WEEK OF April 7, 2022 to April 13, 2023

April 7 (21 Calls for Service)

- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 300 block of N Wamba Rd. Reporting Party (RP) stated they had heard a female voice yell, "help me". The area was checked, but officers could not locate or hear anyone in distress.
- Information from Yakima County Sheriff's Office of a drive by shooting within their jurisdiction with a suspect vehicle last seen heading towards Mabton.
- Fraud information received in the 900 block of Florence St, RP claimed a ministry in Anaheim CA has a training center that is using kids to contact people.
- Identity theft reported in the 1400 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised their Robin Hood account had been hacked and approximately \$3,000 in crypto currency was stolen. They also stated other accounts had been hacked with thousands of dollars stolen as well.

April 8 (19 Calls for Service)

- Officers assisted with keeping the eggs secure and crowd control at the Easter egg hunt in the City Park.
- Vehicle theft report in the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Determined to be a civil issue.
- Officers assisted Benton County Sheriff's with a residential alarm in the area of W North River Road.
