WEEK OF June 09, 2023 to June 15, 2023

June 09 (20 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to an animal complaint in the 400 block of Petra Avenue. RP's dog was attacked by a loose dog. Will be following up with CSO.
- Officer responded to a complaint of harassing phone calls. RPs ex is emailing, texting, and calling RP at work. RP was advised that an NCO may be her best course of action.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check in the 400 area of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a male appeared to be passed out in his car. Officers found male to be awake and alert.
- Officers performed extra patrols in the High School area due to activities taking place.
- BCSO assist for a Domestic violence complaint at the 500 block of Dozer Court. Officers did not locate subject upon arrival.
- BCSO assist on W. Kingtull for suspicious activity. Officer did not find anyone on the property. No vehicles were present at the site either.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Petra Avenue. EMS contacted.
- Officers responded to suspicious circumstance on Sheridan and Byron Road with 5 individuals in a vehicle, one of which was carrying a chainsaw. No crime was witnessed.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 1200 block of Meade Avenue. A male subject riding a black bicycle wearing a camo hat with a black backpack stole 2 bottles of wine. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers performed extra patrols on the 600 block of Ellen.
- Officers responded to a disturbance at City Hall. The subject stated that he wanted to talk to the Chief.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 600 block of 8th Street. RP stated that her purse was stolen while doing laundry. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at OIE and Wamba Road. RP stated that 3 cows were loose and roaming on the road. RP stated that they had to swerve to miss them. Officer assisted property owner in securing the fence to mitigate the escape of more cows.
- Officers responded to a complaint of small fires being burned under the Grant Street Bridge. Officers contacted individuals and advised them to put the fires out. Individuals complied.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a male victim who was brought to PMH with a gunshot wound. Investigation is ongoing and is being handled by BCSO.

June 10 (25 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to the 300 block of Wine Country Road for a noise complaint. Officer contacted individuals at the party taking place that it was past curfew and they agreed to turn the music down.
- Officers performed extra patrols for graduation.
- Officers responded to a Domestic Violence report in the 1900 block of Highland Drive. RP stated that her son assaulted her. Subject was taken into custody.
- Officers responded to a vehicle theft in the 800 block of Bennett Avenue. A semi with trailer was stolen. Semi was recovered from Wapato, WA and was returned to RP.

- Officer responded to a violation of court order at PHS. RP stated that male individual is violating court order by being at the school. Male left as soon as he was seen by RP. RP will send officer pictures for ongoing investigation.
- Officer responded to a complaint at the High School graduation. RP stated that a female who does not like her sat behind her at the ceremony, causing her to leave and not enjoy the ceremony. Later, the same individual called her as well. Officer recommended a petition for an anti-harassment order.
- Officer responded to a report of a collision at the rest area. No injuries. Drivers exchanged information.
- Officers performed extra patrols at the wine park due to an event.
- Officer found a vehicle running on Cabernet and Port. The vehicle was running and unattended, blocking the lane of travel. Vehicle was moved to the parking lot, and secured. Officer took keys and left business card for where to retrieve them.
- Officers responded to a complaint of people parking in a no parking area in the 500 block of Cascade Court. RP stated that it is not safe to park there. Officer will forward to code enforcement.
- Officer responded to a call at Prosser City Park. This was a medical incident. EMS was contacted.

June 11 (07 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a home alarm. Alarm was accidental. No crime.
- Officer responded to a suspicious activity report. An older blue sedan with 2 males in it were parked looking at the school. They then drove into the classroom area next to the gym. Officer was unable to locate the car.
- Officers responded to a report of gang graffiti on a fence in the 900 block of Kinney Way.
- Officers responded to a report of drug paraphernalia at the 300 block of 7th Street.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.

June 12 (20 Calls for Service)

- Officer provided a courtesy transport for an individual.
- Officer responded to a traffic hazard on I82. RP reported that an apple box was blocking traffic. Officer removed box from roadway.
- Officer responded to a complaint about a lot near Meade Avenue and 5th Street. The RP stated that the lot is overgrown with weeds. Officer forwarded to Code enforcement officer.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint on the 1000 block of Fir Street. RP stated that an animal is running around. Officer made contact with home owner and informed her of the complaint. Homeowner stated she will keep her dog in her yard.
- Officer responded to an accidental 911 call.
- Officers responded to a disturbance at the McDonalds. RP stated that a male was making a disturbance at McDonalds and was refusing to leave. Officers were unable to locate him at McDonalds, but located him at the rest area. Officers told him not to return to McDonalds. He agreed that he would not.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at Prosser Mini Mart. Business declined to press charges, but doesn't want the male to return. RP was advised to call back if he returns.
- BCSO assist near King Tull Road for a weapons complaint. RP stated that he observed a black Mazda with 2 occupants pull up to a man near an orchard. The vehicle fired a weapon twice. The RP stated that the male in the orchard yelled at the subjects in the Mazda, who then left. Officers were unable to locate individuals.
- Officer assist for a welfare check on W. Apricot Road. RP stated that they were concerned about a female that they were observing that looked distressed. Officers found it to be a parental issue.
- Officers responded to a vehicle repossession.

- Officers performed multiple traffic stops
- Officers performed extra patrols in the areas where graffiti had been found.
- Officer responded to a suspicious circumstance at the Prosser Courthouse. RP stated that a male on a bike keeps stopping and smoking something from a can. No crime was observed.
- Officers performed extra patrols at Prosser Library.
- BCSO and WSP assist for a report of a disturbance involving a female running from a male. Both parties were contacted and it was discovered that a verbal argument had started in Prosser. No crime was observed and WSP gave the female a courtesy ride to Benton City.
- BCSO assist near Yakitat Road with large fire. Officer assisted with traffic control until more BCSO was on site.
- Officers performed extra patrols on Wine Country Rd and Merlot due to complaints of speeding cars. No reckless speeding was noticed by officer.

He stated that he would tell them to be more careful.
- Officer responded to a complaint of a suspicious circumstance at the 200 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that an older male was acting suspicious around her son while he was in the pool. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to a request for presence at a vehicle repossession.
