ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF June 16, 2023 to June 22, 2023

June 16 (21 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a parking violation complaint at the 1900 block of Benson Ave. RP complained of a semi-truck and tractor parked in a residential area. Officer spoke to responsible party who stated she will have her husband move it.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1300 block of Mustang Ct. RP stated that they were concerned about the welfare of animals living in this area with concerns for shelter and access to water. Home owner stated that they no longer want the dogs. Officer gave owners resources to help find them a new home.
- Officer responded to a female who was flagging him down at the 400 block of North River Road. Female stated that someone might be stealing things from her. She then retracted her statement. RP declined to have officers respond for a report.
- Officers responded to a welfare check at the 800 block of Main Street. She was concerned for her parent that lives there. Officers checked the address and occupants stated that they are all fine.
- Officer responded to a blue heeler dog running around at the Scottish-Fest. Officer attempted to find owners nearby. Dog was impounded at the city shelter.
- Officers responded to a noise complaint at the 100 block of Walker Place. There appeared to be a graduation party taking place. Officer did not observe excessive noise.
- Officer responded to a suspicious vehicle at the Market Street Park. RP advised that a red vehicle was moving around in some bushes, with occupants inside. Vehicle was contacted and juvenile occupants were found to be fine. Officers had them leave the area.
- Officers responded to a call about a BNSF building having the doors open, with no workers around. Officers arrived at location and noted one door open with no signs of forced entry. The door was secured.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint about a custody issue. Parties were advised to follow the parenting plan. Issue was resolved.
- Officer responded to a report at Crawford Park of juveniles that pulled up in a vehicle and were drinking and smoking. Officer checked the area and noted several vehicles in the area. No criminal activity was observed.
- Officers assisted with a call at the 400 block of North River Road. RP stated that an unknown subject was contacting his girlfriend on Facebook with a fake account requesting her to send him photos. Officer advised blocking the account to avoid contact.
- Officer assist at the Police Dept. RP was concerned that his wife had not contacted him while on a trip to the west side of WA. He requested that officer check accident reports. While talking to the officer, RPs wife called.
- Officer attempted a traffic stop on a motorcycle that had no license plate. The rider did not stop for lights, siren, and the PA announcement requesting him to stop. Rider did not go over the speed limit. Rider was taken into custody for warrants.

June 17 (24 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a suspicious circumstance report at the 1100 block of Sheridan Ave. RP stated that they saw a male urinating on a fence who was also yelling to himself and waving around and hitting the fences with a stick. Officers were unable to locate the male upon arrival.

- Multi-agency assist in the S. Missimer Rd/W. North River Rd area with a blue Mitsubishi that had eluded Union Gap PD and Tribal PD. Officer was able to locate car and initiated a stop. Three individuals occupied the car, but one fled the scene and was not located. Driver was taken into custody and transferred to Union Gap PD. The second passenger was detained by Grandview Police Department and later released to her parents.
- Officer responded to a report of found property at Prosser Memorial Hospital. A wallet was found in a bathroom on site. Officer passed wallet on to Granger PD as owner of wallet has Granger address.
- Officers responded to a non-injury collision at Merlot Drive and Wine Country Road. RP was on a test drive and was rear ended by another vehicle.
- Officer responded to an individual flagging him down to complain of a car parked where it should not be. Officer contacted vehicle owner and requested the vehicle be moved.
- Officer responded to a report of a theft at Dominos. A Dominos sign was stolen for a vehicle roof. RP is a manager at Dominos and has footage of the theft. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to a report of theft at the 100 block of Spokane Ave. RP stated that a Radio Flyer wagon was stolen. Investigation ongoing.
- BCSO assist at exit 83 of I82. RP stated that an occupant of a black Jeep had pointed a gun at the RP out of their window. The gun was not fired. Officer was unable to locate the black Jeep.
- Officers responded to a domestic violence assault at the 900 block of Alexander Court between siblings. The RP took himself to Prosser Memorial Hospital. Officers were unable to locate the other sibling. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers performed extra patrols at the Scottish Festival throughout the day.

June 18 (24 Calls for Service)

- Officers checked on vehicle parked in the 600 block of Merlot Drive. Occupants stated that they were just listening to music. Officer warned them about being on private property and advised them to move along.
- BCSO Officer assisted for a DUI stop.
- Officers were flagged down by a male at 7th and Dudley. Male reported that he is lost as his wife left him there. Male refused a ride to a nearby gas station.
- Officer responded to a call from RP asking if her brother was reported missing. RP was mumbling and not finishing sentences. Officers told her that no one by her brother's name was missing in Prosser.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 1100 block of Spokane Ave. Multiple RPs stated that a neighbor is riding up and down the street on a scooter yelling profanities at everyone. Scooter male stated that one of the area residents tried to hit him with his truck. Parties were advised to leave each other alone.
- Officer responded to report of theft at the 600 block of Court Street. RP stated that her lawn mower was taken out of her shed at some time over the weekend. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a medical assist at Wine County Road/Gap Road.
- Officers responded to a threat complaint at the 900 block of Parkside Drive. RP stated that their son has been threatening them. Officers attempted to contact RP at the residence and via phone. Message was left to have call returned. Call was returned at a later time.
- YSO assist for a vehicle in the 200 block of Byron Rd. Vehicle owner is a resident of Yakima County.
- Officers responded to a report of Domestic Disturbance at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that he and a known female had gotten into an argument and she had intentionally spilled a soda on the RP's truck and then threw the bottle at him. He stated that in response, he squirted water at her. RP did not want to press charges. RP was advised to stay away from her. RP advised that he plans to.

- Officers responded to a complaint at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. RP stated that juveniles keep knocking on and ringing the doorbell at her home. RP also states that this is an ongoing issue. Officers advised RP that this is not a criminal issue and that she should speak to the apartment management for resolution.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.

June 19 (17 Calls for Service)

- Officers followed up on complaint about the juvenile ding dong ditchers. RP stated that she will get a camera for her entry way to assist with identifying the offenders.
- Officers responded to an information request at the 900 block of Alexander Court. RP was requesting information regarding violations, disturbances, evictions, and FOIA information, due to disturbances in her area over the weekend.
- Officers responded to a report of a physical assault at the 1300 block of Grant Avenue. RP stated that his future father-in-law had shoved him in his living room and had threatened him. No injuries were found. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a lewd conduct report at Castle Car Wash. RP stated that a male was performing lewd actions while watching her. Officers were unable to locate male.
- BCSO officer assist for a complaint on Bettinson of a male acting odd in a pasture.

June 20 (21 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at Love's. RP stated that individuals who had stolen from them earlier is back and they would like them to be trespassed. The officers did not locate the individuals upon arrival.
- Officers responded to a non-injury collision at the 900 block of Court Street. Driver stated that his contact had come out and while trying to put it back in, had pressed the gas pedal rather than the brake pedal. He hit the RPs parked truck which was in her backyard. Medical was requested as well, but male stated that he had no injuries and no injuries were visible.
- Officers located and served no trespass paperwork on subjects from earlier incident at Love's. Trespass notice given to Love's business as well.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint on the 1400 block of Kinney Way. A dog with a shock collar was running up SR22, and then on Kinney Way. Officer left a note on the front door with a contact card informing the owner of the matter and requesting that they keep their dog on their property.
- Officers responded to a possible fraud complaint at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP wanted to report a possible scam as she was having troubles logging in to her Health Care Site. RP stated they had contacted the site but did not feel like he received legitimate information. Officer suggested he monitor his information. No fraud found at this time.
- Officer flagged a vehicle that is parked too close to a fire hydrant. Vehicle has been parked there for several days.
- Officer responded to a report of a traffic hazard at Ford Street and Highland Drive. RP states that there is a vehicle in the middle of the road with the inside lights on and the doors open that has been there for 5 minutes with no one seen in or near it. Vehicle was gone when officers arrived.
- Officers responded to a request for a snake removal in their driveway at the 200 block of Ladera Street. RP stated that there was a small rattlesnake in the driveway causing a disturbance. The snake was removed from the property.

June 21 (25 Calls for Service)

- BCSO assist at W CR 12 25. RP stated that they heard 6-10 gunshots outside of their residence. He also reported hearing a male yelling obscenities outside of the residence. Officers searched area with BCSO but were unable to locate anyone.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at Love's. RP stated that there was a robbery taking place at Love's and hung up. Officers found that no robbery was taking place and that the RPs call did not originate from Love's.
- Officer responded to a parking violation complaint at Loves. PR requested that officers have approximately 8 semis moved that are blocking the fuel island. Officers advised RP that we cannot enforce private property parking. RP was advised that if the drivers refused to remove their vehicle, RP can have driver's trespassed.
- Officers responded to a complaint about solicitors at the 1900 block of Elwood Avenue. RP stated that people keep stopping by his home trying to sell things such as solar panels, house painting or home inspections. No company name or business card was left. RP is concerned about the amount of times it has happened and at the oddity of it. Officer met with RP. No crime has taken place at this time, but RP will be buying cameras and watching for unknown persons.
- Officer flagged a boat trailer on the 100 block of SW Kelandren Drive that was not parked legally.
- GVPD assist for a possible runaway juvenile at the 1000 block of Anna Street. RP stated that the juvenile may be located at a Prosser address. Officers did not locate the juvenile at the suggested address.
- Officers responded to a noise complaint on the 300 block of Canyon Dr. RP stated that the downstairs neighbor bangs on her floor (RPs ceiling) whenever her kids run up the stairs. RP stated that they also bang on the walls. Officer advised that this does constitute a noise violation.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.

June 22 (29 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a complaint of an abandoned vehicle at Prosser Memorial Hospital. RP was advised to have their tow company remove it.
- Officer responded to a complaint of individuals going through the dumpsters at the 200 block of Chardonnay Ave. Individuals stated that they were looking for boxes. Officers warned them about being on private property without permission.
- Officers responded to a report of a possible car theft. RP stated that his ex-wife borrowed his vehicle and had said she was travelling to Prosser. RP then stated that she had called him and stated that her boyfriend took the keys and left in the vehicle. Officers were unable to locate the ex-wife, her boyfriend, or the vehicle. None of the reportedly involved parties reside in Prosser.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident at Love's Truck Stop. RP stated that a semi-truck with a trailer hit another vehicle while exiting the parking lot and that the driver almost hit pedestrians as well. The semi was last seen traveling EB on I 82. Officers were unable to locate the semi.
- Officers responded to a disturbance complaint at the Cottage Market. RP stated that a male left his truck on the property overnight due to a tire blowout. RP requested he leave and the male stated he was waiting for a repair person. RP told male that he needed to leave or he would have vehicle towed. The male became argumentative and was yelling profanities in the parking lot. The RP wanted the male trespassed from the property. Officers served trespass papers on the subject.
- Officer responded to a non-violence domestic report at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that he and his girlfriend had gotten into an argument while at the grocery. He stated that the argument had escalated to a point where the female had balled up her fist as though to assault the male. RP wanted to report the incident in the event that it later escalated. RP was advised to obtain an NCO. No crime at this time.
