ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF JUNE 19, 2020 TO JUNE 25, 2020

JUNE 19 (21 calls for service)

- Report of a disabled vehicle stuck in the automatic car wash in the 500 block of Wine Country Road. Officers assisted the driver with pushing the vehicle out of the car wash.
- Theft report received in the 800 block of Main Street. Reporting Party (RP) advised a bike had been taken from inside of a storage shed. RP called back on 06/20 and advised the bike had been returned by an unknown male.
- Child custody issue reported at Burger King. RP was supposed to pick up her child at the location, but the child never showed. RP was advised to contact their attorney to report the violation of the parenting plan.
- Suspicious circumstances reported near the Courthouse. RP reported hearing what they thought was someone kicking and stomping from inside of a trunk of a vehicle. The vehicle was described as an older maroon two door sedan. Officers checked the area, but were not able to locate the vehicle.
- Suspicious circumstances reported at Housel Middle School. RP reported seeing a male in the field throwing a football to himself for three nights in a row. Officers checked the area, but did not locate the male.

JUNE 20 (20 calls for service)

- Report of phone harassment received in the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP advising a male keeps calling harassing her. Officer called the number provided, but it was found to no longer be valid.
- Report of dogs at large in the 2000 block of Miller Ave. RP called and said that her neighbor's dogs were out and were being aggressive. Officer arrived on scene and was greeted by two friendly dogs that wanted to jump into his car. Officer and another neighbor were able to secure the dogs back into their yard. Officer was able to contact the owner and let them know about their fence being damaged and not locking properly.
- Traffic stop in the 12700 block of N Gap Road. Vehicle failed to stop at a stop sign. Driver was given a verbal warning for the infraction.
- Dispatch advising of a 911 call in the 400 block of North River Road that sounded like a child on the line. Officer made contact at the residence and determined there were no issues, that a child had accidentally called 911.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 100 block of Walker Place. Report of a male going through backyards in the neighborhood who had possibly stolen a bicycle. Officers located the male in the area of Larch Street and Bennett Ave. The male ditched the bike and fled on foot northbound across the RR tracks. Officers were unable to locate the male after he fled and the bike was returned to the owner.

JUNE 21 (19 calls for service)

- Report of possible fireworks near Park Ave and Court Street. Officers contacted multiple people in the area who advised they believed it sounded more like gunshots coming from the area of Campbell Drive. Officers checked the area, but did not find anything unusual or any signs of gunfire.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 100 block of Walker Place. RP called and said she had video of someone trying to open their front door during the night.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 1900 block of Highland Drive. RP called and said his son was home and stating that someone was at the back door trying to get in. Officers arrived and found that it was the RP's other son who was there to take a shower and pick up a few things. The male's brother said that he let him.
- Unemployment fraud reported in the 1300 block of Desert Cove. RP called and said that her employer notified her that someone had tried to use her information to get unemployment benefits.
- Officers assisted with a disabled vehicle in the area of Wine Country Road and Merlot Drive. Customer was test driving the vehicle from Hall's when it broke down in the intersection. Hall's sent a tow truck to pick up the customer.
- Citizen assist at the Ameristar. RP stated he was being followed by a vehicle full of juveniles and that a drone had also been following him all night. RP pointed out the "drone" up in the sky, which was determined to be a star.

JUNE 22 (20 calls for service)

- Assault reported in the 2000 block of Benson Ave. Officers made contact with the RP who was upset because his neighbor had flicked him in the nose and forehead. Neighbor was upset because the RP had just come home from a 16 hour shift and the RP was drunk and being loud. No injuries were reported from the flick, RP just wanted his neighbor to be warned. RP then proceeded to criticize responding officers for wearing facemasks, stating Coronavirus "was not a real thing".
- Civil dispute in the 1200 block of Prosser Ave. RP advising their neighbor has rabbits and the smell comes into their house. The neighbor was upset and requested that the RP contact him with issues instead of going right to the landlord. Both parties were spoken to about being neighborly in hopes they can correct the issues without them getting worse over time.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 1000 block of Dudley Ave, RP wanted officers to check on a juvenile at the location. case information was forwarded to CPS.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 400 block of Wine Country Road. Report of 19 Juveniles being left outside who looked thirsty and hungry. Officers were not able to locate any juveniles in the area.
- Officer responded to a report of an auto theft in the 300 block of Casi Court. RP stated his truck was parked on the street and when he went to go to his truck the prior morning, he noticed it was gone and in its place he found a Huffy 18 speed bicycle. RP's neighbor contacted the Officer and stated he thought he had seen the truck parked on N. River Road. Additional officers checked the area of N. River Road and located the truck. Officers located an additional bicycle in the bed of the truck, which did not belong to the RP.
- Order violation reported in the 1000 block of Alexander Court.
- Request for a welfare check received near the river by the Grant Street Bridge. Report of a juvenile female who appeared to be under the influence. RP stated the female was having a hard time walking, and was alone with multiple males. Officers responded and made contact with multiple juveniles. Several containers of alcohol were located in the area and one female was found to be highly intoxicated. The female was transported to PMH by medics.

JUNE 23 (20 calls for service)

- Non-injury collision reported in the area of Old Inland Empire Hwy and Gap Road. Female driver reported feeling dizzy, closing her eyes and then waking up after crashing into a parked vehicle.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised they hadn't seen the tenant in two weeks, mail was piled up and there was no response at the door. Management allowed access into the location, but the tenant was not located inside and everything appeared to be in order.
- Mail theft reported in the 1400 block of Scenic Drive. RP advised they were expecting a package that said it had been delivered by USPS, but was not in their mailbox.
- Narcotics complaint received in the 200 block of Merlot Drive. RP called to say that a juvenile staying with them had been found in possession of marijuana that had a receipt of sale from Altitude with it. It was determined by video that the sale was not made to the juvenile by Altitude employees.
- Non-injury traffic accident reported in the 200 Block of Merlot Drive. Driver drove up onto curb and hit a fence and light pole near the irrigation canal. Driver was issued a citation for Wheels off Roadway.
- Officers responded to a disturbance report in the 1600 block of Grant Ave. Officers made contact with two juveniles who stated they were hanging by the river when they had been confronted by a large group. They decided to leave the area, but the group followed them. One of the juveniles reportedly pulled out a machete and told the group to leave them alone, which they did. The juvenile placed the machete in their car and then the group came back and a fight ensued. Charges will be forwarded to the Juvenile Prosecutor's Office.
- Traffic hazard in the area of 6th Street and Prosser Ave. A large part of a tree trunk broke off and fell into the road. City crew was called and removed the debris from the roadway.

JUNE 24 (27 calls for service)

- Disturbance reported in the 900 block of Campbell Drive. RP called, stating that his son was at the location and was out of control. The son was not in the area when officers arrived. It was determined that there was an active no contact order between the RP and his son, charges sent to the Prosecutor's Office for the violation.
- Request for a welfare check received at the Spin Cycle laundromat. It was reported that an infant had been left in a vehicle while the mother was inside the laundromat with another small child. Officers made contact with the

mother who had both children inside with her. It was determined that she was just making multiple trips in order to get all of the clothes inside before taking the infant out of the vehicle. No problems were found.

- Officers assisted Grandview PD with contacting the owner of a found purse who lives in Prosser.
- Officers assisted BCSO in the area of S Missimer Road and W North River Road with a report of a female screaming at the location. Officers checked the location, but did not locate a disturbance. Approximately an hour later, BCSO requested assistance back out at the location for another report of a female screaming. Officers made contact with a male at a residence who directed them to a 5th wheel trailer behind the house. Upon approach, officers could hear screaming and yelling coming from inside the trailer and heard a female yelling for help. Officers made contact with a male and female inside of the trailer who were initially uncooperative and refused to exit, but came out after a few minutes. BCSO took the male into custody for violation of a No Contact Order.

JUNE 25 (27 calls for service)

- Suspicious circumstances reported at Sun Terrace Assisted Living. It was reported that a male was seen walking around the building multiple times and that he had walked through the front door and then left. Officers contacted the male walking in the area of Wine Country Road and SR-22. The male stated he was going through ashtrays looking for cigarettes. The male was advised to stay off private property when he does not have permission to be there.
- Accident reported in the area of Merlot Drive and Chardonnay Ave. RP advised that the awning on her motorhome had detached and struck a light pole at the location causing minor damage.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a report of a DV incident within a vehicle on I82 that was possibly coming into Prosser. Officers were not able to locate the vehicle.
- Unemployment fraud report received in the 1000 block of Sadie Street. RP filed an unemployment claim and was notified that a claim had already been filed with his information.
- Officers assisted BCSO with multiple disturbance reports in the county.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 900 block of Concord way. RP stated a male had tried opening the front door of their residence. Officers checked the area, but were unable to locate the male.
