ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF JUNE 05, 2020 TO JUNE 11, 2020

JUNE 05 (25 calls for service)

- Officer assisted with a civil issue reported in the 800 block of Ford Street. Information was passed on to the Port of Pasco for a possible theft of luggage.
- Theft report received in the 800 block of Alexander Ct, Reporting Party (RP) advised that her purse had been stolen from her residence.
- Scam reported in the 800 block of Market Street. RP stated he had been communicating with an unknown person online and mentioned he was short on money, the person he was communicating with said they would, "help him out". RP then received two deposits into his bank account that appeared to be unemployment payments. RP stated the unknown person who deposited the money, then requested he send it to a third party via money order. RP advised he had already contacted his bank to begin the process of returning the money.
- Report of tires slashed in the 800 block of Alexander Ct, RP reported that she believed her tires had been slashed by her ex-boyfriend in retaliation for her egging his driveway.
- Report of an ongoing issue with phone scams in the 300 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP was advised to not provide personal information and suggested they may want to change their phone number.
- Department received a few phone calls from citizens concerned about rumors of a protest in Prosser.
- Officers received a report of a front door ajar in the 900 block of Margaret Street. Officers arrived, the homeowner was contacted and gave permission to search the residence. Nothing appeared out of place and it did not appear the door was forced open. Officers secured the door, no other issues were found.
- Traffic complaint received in the 1100 block of Meade Ave. RP was upset that they had to drive around a vehicle that was waiting in line at the Banner Bank drive up window. Officer responding to the area found the traffic was backed up due to normal Friday bank activity.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 900 block of Campbell Drive, Officers contacted the RP who was upset in regards to a person coming to his house that wasn't supposed to be there. RP was given suggestions on how to not violate their court order.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a DV verbal disturbance in the area of the Rainbow Court Cabins.
- Officer handled questions regarding civil unrest and protests in the area.
- Verbal disturbance report handled by phone that occurred on 05-26-20 at the laundromat. RP was advised the situation was a civil matter.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a gunshot victim at PMH. Male victim advised he had accidentally shot himself in the leg with a 22 caliber rifle.

JUNE 06 (23 calls for service)

- Traffic complaint received in the area of Court Street and Park Ave. RP reported vehicles speeding in the area and requested extra patrol.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 800 block of Ellen Ave. Male was contacted after insinuating on Snapchat that he might take his life. Male was contacted and found to be intoxicated, but said he did not want to take his own life. Male did not want to talk to Crisis, but took the phone number to call if he needed to talk to someone later. RP who contacted PD arrived on scene and stayed with the male after officers left.
- Officers responded to a DV assault in the 900 block of Campbell Drive. Officers determined a physical dispute had taken place between two family members. Adult male was taken into custody and booked into the Benton County Jail for DV Assault and Violation of a No Contact Order.
- Report of possible theft in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP advised of subjects possibly rummaging through their property and requested extra patrols in the area.
- Officers received an anonymous report of juveniles reportedly wanting to riot and loot in the early morning hours. No incidents of rioting or looting occurred.

JUNE 07 (29 calls for service)

- While on patrol in the area of Riverside Drive and Wine Country Road, officer observed a vehicle accelerating rapidly and following close behind other vehicles. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was suspected of being under the influence. Adult male was arrested and booked for Driving Under the Influence.
- Officers responded to a disturbance report at McDonald's. It was determined to be a civil issue regarding child custody and exchange issues.
- Suspicious person reported in the 1800 block of Benson Ave, report of a male looking in trashcans. Male was not located.
- Graffiti reported at Crawford Park. Benton PUD was advised of the graffiti to their substation for cleanup.
- Welfare check request received in the 200 block of Chardonnay Ave. OnStar reported a button being activated in a vehicle and hearing what sounded like children crying. Officer made contact with the driver of the vehicle as she came out of the store. She said there were no issues and that she had left her children in the vehicle while she went inside due to COVID-19. Officer spoke with the children who advised of no issues and did not realize they had pressed the OnStar button. The driver was advised on not leaving children unattended in a vehicle.
- Suspicious noise reported in the area of Sadie Street and Bennett Ave. It was determined that a transformer had blown and the homeowner was already on the phone with PUD.
- Traffic complaint in the area of 6th Street and Meade Ave. RP advised of a female driver texting while driving that had almost hit him.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a suspicious circumstance call in the area of Wilgus Road and Johnson Road. RP reported spotlights being pointed at their residence. It was determined to be individuals moving irrigation lines in a field with flashlights after dark.

JUNE 08 (16 calls for service)

- Animal call in the 1200 block of Grant Ave. Report of a Pitbull attacking a cat. Responding officer located and removed the deceased cat from the roadway, the Pitbull ran off and was not able to be detained.
- Suspicious person reported in the 600 block of Wine Country Road. Report of a male at the Holiday Inn who was acting strange and falling asleep at the counter. Officer made contact with the male who was not making any sense. The male was advised that he was being asked to leave the property.
- Suspicious person reported in the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP advised of a male at the Shell station who was falling asleep at the counter while trying to pay for his items. It was determined to be the same male previously contacted. Male was found to be parked at the Rest Area and was issued a no trespass order per the business' request.
- Traffic stop in the 700 block of Wine Country Road. Male was taken into custody for an active warrant, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and DWLS 2nd Degree.

JUNE 09 (15 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a report of a suicidal person staying at the Holiday Inn. RP called reference her daughter attempting suicide by pills. Hotel staff were unable to gain access to the room, so BCFD used an axe to breach the door. The female was transported to PMH for evaluation.
- Animal complaint received in the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP flagged down an officer and advised of their neighbors allowing their dogs to wander at large in the area, which distresses her animals. The dogs were photographed and information was forwarded to the Community Service Officer for follow-up.
- Officers responded to the 1500 block of Grant Ave for a report of a physical fight in progress. Officers made contact with a large group of people who advised there had just been a verbal only argument between a husband and wife. Officers did not observe any signs of injury and all parties denied it was physical. Male half advised he would be going to bed.
- Officer assisted a citizen with questions regarding the registration of a newly purchased boat. RP was concerned with numbers on the boat not matching the registration they were provided. RP was referred to a BCSO Deputy who deals with boat inspections for further assistance.

JUNE 10 (15 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a trespass complaint in the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Male who had been trespassed from the location recently was in the store again violating the order. Male had left the area prior to officer arrival and was not located.
- Theft of a vehicle reported in the 400 block of North River Road. RP advised he had arrived home from work and parked his vehicle in front of his residence. When he woke up and came outside to get something, he realized his vehicle was gone. Vehicle was entered into the statewide system as stolen.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 400 block of North River Road. RP advised of a vehicle parked in their space with expired tabs and extensive damage. Officers determined that the vehicle had recently been reported stolen out of Grandview and appeared to be connected to the theft of a vehicle reported earlier in the day in the same general location in Prosser.

JUNE 11 (17 calls for service)

- Loitering complaint received at the Holiday Inn. Report of a male who has been frequenting the area and acting in a strange manner. Officers made contact with the male and gave him information on area shelters and advised him that he has been asked to leave the location.
- Theft complaint received in the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised that a former employee had stolen over \$700.00 from a safe at the location.
- Complaint received regarding a transient sitting by the Depot for approximately 30 hours. Officers contacted the male and provided him with a bottle of water. The male advised he was waiting to catch the bus to Pasco.
- Complaints received regarding people on the bridge protesting, but not staying 6 feet apart from each other.
- Multiple calls received related to protesters walking into traffic, throwing water at cars, and using profanity. Officers checked the area, but did not witness anything criminal.
- WSP assist with a vehicle pursuit that terminated near Halls Chevrolet. Officers assisted by checking the area for the suspect vehicle, but were unable to locate it.
