ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF MARCH 13, 2020 TO MARCH 19, 2020

MARCH 13 (19 calls for service)

- Animal complaint received in the 3200 block of Wine Country Road. Report of an ongoing issue of cows in the roadway. Information was passed on to the Community Service Officer.
- Parking complaint in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. High school staff made contact with the student driver and had them move the vehicle.
- Officers assisted medics with an unresponsive male in the 300 block of Casi Ct. Male was transported to the hospital.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 2100 block of Eastgate Ct. Reporting Party (RP) reported a male had come to their door on 3/12 and requested to enter to demonstrate an air filter. It was later found the RP's juvenile daughter had seen the same subject numerous times on 03/10 and it was thought he was intentionally following the daughter on that date.
- Report of a hit and run received in the area of 6th Street and Wine Country Road. RP was contacted and stated another vehicle had struck them from behind and then drove around them. No visible damage was found on the RP's vehicle. Officer later located and contacted the suspect who admitted to hitting the RP's vehicle. Male was cited for Negligent Driving 2nd Degree and Operating a Vehicle w/o Insurance.
- Loud music complaint received in the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. Officers made contact with the residence and asked them to turn down their music. Music was turned down and no further problems were reported.
- Theft reported in the 600 block of 7th Street. RP said he arrived at the skating rink and put his skateboard behind the counter. He noticed it was missing an hour later when he went to leave. Skateboard was described as a Land Yacht, black in color with a picture of a Fox on it.
- Traffic hazard reported at exit 80 east bound. An unknown driver had hit the stop sign causing debris to be strewn all over the roadway. Officers conducted traffic control until State Patrol arrived.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP said that her granddaughter was knocking on the door and she told her to go away. The next thing she knew her granddaughter had busted through the door. Officers located the female in the area and trespassed her from the location per the RP's request.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 100 block of N Wamba Road. Two employees of Amber Hills reported they were outside and had heard a man yell twice for help. They couldn't tell if it was close or far away. Officers checked the area but could not find anyone in distress.
- Suspicious person reported in the 400 block of North River Road. RP called and said a man was leaning up against a pole and looked to be on drugs. Officers found the male leaning up against a telephone pole trying to keep out of the wind. He advised he was just waiting on a ride.

MARCH 14 (10 calls for service)

- Traffic stop in the area of Gap Road and Wine Country Road. The vehicle initially failed to stop. The female driver then stopped and attempted to exit the vehicle. Upon commands to return to her vehicle she complied, but then attempted to drive away. She then stopped for some time, only to attempt to drive away again. The female yelled at bystanders to record the interaction (some obliged) and was generally uncooperative. The female was cited and released for Fail to Obey and Obstructing.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 900 block of Florence Street. RP called saying there was a man in the street coughing and hacking and she would like him checked on. Officers and medics arrived on scene but did not locate anyone. Officer contacted a group of people in the area and asked if they had seen anyone in the street coughing and hacking to which they said they had not.
- Report of a vehicle prowl at Sun Terrace Assisted Living. RP had left her purse on the front seat of her vehicle. The passenger window was broken and the purse was stolen.

MARCH 15 (9 calls for service)

- Officers assisted BCSO with a disturbance in the area of Hess Road and Old Inland Empire Hwy. Male was taken into custody for Malicious Mischief.
- Report of a vehicle prowler in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP stated only their vehicle registration had been taken.

MARCH 16 (10 calls for service)

RP stated he ran outside to find the suspect and had seen who they thought was a mailman putting mail in mailboxes. Officer followed up with the Post Office and determined the mail carrier was a woman on the day in question.

YCSO arrived and eventually arrested her for DUI and Hit and Run. Officers assisted in watching the children while waiting for someone to arrive to take custody of them.
- Officers assisted Sunnyside PD who were in pursuit of a vehicle that had fled the area of an alarm call with a driver wearing a ski mask. The vehicle eventually drove back into Yakima County.

MARCH 19 (20 calls for service)

- Residential burglary reported in the 1900 block of Miller Ave. RP stated that their shed was entered forcibly during the night. Tools and a green wagon were reported stolen.
- Residential burglary reported in the 1900 block of Miller Ave. RP reported that their shed had been entered during the evening. RP stated items had been moved around and placed in a wagon, but nothing appeared to have taken.
- Officers responded to a shoplifting report at Food Depot. It was reported that a male and female had stolen alcoholic beverages and left in a VW Passat. Officers were not able to locate the suspect vehicle.
