## ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF February 10, 2022 to February 16, 2023

### February 10 (19 Calls for Service)

- Suspicious activity reported on the 1200 block of Hillcrest Drive, the RP advised she observed a vehicle that appeared to be stuck because the driver was revving the engine and burning the rubber on the tires. Officers located the vehicle which was parked and stuck in the canal bank. Officers contacted the driver who was intoxicated. Officer's contacted the driver's girlfriend to pick up the male. The vehicle was left at the location until the driver could arrange a tow for the vehicle.

### February 11 (24 Calls for Service)

- Disturbance reported at McDonald's, report received regarding juvenile males in their vehicle yelling racial slurs at the RP. The RP advised she wanted officers to be aware of this incident and to speak with the males about their behavior. Officers were unable to locate the males.
- Traffic stop conducted in the area of Wine Country Road and Merlot Drive, an officer observed a vehicle turn left on a red light. The officer made contact with the driver, the driver was cited for failing to stop at an intersection and also received a criminal citation for driving with a suspended or revoked license.

### February 12 (18 Calls for Service)

- Traffic stop conducted in the area of Gap Road and Merlot Drive, the officer ran a vehicle's license plate, and the registered owner of the vehicle came back having a revoked or suspended license. The officer made contact with the driver, after speaking with the driver, she received a criminal citation for driving with a suspended or revoked license and for operating a vehicle without an ignition interlock. The driver also had an active warrant, the driver was arrested and transported to Benton County Jail.
- Malicious mischief reported at Ameristar, staff advised a juvenile had arrived at the gas station and tore off the fuel selection buttons. The following day officers were dispatched to Ameristar, because the juvenile had returned to the location. Officers made contact with the juvenile, who admitted to the destruction of property. This case is being sent to the juvenile prosecutor's office.
- Suspicious activity reported North West Farm Supply, the RP advised a male was outside of the business acting suspicious. Officers made contact with the male, who advised he was checking on the business for the manager. Officers checked the building to ensure it was all secure.

### February 13 (22 Calls for Service)

- Order violation report received on the 300 block of Old Inland Empire, the RP advised she believes the no contact order she has against a male could have possibly been violated because the male viewed her Tik Tok profile. Officers are investigating this incident.
- Malicious mischief reported at Ameristar, staff advised a male went to the gas station and after he had paid for his gas and he ripped off the diesel button. Officers are investigating this incident.
- Theft reported on the 400 block of Petra Ave, officers received a report regarding theft at the location. Officers made contact with the apartment manager who advised a residence had

several belongings taken from her by another tenant. Officers reviewed the video footage provided, the suspect is seen opening a storage unit that belonged to the victim, the suspect walked out of storage area with several totes and boxes and articles of clothing, the male entered to his residence with the items. Officers made contact with the suspect who admitted to taking the items, the male advised he was willing to return the items to the victim. The male gathered the items and returned them to the victim. The male received a criminal citation for theft.

- Civil issue reported in the 100 block of Kelandren Drive, the RP advised he was upset because his ex-wife took away their son's phone due to having an app that she did not like on the phone. Officers advised there was no crime that had taken place because the female is allowed to reprimand their son and advised the RP that this was a civil issue.

## February 14 (26 Calls for Service)

- Welfare check in the area of 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Bennett Ave, officers made contact with a male who was sitting on the sidewalk, the male requested to go to the hospital. Medics arrived and transported the male.
- Disturbance on the 1000 block of Fir Street, report received of a verbal altercation. Officers made contact with a female who appeared upset. The female wouldn't cooperate with police regarding the physical altercation. No further contact was made.
- Theft reported at Loves, an employee advised a male went into the business and asked to exchange six 100 dollar bills for smaller bills, the employee was counting the money when the suspect advised he actually wanted fifty dollar bills not twenty solar bills, and scooped up the twenties and his 100 dollar bills and left the business. Officers are investigating this incident.

## February 15 (19 Calls for Service)

- Assistance requested on the 1000 block of Burgundy Place, the RP stated her son has been threatening to run away from the residence. Officers spoke with the juvenile, who was struggling with life. After speaking with the juvenile, he agreed he would stay in for the night and relax for the evening.

## February 16 (11 Calls for Service)

- Traffic stop conducted in the area of 7<sup>th</sup> St and Grant Ave, a vehicle was observed braking but the brake lights failed to activate. An officer made contact with the driver who was a juvenile with no valid driver's license. The vehicle had a strong odor of marijuana, the juvenile advised he and the passenger had been smoking hours prior. Officers contacted the families on the juveniles to pick them up from the location, the driver also received a citation for driving without a valid license. The juveniles were released to their families.
- Assistance requested on the 800 block of Main Street, the RP advised he went to pick up his son from ex-girlfriend when her boyfriend started harassing the RP. Both the ex-girlfriend and her boyfriend refused to release the child to the RP. Officers advised the RP since there was not a parenting plan in place, they could not force them to release the child. The RP was advised to speak with an attorney to set up a parenting plan through the court.
