ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF June 30, 2023 to July 06, 2023

June 30 (28 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a two vehicle, non-injury collision at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. A vehicle pulled out of the Cottage Market parking lot into oncoming traffic. The oncoming traffic was unable to stop, resulting in a collision. The driver of the car pulling out stated he did not see the oncoming traffic.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at 8th Street and Sheridan Ave. RP stated that a black and tan German Shepard dog was loose and had tried to attack her. Upon arrival, officer noted that the dog did not seem aggressive but defensive. Dog was unsecured but on its own property and did not appear to be a threat to anyone. Officer attempted contact with owner and left a message.
- Officers assisted with a brush fire on W. North River Rd.
- Officer responded to a reckless driving complaint on Wine Country Road/Merlot Drive. RP stated that a black sports car was driving all over the road from the firehouse to the Starbucks. Officer located the car and individual at Starbucks. Officer spoke to driver who did not appear to be impaired.
- Officers responded to a request to move a transient individual and his belongings from one area to another. Individual was advised that officer was unable to provide moving assistance.
- Officer responded to a parking violation complaint at the city hall. RP stated that the same vehicle has been parked in the city hall parking lot for a week and though RP puts a notice on the vehicle each day, the vehicle is parked in a different parking spot the next day, with the notice removed. Due to an upcoming event, RP requested that the owner be contacted to move the vehicle. Contact was made, and the owner of the vehicle moved it.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint. RP stated that his child's mother was refusing to follow the court ordered visitation plan. Officer advised RP to contact Yakima authorities due to the mother living in Yakima.
- Officers responded to a two vehicle, non-injury collision at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Driver of car one pulled out in front of driver of car two, causing a collision.
- Officer responded to a theft report at the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that she left her Iphone in her unlocked vehicle and it was stolen. Using a phone app, the RP was able to locate the phone at the Walmart in Sunnyside, where SSPD assisted with the recovery of the phone and its return to the RP.
- Officers performed numerous traffic stops.

July 01 (22 Calls for Service)

- SSPD officer assist for a warrant arrest following a traffic stop.
- PFD officer assist with a residential fire at the 1300 block of Sheridan Ave/8th Street.
- Officer responded to a report of a theft at the 1200 block of Riverside Drive. RP stated that a lawn mower was stolen at some point during the last few nights. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1200 block of Prosser Ave. RP stated that a non-aggressive, medium sized, white dog with tags and a leash was running around and looks to have gotten away from the owner.
- BCSO officer assist with an accident on Johnson Rd.

- Officers responded to a domestic violence report at Wine Country Rd/6th Street. RP stated that she witnessed a male assaulting a female. RP stated that the male claimed that the female was fine and did not need help before both of them entered a vehicle and sped away at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was not located upon officer arrival, despite extensive searching for the car and/or involved parties.
- BCSO officer assist at the 400 block of North River Rd for a traffic stop on a suspicious vehicle.
- Officer responded to a reckless traffic report on Market Street/Prosser Ave. RP stated that an older white pickup truck was speeding with two young girls riding in the bed of the truck. Officers were unable to locate the truck upon arrival.
- Officers responded to a weapons disturbance at the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP stated that she was concerned that her grandson's threats to hurt family were going to take place. Officers were able to locate the grandson and detain him.

July 02 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a fireworks complaint at the 1600 block of Meade Avenue. Officer was unable to locate fireworks or the person responsible for setting them off.
- Officer responded to a report of a wallet found on Meade and 9th Street. Wallet was returned to owner.
- WSP assist on I82 at milepost 83 with the removal of a traffic barrel from the roadway.
- Officers responded to a domestic disturbance report at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that her mother does not like her boyfriend and is causing a verbal disturbance and will not leave the RP alone. No assault took place. Upon arrival, officers discovered that the boyfriend had warrants and he was taken into custody.
- WSP officer assist in an attempt to locate a red Mercedes that fled from WSP, taking exit 80. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle.
- Officers performed case follow-up activities throughout the day.
- BCSO officer assist with a domestic violence report on N. Graham Road. No injuries, no physical assault.
- Officers responded to a welfare check at 10th and OIE Hwy for a 911 hang up. Officers did not observe anyone who needed assistance and nothing out of the ordinary was observed.
- Officers responded to a report of fraud at 1100 Bennett Ave. RP stated that he believed that he dropped his bank card while at Auto Zone. Later the same day, they noticed a charge at AutoZone that they did not make. This investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a disturbance report at the 100 block of Merlot. RP stated that a customer was upset about having to pay extra for sauces and was becoming verbally abusive (yelling at the employees) and was throwing things at the employees as well. Male exited the establishment prior to police arrival and officers were unable to locate him.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a male in the roadway on east bound North Gap Rd. ramp. Male was contacted and requested a ride to "anywhere west" as he was trying to get to Oregon. He was given a courtesy transport out of Prosser.

July 03 (25 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a report of a theft at the 1100 block of Meade Ave. RP stated that his trailer was stolen. He stated that his son was living in it in Grandview and they don't know where it is now. RP was advised to contact GPD as that appears to be the location of the theft.
- Officers responded to a disturbance with weapons report at the 100 block of S. Wamba Road. RP stated that her mother pulled a knife on her over an argument about the RPs brother living with

them. There were no injuries, and all parties were able to talk and go their separate ways for the day. RP declined pressing charges.

- Officers responded to a report of domestic violence at the 100 block of Nunn Road. RP was calling in the report for another female and stated that the incident happened 3 weeks ago. Female did not wish to make a report.
- Officers noted during patrol that a door was open on the Walter Clore Center. Officers checked the building and no issues were found. Building was then secured.
- BCSO officer assist at W. Hanks Road and N. Missimer Road for a two vehicle, injury collision.
- Officer responded to a complaint about possible stolen vehicle. RP stated that he had sold a car, the individual paid a down payment, but has since not payed him the remainder of the balance and has blocked all avenues of communication. RP was advised that this is a civil matter.
- EMS officer assist at the 600 block of Myrtle Street.
- Officers responded to a fireworks complaint at the 1800 block of Benson Road. RP stated that juveniles were setting off fireworks and RP had the fireworks debris as evidence. Officer was unable to locate the juveniles.
- WPS/EMS officer assist at N Gap Road/Wine Country Road for a collision.
- Officers assisted with traffic control issues in response to the I 82 fire.

July 04 (29 Calls for Service)

- Officers respond to a vehicle parked at the Market Street Park. The vehicle has been parked there for several days and appears to be abandoned.
- Officers responded to a request at the 1200 block of Prosser Avenue. RP advised she had accidentally locked her keys in her car with her child inside. Child was not distressed and spare keys were brought to the scene.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a vehicle parked illegally in the Post Office area. The owner was contacted who stated he was just wanting to park in the shade. He was told he needed to move his vehicle immediately.
- Officers provided 4th of July parade detail.
- Officers responded to a disturbance report at the 1400 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated that he asked a resident to pick up her cigarette butts and though she did comply, she became very argumentative and verbal afterwards. Parties separated and no crime was committed.
- Officers responded to request for a welfare check for a Prosser resident as they did not show up to work. All was well with the resident and they had overslept.
- Officer assistance requested at the rest area. RP stated that the construction company's truck flag was tangled and they wanted the officer to fix it. Officer checked the flag and verified that it was not tangled at that time.
- BCSO officer assist at the 3000 block of Missimer Road for a disturbance.
- BCSO officer assist at Loves for a possible stolen vehicle.
- Officers responded to an occupied vehicle parked at the 200 block of Gap Road. The occupants were told to continue their activities elsewhere.
- BCSO officer assist for a report of reckless driving at N Albro Rd and Johnson Rd. Officer was unable to locate the reckless driver.
- Officer responded to a complaint of reckless driving on Market Street and Dudley Ave. Officers located the described vehicle at a residence, but it was unoccupied. RP stated that there is video available of the reckless driver and will turn it over to the officer as necessary.
- Officers responded to a fireworks complaint at the 1400 block of Paterson Road. RP stated that they could hear fire crackers going off. Officer noted that at the location, there were individuals cleaning up fireworks debris and they were advised of the municipal code concerning fireworks.
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 500 block of Myrtle Street. RP stated that an assault was happening outside between a male and female. The female was asking for help. The male was arrested for suspected domestic violence.

- Officers performed patrols at Housel Middle School for the fireworks show.
- Officers assisted with traffic control after the fireworks show.
- Officers responded to multiple fireworks complaints throughout the day.
- Officers responded to a suspected vehicle prowler at the 600 block of Myrtle Street. RP stated that a female neighbor who appears to have been drinking is trying to get into the RP's truck. The officer contacted the female and it appears she was trying to get into the wrong vehicle. The officer was able to convince her to return to her home. No crime.

July 05 (28 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with an animal complaint. Officers were advised that there were cows loose on the road but officers were unable to locate the animals.
- Officers responded to a possible assault complaint at the 200 block of 3rd Street. RP stated that earlier, her purse had been stolen and that while she and her boyfriend were attempting to retrieve it, a male had brandished and fired a weapon into the ground near her boyfriend's feet. They had separated ways at that time with the gun wielding male and later decided to contact law enforcement. As the boyfriend did not want to speak to law enforcement, the RP stated that she would like the incident documented for information purposes only.
- BCSO officer assist at W North River Road for a report of domestic violence.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 200 block of Chardonnay Ave. RP stated that his children's mother showed up at an appointment when it is his visitation period. RP stated that Mom has anger issues and he did not want her at the appointment. Mom was no longer on site when officers arrived. RP was advised that there is no order in place and that he should petition court for an NCO if he feels it is warranted.
- Officers responded to a report of a runaway at the 1300 block of Sheridan Avenue. Officers found that the suspected runaway is actually an adult. RP was advised that an adult cannot be reported as a runaway.
- Officers responded to a report of inappropriate juvenile contact at the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that a female was seen touching a child inappropriately. Investigation ongoing.
- GVPD officer assist with a possible weapons threat. The alleged threat was deemed to not be credible.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a truck driver had come in to the business, requested alcohol, and was asking odd questions. No crime at this time.
- Officers responded to a report of theft at the Prosser Mini Mart. RP stated that an individual had stolen snacks. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1300 area of SR 22. RP advised that a familiar and repeat offender was trying to gain unwarranted and unwelcome access to his home. Male was not located at or near the home. RP was advised to obtain a no-contact order.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance whereby a blue minivan was intentionally following an officer on Wine Country Road and Wittkopff to include turning off his headlights at one point. The officer stopped the van and noticed the male occupant was in need of crisis intervention. The officer transported the male to PMH for continued crisis intervention.
- BCSO officer assist for a warrant arrest.

July 06 (34 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to two separate reports of a disturbance at OIE/Wamba Rd. The RP advised that a male and female were arguing in the area. Officers were unable to locate anyone.

- Officers contacted occupant in vehicle parked at Market Street Park after hours. No issues were found and the vehicle was moved along.
- Officers responded to a loitering complaint at the 400 block of Petra Avenue. RP stated that an SUV with its windows covered with blankets continues to be parked overnight on the property. The responsible owner of the SUV was contacted and has been trespassed from the location.
- Officers responded to a DOL complaint concerning a possible abandoned vehicle at the Market Street Park. Though the vehicle has not been reported stolen, and is parked legally, it will be pink tagged on Monday if it is still at the location.
- Officers responded to a report of threats at the 1300 block of Semillon Place. RP stated that her brother was pounding on the back door trying to gain access to the home and did not appear to be stable at the time. Officers were able to detain the individual and get help for him.
- Officer responded to a complaint of a vehicle blocking alley access at the 1800 block of Benson Ave. RP reported that it has been parked there since the 4th of July. Vehicle was tagged for removal.
- Officers responded to an unauthorized dumping complaint. RP stated that they witnessed someone dumping carpet and other items at 6th Street and Bennett Ave. The RP was able to give officers the license plate of the vehicle. Officers contacted the responsible owner of the suspect vehicle, who had loaned it to someone. They agreed to clean up what they had dumped.
- Officers responded to a weapons report for the 1300 block of Sheridan (Prosser City Park). RP stated that he believed that his truck tailgate had been shot while parked at the park on 07/03/2023.
- Officers responded to a report of a two vehicle, non-injury traffic accident at the 100 block of Merlot Drive.
- Officer responded to two separate theft incidents. One was at the Gateway Chevron and the other at Prosser Mini Mart. Suspect was the same person in both thefts and was trespassed from both locations.
- Officers responded to a fireworks complaint at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. RP stated a male is driving around setting off M80s. Officer was unable to locate the male.
- Officer assist with questions concerning a renter's license.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at Sadie Street and Canyon Drive. RP stated that there was a shirtless male swinging a metal pipe around. Male was contacted and let the officers know that he was just playing Kung Foo Master.
- Officer responded to a request for information on a civil issue between her and her husband.
