ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF June 23, 2023 to June 29, 2023

June 23 (22 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a burglary report at Speck Motors. The door was damaged and a vehicle was missing. Prior to the discovery of the burglary, the suspect fled in the vehicle at high speeds, eluding an officer. He then returned the vehicle to Speck Motors. He later turned himself in at Speck Motors. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to a noise violation complaint of shooting at the range. RP stated that there had been shootings since 5:20. Area was checked.
- Officers responded to the 100 block of Merlot Drive where a hay truck had lost six bales of hay in the road. Officers assisted with traffic control. The owner quickly removed the bales from the road.
- Officers assisted with a fire at the 1400 block of Stacy Ave. A small natural cover fire took place on the BNSF easement. Workers were on hand and the fire was handled quickly. No crime.
- Officers responded to a possible disturbance at the 1300 block of Sheridan Avenue. RP stated that his girlfriend's son was on narcotics and being verbal. Officers spoke to son and did not find any problems at the resident.
- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of 6th Street. RP stated that an older green vehicle keeps driving by at a very slow rate of speed while staring into the building. Officer contacted individual at the coffee shop. No crime was committed. Officer advised of FOIA request and an anti-harassment order.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 300 block of Nunn Road. RP stated that the neighbor's dog was growling at their children. Officer talked to the individuals at that reporting address who said none of them had called. Children did state that there is a scary dog, but the officers were unable to locate the dog.
- Officers performed follow up activities on the Mini Mart shoplift report from 06/22.
- Officer assist with EMS at 7th Street/Wine Country Road.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the Prosser City Park. RP stated that there were individuals at the park who were not acting right and that had an unleashed pit bull mix dog. Officers spoke with individuals. No crime observed.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 200 block of Gap Road. RP stated that someone had left a dog at this location. Dog was friendly and well-behaved.

June 24 (17 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a noise complaint at Highland Drive and Alexander Court. RPs stated that dogs were barking non-stop for over an hour. Officers checked the area, and located a barker. Owners took dog inside and the barking stopped.
- Officers responded to the sight of smoke at W. Johnson Road. Officers found it to be a controlled burn.
- Officers responded to a vehicle blocking a prescheduled event. Responsible owner was contacted and asked to move vehicle.
- Officers responded to an accidental private home alarm.
- Officers responded to a report of Property Lost near Prosser High School. RP stated that wife lost her purse near the high school. Property has not been found.

- Officer assist at the 215 PR with loose farm animals. Officers did not find any animals in the road upon arrival.
- Officers followed up on theft at laundromat.
- Officer assist at W. Johnson Road for a weapons complaint. RP stated that they are having a party and the neighbor is shooting his gun off into the area. Officer completed a check and did not see or hear any shooting happening.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a disturbance at the 400 block of North River Road. RP stated that there were 2 male and 1 female juveniles running around the area yelling vulgar things and approaching people aggressively. Officers checked the area and were unable to locate the subjects.
- Officers responded to a noise complaint at 1366 PR. RP stated that loud music was coming from next door. Officers were able to hear the music when near the residence but it was not found to be excessive.

June 25 (20 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a welfare check the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a man on the property who was bent over with his arms hanging loosely. He was requested to move along by the RP but he did not. Officers advised him to leave. He complied.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 100 block of Sherman Avenue. RP stated that a male was sitting on the RPs front porch for over 5 minutes. He then was sitting on his bike, which appeared to be a kid's size bicycle, while looking around at neighbor's yards. Officers spoke with the bike rider. No crimes are taking place and no problems came up.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident that had happened at the 500 block of Cabernet Ct. RP stated that his vehicle had been backed into the previous night during a concert at the location. The RP stated that a witness had taken photos, but the information in the photos was hard to read. RP is no longer in town and the vehicle that hit his is unknown. Officer advised RP how to self-report through the WSP website.
- Officers responded to a complaint at the Grace Harvest Church. A disruptive male was seen around the area. He left when asked to.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a male in a Mercedes van near SR221/Sales Yard Road. Male was getting out and walking around near the wrecking yard. Vehicle was leaving when officer arrived.
- Officers assist Sunnyside PD with attempt to locate an individual concerning vehicular assault and eluding. Officers did not locate the individual.
- Officers responded to the Castle Park. RP stated that her bicycle was locked in the bathroom and she needed to get it out. Officer advised RP to contact city maintenance in the morning.
- Officers responded to a report of possible domestic violence at the 300 block of Basalt Loop. RP stated that dad is threatening mom. No crime was witnessed. Male left to stay at a cousin's home.

June 26 (24 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a complaint about a utilities company spray painting on his property (lines for service). Officer did not locate spray painting male. RP was advised that this is a civil matter, but if he returns he can call to have the man trespassed from his property.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the Horse Heaven Travel Plaza. RP stated that for the second day in a row, the same male has come in and stolen items. The RP does not know the individual but has him on camera. RP would like the suspect charged with theft and trespassed when identified. Investigation ongoing.

- Officer assist with an impound at the 400 block of Petra Avenue.
- Officer responded to a blue heeler type dog in front of Club 24. Dog was eventually captured and transferred to BFHS.
- Officer responded to a report of an assault. Report was taken at the Police Department. The juvenile RP stated that his uncle had assaulted him the previous day. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to a report of a locked mailbox being open at the 300 block of OIE. The area was checked with no one found near the mailboxes. A post office employee came and secured the mailboxes.
- Sunnyside PD assist at the 800 block of Market Street. Officers were able to detain suspect in vehicular assault and eluding incident from 06/25. Custody was transferred to Sunnyside PD at Prosser Police Department.
- Officer responded to a request for information at the 600 block of 7th Street. RP requested information on the legality of having passengers ride in the back of a truck if all seatbelts are being used inside of the vehicle. Officer advised to be sure that all other seatbelts are taken before having someone ride in the truck bed.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at Meade Ave/6th Street. RP stated that a dog was left in a car for hours and that 2 windows were left down, but that they were covered with clothing. Officers spoke with responsible owner. The dog was being monitored frequently, did not appear to be in distress, and the vehicle was not at all hot. Officer requested that the owner check on dog every 15 minutes due to outside temperatures.
- YCSO, BCSO officer assist on W. Johnson Road for suspects involved in a theft.
- Officers responded to a report of juveniles not wanting to go home from a friend's home. The friend's home is in Prosser while the RP lives in Kennewick. Officers advised that this is a civil matter.
- Officer responded to a weapons complaint at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that they believe they heard a gunshot and saw a car speeding away. Officer on patrol had heard a firework go off just before the call came in. The area was checked and no evidence of a shooting was found.

June 27 (33 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an abandoned vehicle report at the 1100 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that someone had used the VFW front lawn as a parking lot. The impromptu parking job resulted in several broken sprinklers. The owner of the vehicle was not located and could not be contacted via phone. VFW was contacted and they requested the truck be towed.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance report at the 1600 block of Sherman. RP stated that there is a suspicious male behind the city yard that appeared to be on narcotics. Officers made contact with the male and he stated that he was fine and did not need medical assistance. He did not appear to be in distress.
- BCSO assist for a welfare check on Missimer Rd. Contact was unsuccessful.
- Officer responded to a complaint at the 1000 block of Grant Ave. RP stated that a small metal trash can was damaged. No cameras were in place and no additional information was available.
- Officer assisted with a vehicle repossession at the 900 block of Alexander Court.
- Officer responded to a report of fraud at the 100 block of Merlot. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1000 block of Court Street. Officer located dog, who fortunately had tags on his collar, and returned him to his residence where he spoke to the owner.
- GPD officer assist for a juvenile abuse crime.
- Officers responded to a single vehicle accident at Wine Country Road/Alexander Court. EMS contacted.

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a woman and her dog were in the bathroom for an extensive period of time. Subject and her dog were leaving the restroom when the officer arrived on location. No crime.
- Officers responded to a narcotics complaint at the 300 block of 6th Street. RP stated that they found narcotics on a vehicle that had been impounded.
- Officer responded to suspicious vehicle report on OIE/Gap Road. RP stated that there was a vehicle with its door open parked next to some trees. Officer checked the vehicle and found the occupant just relaxing. No crime.

June 28 (17 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a juvenile runaway. Officers were able to locate the juvenile and the RP was able to pick her up and take her home.
- WBFR/BCSO assist for a residential fire on Richards Rd. Occupant was able to evacuate prior to officer arrival.
- Officer responded to a welfare check at the 500 block of Wine Country Road. Female occupant appeared to be slumped over. Officer spoke with occupant who stated she is resting before driving on to Yakima. No medical assistance necessary.
- Officer responded to an abandoned vehicle complaint at the 300 block of 6th Street. RP stated that the vehicle had been parked in the same location for approximately 2 weeks. Upon checking, officer noted that the vehicle is legally parked on the street, has a current registration, and does not appear to be inoperable. Officer attempted to contact responsible owner, but was unable to. RP wanted the vehicle towed, but at this time, no violation is being committed.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 800 block of Brown Street. A small dog was wandering around. Officer secured the dog back in its yard and left a contact card for the owner.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that two females were attempting to pay with fake \$20 bills. Officers contacted females who stated that they did attempt to pay for gas with the fake bills but that they did not know that the bills were fake. The bills were not accepted by the business. Officers confiscated the fake bills.
- Officers performed follow up activities on multiple incidents.
- Officers responded to a weapons complaint at Prosser Avenue/6th Street. RP stated that a black jeep is driving by and shooting at people out the vehicle window with an air soft gun. RP stated that he was hit by several pellets. Jeep not located.
- Officers responded to a complaint of graffiti at the 1100 block of Budd Avenue.
- Officers responded to a welfare check at the 800 block of Main Street. RP stated that a female and family at the resident are being threatened. Officers checked on resident and she did not know who the RP was. She assured officers that all at the residence are fine.

June 29 (20 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a request for assistance at the 400 block of North River Rd. RP stated that he had locked his keys in the car. Officer advised that he would have to contact a wrecking company, as he cannot assist with this issue.
- YCSO assist with locating an individual in the 100 block of Max Benitz Road. Officers were able to locate the individual and detain him. Custody was transferred to YCSO.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a theft at the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that a Black Trek bike was taken from the location. Item was later posted for sale on FB out of Pasco. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a trespassing complaint at the 1600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that individuals were trespassing on property. There was a small hole cut in the fence surrounding the property and two individuals were discovered camping out by the river (on the

- Officer responded to a complaint at the 1600 block of Meade Ave. RP stated that she does not want the Benton Franklin bus stopping in front of her house. She stated that she has already called BFT, to no avail. Officer advised that she should continue to call the BFT, to see if they can help her as we cannot.
- Officer responded to a welfare check at the 900 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that she saw a young child wandering around with only one shoe that looked to be unsupervised. Child was located in backyard of home with two adults.
- Officer responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a suspicious vehicle had been parked at the location for the entire day. The vehicle is unoccupied. No crime.
- Officers responded to a non-injury traffic accident at Chardonay Avenue/Merlot Drive. Individuals exchanged insurance information.
