stated her boyfriend's firearm had been stolen from her vehicle sometime during the night or in the morning. Firearm was entered into the statewide system as stolen.
- Officer located a vehicle parked on the sidewalk with its headlights on in the area of Sheridan Ave and 6th Street. The vehicle was determined to have been reported stolen out of Yakima. Yakima County was advised of the recovery and the vehicle was towed.

JANUARY 29 (15 calls for service)

- Request for welfare check received in the 1300 block of Meade Ave for a report of a driver slumped over in a vehicle. Officer arrived and the driver appeared to be just fine.
- CSO impounded a brown dog who was wandering around in the area of Alice Street and Canyon Drive. Dog was not chipped and did not have any tags.
- Welfare check requested in the 1000 block of Alexander Ct. RP had not heard from her mother in a few days. Officers made contact with the mother who was just fine. RP was advised of their findings.

JANUARY 30 (30 calls for service)

- Reckless traffic complaint received in the area of West County Route 12 and Wine Country Road. Report of a red Honda swerving into oncoming traffic. Area was checked, but vehicle was not located.
- Vehicle prowler report received in the 1500 block of Bennett Ave. RP stated sometime during the evening, someone entered his vehicle and stole Oakley sunglasses and a car charger.
- Disturbance reported in the area of 6th Street and Meade Ave. RP stated he was walking in the area when a male ran at him, calling him vulgar names. Officer contacted the male involved who did admit to the name-calling. Both advised there had been nothing physical and agreed to stay away from each other.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 1200 block of Playfield Ave. RP stated there was a juvenile male and female opening his mailbox. Officer contacted the juveniles who stated they were just waiting for their aunt to get ready in a nearby house. Their aunt came outside and confirmed they were waiting for her. No crime was determined to have occurred.
- Assault reported at Housel Middle School. One juvenile had punched another. Report forwarded to the Juvenile Prosecutor's Office for Assault charges.
- Lobby contact regarding found property. RP found a Permanent Resident Card and wanted to turn it in. Officer contacted INS who verified the ID was fake and advised to destroy it.
- Motor vehicle accident reported in the area of Merlot Drive and Wine Country Road. Two vehicles were involved with one sustained minor damage.
