WEEK OF FEBRUARY 21, 2020 TO FEBRUARY 27, 2020

FEBRUARY 21 (32 calls for service)

- Request for a welfare check received in the 900 block of Yakima Ave for a report of two minor children walking down the street without parents. Reporting Party (RP) advised the children appeared to be around 3 and 2 years of age. The children's father was located shortly after and advised the children had been playing in their backyard and had wandered away.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a verbal disturbance in the 16000 block of W CR 12.
- Narcotics complaint received in the 800 block of 6th Street, RP advised she found teenage boys hanging out in her garage smoking marijuana. RP requested contact if the boys were located on property again so they can be trespassed.
- Officers assisted WSP with a non-injury motor vehicle accident on SR 22 and Paterson Road.
- Residential burglary reported in the 1900 block of Wine Country Road. RP reported their garage had been broken into and two firearms had been stolen.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. RP was concerned that a vehicle was stolen and being stripped. Officer made contact with an individual and determined he was detailing his car and had removed the rear seats to clean it with a pressure washer.
- Traffic stop in the area of 7th Street and Sheridan Ave. Driver was cited and released for DWLS 3rd Degree.
- Traffic stop in the 700 Block of Wine Country Road. Driver was found to have active warrants and a suspended license and was taken into custody.

FEBRUARY 22 (14 calls for service)

- Residential burglary reported in the 1900 block of Highland Drive. RP reported the theft of construction items worth around \$2,000.
- Report of arson received in the 1400 block of Stacy Ave. RP advised someone had lit an American Flag on fire that was on the front of Jubilee Ministries. The fire also caused damage to deck and rain gutter.
- Traffic stop in the area of 7th Street and Sheridan Ave. Driver was cited and released for DWLS 3rd Degree.
- Report of a suspicious vehicle in the 1000 block of Kinney Way. Officer determined there were no problems, a family member had purchased a new car and the RP was not aware.
- Malicious mischief reported in the 2000 block of Benson Ave. Report of a vehicle that had been egged.
- Traffic stop in the area of 6th Street and Yakima Ave. Driver was found to have a suspended license and was cited and released for DWLS 3rd degree.

FEBRUARY 23 (13 calls for service)

- Officer observed a vehicle driving in the area of Merlot Drive and Gap Road without the lights on. Upon contact, the driver was suspected of being under the influence. Male was taken into custody and booked into the Benton County Jail for DUI.
- Report of a fallen tree received in the 1400 block of Kinney Way. City crews removed the tree.
- Report of a fallen tree received in the high school parking lot. The tree hit a power pole and was blocking the roadway. Benton PUD arrived to repair and restore power. City crews removed the tree from the roadway.
- Loud music complaint received in the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised of two individuals sitting in a vehicle playing music loudly. Officers checked the area, but found the vehicle unoccupied and did not hear any music playing.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a welfare check in the area of S County Line Rd and W Old Inland Empire Hwy.

FEBRUARY 24 (30 calls for service)

- Vehicle prowl reported in the 1900 block of Highland Drive. RP advised their stereo had been stolen from their vehicle sometime between 2/22 and 2/24.

Civil issue in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised a relative had recently passed away and management was not cooperating in allowing them to retrieve their property. The RP was advised to contact upper management or an attorney.

- Officers responded to a report of suspicious activity in the 300 block of 9th Street. RP advised previous occupants were on scene removing items from a house that had no trespassing signs posted. Officers made contact and found the new owner of the residence, who stated he was allowing the previous occupants to remove some of their items from the location.
- Report of truancy in the 800 block of 6th Street. RP advising of high school kids loitering behind the San Hose Market. The School Resource Officer arrived and located a female student hiding behind a refrigerator at the location. The student was transported back to school.
- Fraud reported in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised her debit card was used fraudulently online.
- Vehicle prowl reported in the 1900 block of Highland Drive. RP stated someone had removed their stereo sometime between 2/23 and 2/24.
- Information received in the 1800 block of Benson Ave. Landlord called and advised that tenants recently had mail stolen. He was advised to have the victims contact the PD to file a theft report.
- Suspicious activity reported in the area of 7th Street and Bennett Ave. Report of two subjects wearing masks who were looking into business windows and acting suspiciously. Officers contacted two males who stated they were just bored and had been walking around. They were advised to stay out of trouble.
- Reported theft at Club 24. RP stated their gym bag had been stolen which contained their car keys, wallet and cash. It was later determined through surveillance footage, that the RP had left their gym bag in a different locker than they had thought and the bag had not actually been stolen.

FEBRUARY 25 (24 calls for service)

- Request for welfare check received in the area of North River Road and Wine Country Road for a report of an elderly male stumbling across the Wine Country Bridge. Officers checked the area, but were not able to locate the male.
- Officers responded to a possible weapons complaint at the Boys and Girls Club in Prosser. Upon arrival, officers were contacted by a 13-year-old female who advised she saw a handgun in a waistband of a male student during math class at Housel Middle School towards the end of the day. Officers talked to several other witnesses who substantiated what the witness had told officers. Officers made contact with the 12-year old male suspect, and subsequently took him into custody without incident. The firearm was recovered, and the juvenile admitted to having the gun at school. Upon further investigation, there was no information suggesting the juvenile had a plan to use the firearm at school. The juvenile said he brought the gun to school for protection. The juvenile was subsequently transported to the Benton County Juvenile Justice Center for possession of a stolen firearm, and possession of a deadly weapon on school grounds.

FEBRUARY 26 (29 calls for service)

- Report of a suspicious truck in the area of the middle school. Older Dodge truck was located at Highland Drive and Meade Ave. Officer made contact with the female driver who did not appear to be familiar with how to operate the truck and was not happy that she was being contacted.
- Animal call, report of a found dog at the middle school. Community Service Officer responded and took custody of the dog. After seeing the PD's post on Facebook, the owner contacted the CSO and the dog was released to him. Owner was instructed on how to properly register and license the dog.
- Officer assisted BCSO with an eviction in the 400 block of N River Road.
- Traffic stop in the 400 block of Petra Ave. Driver was arrested for an active warrant and DWLS 3rd Degree. Female passenger provided her information and was allowed to leave the area. Upon checking the validity of the information that was provided, it was determined that the female had provided a false name. Her identity was determined and it was found that she had several active felony warrants. Officers searched a nearby apartment building and located the female hiding in the laundry room. She was taken into custody and booked for her warrants.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 1100 block of Yakima Ave. RP thought someone may have attempted to gain access to their residence through a basement window as the screen was bent.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 1500 block of Bennett Ave. RP stated they could hear voices outside. Officers arrived in the area and located a male who advised he was just looking for his phone.
- Loitering complaint received at Cottage Market. Employee wanted a male moved along who had been at the location for 15 minutes and was not purchasing anything. Male was gone upon officer arrival.
