ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF JUNE 12, 2020 TO JUNE 18, 2020

JUNE 12 (16 calls for service)

- While patrolling in the area of Love's, officer observed a vehicle with expired registration. Officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver failed to yield. Officer pursued the vehicle briefly, but due to the vehicle traveling at high rates of speed and going through stop signs the pursuit was terminated for safety concerns.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 600 block of 6th Street. Report of a male pushing a bike and talking to himself. Officers made contact with the male and determined he was pushing the bike due to having leg pains.
- Assist in the 400 block of Petra Ave. Reporting Party (RP) had questions regarding vehicle maintenance. RP was advised to call a mechanic.
- Disturbance reported in the area of N Gap Road and Merlot Drive. RP thought they heard a disturbance in the business next door. It was determined to be an employee in the business who was tossing some items around.
- Traffic stop in the area of Main Street and Yakima Ave. Driver was found to have a suspended license and was cited and released.
- Officers assisted a disabled motorist near the rest area. Officers ensured the motorist made it safely out of the roadway.

JUNE 13 (15 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a disturbance reported in the 1200 block of Stacy Ave. Contact was made with a male and female at the location. The female stated the male had kicked a pillar toward her, causing it to strike her leg. Officers did not observe any injuries and found the pillar to be intact and standing upright. The female stated she just wanted the male to leave the location. Male advised he would be leaving with a friend.
- Disturbance reported in the 800 block of Ellen Ave. Officers made contact with a male and female at the location, both advised they were just horse playing. No problems were found.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 900 block of Alexander Ct, female arrested for DV. It was determined that a female had rammed her vehicle into another vehicle that her boyfriend was driving after an argument. The vehicle sustained damage, but no injuries were reported. Adult female was taken into custody for Assault DV.
- Noise complaint received in the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. Report of loud music coming from a travel trailer in the area. Officers checked the area, but were unable to hear any loud music.

JUNE 14 (18 calls for service)

- Motorist assist on the Grant Street Bridge. Vehicle had become high centered. Officer assisted with getting the vehicle unstuck.
- Vehicle stopped in the area of Chardonnay Ave and Wine Country Road for erratic lane travel and one headlight. Driver was suspected of being under the influence and was booked into the Benton County Jail for DUI.
- Traffic hazard, report of two calves in the roadway near Old Inland Empire Hwy and Wamba Road. Cows were put back within their fence.
- Disturbance reported in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. Officers made contact with the resident of the reported disturbance who stated it had been a verbal only argument and the parties involved had already left.
- Animal complaint received in the 2000 block of Miller Ave. RP advising of two medium size dogs running in the alleyway. Dogs were located and the owner was notified and able to get their dogs back into their yard.
- Noise complaint in the area of 5th Street and Sheridan Ave. RP advising of a semi-truck running its engine every 30 minutes. Complaint was determined to be unfounded.
- Fraud report received at Keene Riverview Elementary School. RP received a scam email disguised as coming from the Principal, directing her to purchase EBay gift cards and email the pin for each card back. RP did not complete the fraud to the scammer.
- Noise complaint in the area of 5th Street and Sheridan Ave, RP advising again of a semi truck running loudly and for over 3.5 hours. Officer drove by the area, but could only faintly hear the vehicle running. Information forwarded to the Community Service Officer for follow up.

Trespass at the new high school construction site. Report of two juveniles skateboarding on the roof. Officers made contact with one juvenile, who stated he was alone. The juvenile was transported home and parents were contacted.

JUNE 15 (23 calls for service)

- Theft report, RP advised her debit card had been stolen from an unknown location and had been used at the ATM at the Love's in Prosser. Awaiting surveillance video from Love's to identify a suspect.
- Malicious mischief reported at the new high school construction zone. RP showed officer graffiti found on a wall on the second floor of the building. Photographs were taken of the damage.
- Report of a large amount of frozen corn dumped in the parking lot of the high school. It was determined Milne Fruit was transporting frozen corn to another plant on 221 and were working on cleaning up the pile.
- Found wallet turned into the PD, owner was contacted and wallet was returned.
- Citizen assist by phone. RP was concerned because her neighbor was acting strange towards her and making her uncomfortable. RP was advised to contact the court to obtain a no contact order.
- Officers responded to a report of multiple males fighting at the skate park. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with two males. Both were bleeding from the face, but refused medics and stated they did not wish to pursue any charges.
- Citizen assist at the PD. RP was upset because the Sheriff's did not respond to a suspicious vehicle that had been called in on Lincoln Grade. RP stated he wanted Prosser officers to respond to the call next time. RP was advised about the PRPD policy regarding calls outside of city limits. RP said he would be in to speak with the Chief about the policy in the morning.

JUNE 16 (25 calls for service)

- Suspicious circumstance reported in the 1500 block of Grant Ave. RP found their screen door had been bent and thought someone may have been trying to break in during the night.
- Order violation report received in the 1000 block of Alexander Court. RP reported that her ex-husband with whom she has a protection order against had left several items outside of her house.
- Report of a suspicious vehicle in the area of 7th Street and Prosser Ave. RP advised of an SUV parked in the area with visible marijuana smoking devices sitting on the dash. Officer made contact with the owner of the vehicle and explained the open container laws to him.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a warrant arrest in the area of SW Kelandren Drive and SW Montecito Drive. Male was taken into custody on multiple felony warrants.
- Officers responded to a disturbance and weapons complaint at the City Park. Report was received of two groups fighting and a gun being displayed. The suspects had reportedly left the location in a gold SUV. Officers were able to locate the SUV a few blocks away. Multiple males were contacted and stated that the other group had pulled the gun on them, but they declined to be victims or identify any of the other individuals involved. Witness statements contradicted what the males were reporting and officers were unable to locate the second group. Males were advised they were being trespassed from all City owned properties for one year.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 900 block of Alexander Court. Report of a 10 year old threatening another juvenile with a knife and BB gun. It was determined the juveniles were play fighting and it had gotten a little too rough. Two juveniles admitted to bringing a knife, BB gun and a bat to defend themselves against the other juveniles. No assault had occurred. Parents advised of ongoing issues between the juveniles, which had initially started at school. Information was provided on how to obtain no contact orders.
- Warrant arrest in the area of CR 12 and Albro Road. Male taken into custody for felony warrants out of Franklin County.

JUNE 17 (9 calls for service)

- Theft reported in the 2400 block of Frontier Road. RP advising several hoses, a water timer, and sprinklers were stolen from the location. RP requested extra patrols in the area.
- Officer assisted a citizen with a VIN check on an abandoned vehicle in the 1000 block of Hemlock St.
- Report of an elderly female in a disabled vehicle stalled in traffic near Love's. Citizens were able to assist in moving the vehicle out of the roadway.

JUNE 18 (15 calls for service)

- Welfare check in the 400 block of N River Road. Dispatch advising of a 911 call that sounded like a child. Officers made contact at the residence and determined a child had been playing with the phone and accidentally dialed 911.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 1100 block of Playfield Ave. RP called, stating that a known male was messing with her scooter at her house. Male left when RP said she would let her dogs out.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. RP thought she saw her ex-husband with whom she has a protection order against in a truck behind her residence. Vehicle was gone prior to officer arrival.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of Gap Road Johnson Road. Report of a vehicle partially blocking the roadway. The male driver appeared to be passed out with beer cans all over the vehicle. Medics were dispatched to evaluate the male.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 300 block of Nunn Road. Report of two young toddlers walking in the roadway without a parent in sight and an open door to the residence. Officers checked the residence and were not able to locate a responsible adult. After a search, the mother was eventually located on foot near 7th Street and Wine Country Road and transported back to the residence. The children were determined to be safe, but due to a language barrier, officers were only able to obtain very limited information. Case information forwarded to CPS.
- Verbal disturbance in the 900 block of Market Street. RP stated a male and female were trying to cut through the RP's yard to get to the canal bank and were verbal with the RP when they were told they couldn't do that.
- Officers assisted WSP in the area of SR-22 Wine Country Road with a rear end collision w/minor injury.
