ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF JUNE 26, 2020 TO JULY 1, 2020

JUNE 26 (14 calls for service)

- Traffic complaint received in the area of Gap Road and Wine Country Road. Report of a black SUV with four occupants driving recklessly and running stop signs. Area was checked, but the vehicle was not located.
- Scam reported in the 100 block of Walker Place. Reporting Party (RP) advised of a social security scam attempted on him, no money was lost. RP was referred to FTC for reporting.
- Theft of mail reported in the 800 block of Market Street. RP advised she had seen a female take a package off her front porch through her Ring camera. After investigation, it was determined that the woman on camera was retrieving her package that had been delivered to the RP's residence by mistake, which both the RP and woman said happens often with their mail. No crime was found to have been committed.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 600 block of Wine Country Road, report of a female acting strangely. Officer contacted the female and determined there were no issues, female and a male friend were just working on a vehicle in the parking lot.
- Report of a suspicious vehicle at Housel Middle School. Officers made contact, and found there were no problems, just a father teaching his teen how to drive.

JUNE 27 (15 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a noise complaint in the 1400 block of Paterson Road. Officers found a group of juveniles hanging out playing basketball. The juveniles were advised their neighbor was trying to sleep and that they would appreciate it if they would stop bouncing the ball next to their window.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of I-82. Deputy contacted a vehicle on I-82 that was swerving. The female driver jumped out of the vehicle and the male passenger got into the driver's seat and took off. The female stated that she was giving the male a ride when he demanded she take him to Yakima. The male was reported to be under the influence of alcohol and drugs and to have pointed a CO2 bb gun in the female's face. The Deputy transported the female back to Prosser. Units staged at exit 82, but did not see vehicle exit the interstate.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of S. Missimer Road, the male involved in the above incident had been located by Deputies, but took off on foot. The male then jumped into the Yakima River to avoid being detained. The male was eventually taken into custody with the assistance of multiple agencies and citizens on the river with boats.
- Theft of mail reported in the 1000 block of Concord Way. RP advised their paycheck was missing from their mailbox.
- Traffic complaint in the area of Memorial Street and Paterson Road, report of ongoing issues with speeding vehicles.

JUNE 28 (10 calls for service)

- Suspicious activity reported at McDonalds. RP advised two juveniles brought their dogs into the restraint and were told they had to take them outside. The males were then reportedly acting strange in the parking lot. The juveniles had left the area prior to officer arrival.
- Request for a welfare check in the 1200 block Meade Ave. Report of a male laying on a bench and not moving. Officers made contact with the male who was found to have an active DOC warrant. Male was taken into custody and booked into the Benton County Jail.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a reported assault in the area of Bunn Road near the river. Male called 911 hysterical, saying someone was going to kill him, but he could not give his location. The caller disconnected and when the dispatcher tried to reach him, again he hung up and would not answer any further calls. Officers were not able to locate the male or an assault location.

JUNE 29 (16 calls for service)

- Fraud report, RP advised his credit card was mailed to an old address and he was alerted that it had been used in Sunnyside.

Officers responded to a verbal disturbance in the 1200 block of Playfield Ave. It was determined to be a neighbor dispute over the property line. RP stated his neighbor had taken out stakes he had placed in the yard marking the property line. The neighbor was contacted and advised that the neighbor's brother had grabbed her arm during an argument over the stakes. It was suggested that both parties have their lots surveyed to determine where the line is. Case forwarded to the City Attorney for review of assault charges.

- Officer assisted BCSO with Spanish translation in the area of W Johnson Road.

JUNE 30 (16 calls for service)

- Employee with Sunnyside Irrigation reported teens jumping off the cat walk by the Grant Street Bridge. Officers made contact with two adults in the area who advised that the teens had already left the location.
- Civil issue, RP had a question regarding excise tax on a trailer. RP was directed to the Treasurer's office.
- Dog bite reported in the 1100 block of Grant Street. RP was bit by a neighborhood dog while on a walk in the area.

JULY 01 (25 calls for service)

- Officers assisted BCSO in the 47000 block of N. Wilgus Road. Report of two employees who were verbal and one who threatened to shoot the other. One male was taken into custody by BCSO for felony threats.
- Animal complaint in the 1000 block of Spokane Ave. Report of a loose and aggressive dog in the area. Dog was later located and the owner was cited for Dog at Large.
- ORV complaint in the 1000 block of Lillian Street. Report of juveniles riding a dirt bike up and down the street without lights. Juveniles were gone upon officer arrival.
- Suspicious circumstances reported at the Prosser High School Construction site. RP advised of at least four people in the area. Officers determined it was possibly just the cross-country team running in the area. No issues were found at the construction site.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a field contact at Tom Denchel Ford. Deputy observed a male enter a vehicle on the lot. It was found the male was looking at cars he was interested in purchasing.
- Officer observed a male at the Shell station who was known to have an active warrant. The warrant was confirmed and the male was taken into custody and booked into the Benton County Jail for failure to register.
