## ACTIVITY LOG

### WEEK OF FEBRUARY 14, 2020 TO FEBRUARY 20, 2020

#### **FEBRUARY 14** (26 calls for service)

- Accident reported in the 300 block of Nunn Rd. Reporting Party (RP) called and advised that he had backed into his own car in his driveway and wanted to make a report. Officer advised him to call his insurance and tell them what happened as no report was going to be made for this incident.
- Report of a reckless driver in the area of Byron Road and Sheridan Ave. RP advised of a silver Dodge Durango that was driving all over the road and at high speeds. Officer checked the area, but could not locate the vehicle.
- Suspicious activity reported at the Rest Area. RP advised they had seen a male go into the female restroom. RP then requested to cancel as they determined the male was the father of a female using the bathroom.
- Assault reported at Prosser High School. Adult female was arrested and transported to Benton County Jail after hitting her ex-boyfriend when she saw another girl wearing clothes that belonged to her that had been in the possession of the ex-boyfriend.
- Officers assist BCSO with an injury accident at milepost 88 on I-82. Officer stayed on scene until other units arrived.
- Traffic hazard, report of an intoxicated male stumbling into the road near Old Inland Empire Hwy and Gap Road. Officers contacted a male in the area. He did not appear to be intoxicated, but admitted to texting while walking along the road. He was warned to stay out of the roadway.

#### **FEBRUARY 15** (28 calls for service)

- Request for a welfare check received in the area of Gap Road and Merlot Drive for a disabled semi in the roadway. Driver was contacted and officers assisted in calling for a tow.
- Reckless traffic complaint received on Old Inland Empire Hwy headed towards Prosser. Report of a vehicle driving on the wrong side of the road. Officers checked the area, but were unable to locate the vehicle.
- Officers assisted EMS and BCSO at a residence on W North River RD. Officer assisted with CPR until other units arrived.
- Civil landlord/tenant dispute in the 300 block of Christy Ct. RP advised that she had an agreement with her landlord that she would move out by the 15<sup>th</sup>, but was still in the process of getting her items out when her landlord arrived and started yelling at her. No threats or assault occurred. Landlord was told of the eviction process through the courts. Both parties were advised the dispute was civil and to stay away from each other to avoid further issues.
- Non-injury parking lot collision in the 400 block of North River Road. Information was exchanged between both parties involved.
- Narcotics complaint received in the 400 block of North River Rd. Report of several juveniles smoking marijuana in the area. Officers checked the area, but did not observe any signs of criminal activity.
- Suspicious circumstances reported at Cottage Market. RP observed a young child entering a semi that was occupied by an adult male. Officers determined that the child was the male's daughter and that there were no problems.
- Noise Complaint received in the area of Petra Ave and North River Road. Officers checked the area, but did not locate any excessive noise.
- Officers along with EMS responded to the area of Nunn Road and Wine Country Road to check on an intoxicated male and female who were attempting to walk back to Holiday Inn. The female had laid down at Rotary Park due to her level of intoxication and the male had called 911 for help. Upon officer and EMS arrival, the couple refused medical attention.

#### **FEBRUARY 16** (25 calls for service)

- Suspicious circumstance report received at Cottage Market. Employee called saying that a woman came into the store crying and was shaking. The woman said that her boyfriend had been taken and that she needed to get out to Case Rd. Officer assisted Deputies in gathering information and the female was later found and was okay.

Suspicious circumstances reported at Art Fiker Stadium. Local jogger who was running the steps noticed that the concession stand window was on the ground and the shed was unsecure. Officer checked the area and did not see any damage to the building or anything disturbed inside. Officer was able to secure the large heavy window back in its place and notified school officials of the situation.

- Power outage reported in the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Local shops in about a two-block radius had lost power. Owners were advised to lock up until power had returned. Officer contacted PUD who was aware of the problem.
- BCSO assist in the area of Old Inland Empire Hwy and Rattery Road. Deputy stopped a reckless vehicle and the driver was determined to be under the influence. Officer assisted as a cover unit until another Deputy arrived.
- BCSO assist in the area of Old Inland Empire Hwy and Hess Road. As PRPD Officer was returning to the City from the previous DUI assist, another Deputy was out with a suspected DUI where the vehicle had crashed through a fence. PRPD Officer assisted until other Deputies arrived.
- Assist in the 700 block of 6th Street. RP advised that a guest at the location was locked out of their room and had left food cooking on the stove. The lock was described as an electronic keypad that was not functioning and local locksmiths advised they did not have the capabilities to unlock it. RP advised she would attempt to figure it out and would call back if forced entry was required, she did not call back.
- Suspicious vehicle reported in the area of 6<sup>th</sup> Street and Prosser Ave. RP stated the vehicle was parked halfway in the road and halfway in a parking lot. Vehicle had left the area prior to officer arrival.
- Suspicious persons reported at Art Fiker Stadium. RP saw four teens running behind the concessions stand and heard trashcans being slammed around. The area was checked, but officers were unable to locate the teens and did not find any obvious signs of damage.

## **FEBRUARY 17** (21 calls for service)

- Assist in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP advised subjects called and threatened to honk their horn in front of her residence. RP was advised that the situation did not rise to the level of a crime and was informed on how to obtain a no contact order.
- Dispatch advised of a 911 hang up in the 1000 block of Burgundy Place. It was determined to be a child playing with the phone. Officer spoke with the child and informed them not to play with 911.
- Report of illegal dumping received in the 800 block of Park Ave. Trash was located by a dumpster and appeared to have fallen while the trash was being emptied.
- Found property report. Damaged phone with shattered screen was found on Bennett Ave. The phone is password protected therefore officers were unable to contact or locate the owner. The phone was placed into evidence as found property.
- Suspicious people reported in the 1000 block of Gum Street. RP saw two people walking down the road, which they described as abnormal for the area. Officers were not able to locate the individuals.

## **FEBRUARY 18** (15 calls for service)

- Report of a hit and run received in the 300 block of Canyon Dr. RP was not sure if it happened in Prosser or Sunnyside. Officer took photos of the damage.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the area of Riverside Drive and Wine Country Road. Report of two men arguing on the side of the road after a road rage incident. Involved parties were contacted and advised they had pulled over after an incident and verbally argued. No crime had occurred and both were sent on their way.

## **FEBRUARY 19** (19 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a motor vehicle accident with injuries on Byron Road west of EJ Miller Park. Driver advised she had swerved to miss an oncoming vehicle and went off the roadway into a ditch. Driver was transported to PMH for evaluation.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 1100 block of Yakima Ave. RP arrived at the location and found their family members vehicle door was ajar. Officers checked the vehicle and found that the door was malfunctioning causing it to stay open.
- Reckless traffic complaint received in the area of Gap Road and Wine Country Road. RP stated a silver Honda Accord was speeding in the area and nearly side swiped their vehicle. The driver of the Honda then smiled and flipped the RP off. Officers checked the area, but the suspect vehicle was not located.
- Suspicious male reported in the area of the Post Office. RP stated the male appeared to be messing with the drop box behind the Post Office. Male was gone upon officer arrival.
- Animal complaint at The Barn. Report of a loose Pit-Bull. Officer checked the area, but the dog had already left.

RP called Mcdonald's and they tried to tell him it was just syrup. RP requested a phone call from officers, but when they tried to call him back he did not answer his phone and did not have voicemail set up.

## **FEBRUARY 20** (25 calls for service)

- Found property turned into the Police Department. Employee from Hobbs dropped of a birth certificate and social security card that had been found with donated items. Officer attempted to contact the owner, but was not able to. Items were placed into evidence as found property.
- Traffic stop in the area of SR 22 and Highland Drive. Driver was found to have a suspended license and was cited and released for DWLS 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree.
- Hit and run reported at Prosser High School. Student reported finding her vehicle had been struck and the side mirror was damaged.
- Suspicious vehicle reported in the 900 block of Brown Street. RP advised of a vehicle parked in their driveway that did not belong to them. Officer contacted the registered owner who advised that his teenager was driving the vehicle and was most likely visiting a nearby residence. He advised he would contact his child and have the vehicle moved.
- EMS assist at the truck parking lot area near Taco Bell. EMS called for assistance with an aggressive dog while trying to get patient loaded into an ambulance. Before officers arrived, fire crews was able to put the dog back into the cab of the truck and the patient was transported to PMH for evaluation.
- Suspicious activity reported at AmeriStar. Employee advised of a male and female who came into the store and struck up personal conversation. The male then reportedly asked the employee if she wanted to earn \$500,000.00, but did not say how they could earn the money. The male then gave his phone number and left.
