ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF July 21 to July 27, 2023

July 21 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a suspicious fire report at the 1600 block of Sherman Avenue. Officer observed a fire behind the location. While checking the area, he was confronted with a male who was wielding a stick. The male stated that he did not start the fire but that there had been a campfire alight upon his arrival. WBFR was able to put out the fire.
- Officers responded to a disturbance at the 700 block of Memorial Street (PMH). RP stated that a male had been discharged from the hospital but was refusing to leave. Security had asked him 3-4 times to leave to no avail, and at one point, the male threw a water bottle. Though he was instructed to leave by the officer upon arrival, he still refused to leave. He was escorted out of the facility by the officer and the hospital security guard. His actions resulted in an escort to BCJ for Trespass 1st Degree.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1800 block of Highland Dr. RP stated that they had concerns about 2 pit bulls at the location. Officer talked to owner about the requirement for licensing pets and making sure they had necessary care.
- Officers assisted with the recovery of a stolen scooter at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that their scooter had been stolen and they had just found it at the location. Though the scooter had not been reported as stolen at the time, the RO was able to prove ownership of the scooter and it was released to them.
- Officers responded to an information report at the 800 block of Bennett Avenue. RP stated that sewage was running over the roadway at the location. No hazard was taking place at the time and the information was shared with the appropriate persons.
- Officers discovered an abandoned vehicle at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The vehicle appeared to have been 'gutted', the windows were smashed out, and the doors were damaged. Officer attempted to contact the registered owner to no avail.
- Officers responded to a report of a domestic disturbance-non assault at the 900 block of Brown Street. No crime was taking place but one of the individuals causing the disturbance was taken into custody due to having a warrant.
- BCSO Officers assist with a traffic accident with injuries at W. Johnson Road/W CR 12.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for various cases.

July 22 (28 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a report of a medical issue. Incident was turned over to medics.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstance at the 1000 block of Colena Street. RP stated that a male was pushing a mini bike from the bushes and appeared to be casing houses. Male was not located.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 600 block of Brown Street. RP stated that her son had been bitten by a dog in the area. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 600 block of Court Street. RP stated that there was a male in her neighborhood when she left for work (in the am) and that her neighbor called saying same male was looking into the RPs windows. Officers were unable to locate the male at the residence.

- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for various cases.

July 23 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an APS Referral. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to an information report. RP stated that her son had taken her vehicle. This actually happened outside of the city of Prosser so was referred to BCSO.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that his ex-girlfriend took his PS5 after they broke up. RP was advised that this is a civil matter and was given information on possible steps to take.
- Officer responded to a civil complaint at the 1300 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated that an RV had gone through the car wash and that the AC unit on top of the RV had caused damage to the car wash. RP was concerned for structural damage to the building. Individuals exchanged information and were advised that this is a civil matter.
- Officers responded to a welfare check at Court Street and Park Avenue. 911 had been called and a child could be heard talking. Call was an accidental call made by a child.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 900 block of Kinney Way (public pool). RP stated that they are trying to get two juvenile individuals to leave the location due to being verbal with staff as well as saying inappropriate things to a juvenile female in the area. Eventually, both juveniles left.
- Officers escorted a male to BCJ for a warrant following a traffic stop.

July 24 (18 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a disturbance on North Gap Road.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Building was checked and found to be secure.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at San Fernando Way and SW Kelandren Drive. RP stated that there is an aggressive pit bull loose. Dog is acting aggressive, growling, and following individuals in the area. Officers were unable to locate the dog.
- Officer responded to a destruction of property report at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that he believes that his ex-girlfriend slashed his tires and keyed his vehicle two days ago. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to an APS referral at the 2000 block of Wine Country Road. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of identity theft at the 60 block of Ellie Ann Court. RP stated that they are receiving statements for accounts that they did not open, but that have RPs name on them. Investigation is ongoing.
- GPD officer assist with locating a theft suspect vehicle. Officers were unable to locate.
- Officers responded to a complaint of loitering at the 500 block of Cabernet Court. RP stated that a female was sleeping under a tree (on the property). Officer contacted female who assured officers that she was not homeless but merely resting under the tree while her companions were inside the building. No problems were found.
- Officer responded to a report of property found at the 900 block of Court Street. RP stated that a motorcycle was left on his property. Officers were able to remove the motorcycle and are waiting for it to be claimed.
- Officer responded to a complaint of a traffic hazard at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a power line fell on her car and that it is blocking the roadway. While she wisely

waited in her vehicle, it was confirmed to be a cable line rather than a power line. PFD was able to secure the line until the responsible company was contacted.

- Officers were dispatched to Crawford Park regarding an adult male who had stopped breathing. Upon arrival, officers determined the male was in a narcotics related overdose and immediately began CPR. CPR and multiple doses of Narcan were successful in reviving the male. Medics from Prosser Memorial Hospital and Firefighters from West Benton Fire and Rescue arrived and began administering aid to him. While medics and Firefighters were administering aid, the male became combative and assaulted a firefighter. As officers attempted to take the male into custody, he assaulted an officer and resisted arrest. The male was transported to the Prosser Memorial Hospital for minor injuries and suspected narcotics overdose treatment. The officer and firefighter were uninjured during the incident. The male was then transported to the Benton County Jail and booked. The male suspect, a 20 year old Prosser resident, was booked for Assault 3rd Degree. The Prosser Police Department was assisted by the Benton County Sheriff's Office with this incident.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 100 block of Spruce Ave. RP had not heard from son that day and wanted officers to check on him. Officers checked and the son was fine.
- Officers responded to a reckless traffic complaint at PHS. RP stated that a vehicle was speeding and doing donuts in the parking lot. Officers contacted the driver who denied driving recklessly. He was collected by a parent.

July 25 (24 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an alarm at Housel Middle School. Building was secure.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1500 block of Sheridan. RP stated that she found 5 husky puppies in her yard and did not know how they had come to be there. RP stated they appear very happy, but was concerned about them getting in traffic as RP had to go to work. Officer checked the area and was unable to locate the dogs. After a call to the RP, officer was advised that a public works employee had picked up the puppies. Later, the puppies were collected by the CSO.
- Officer responded to an information report concerning animals. RP stated that two brown fluffy dogs had attacked her parked car, scratched it, and had damaged the axel and transmission lines. RP stated that she does not know who the dogs belong to but believes they are new to the neighborhood. RP has the attack on video. Officer gave RP a link to upload her video and will pass information on to the CSO.
- Officers towed an abandoned vehicle from the 1600 block of Sherman Ave.
- BCSO Officers assist with a 2-vehicle accident with injuries on W. Johnson Rd. DUI is suspected.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that two suspicious males were hanging around a parked BMW. Officers did not locate the BMW at the market and the employees at the market were unaware of the call. RP was called and stated that she had noticed the suspicious individuals when driving by and called it in.
- Officers responded to a non-injury assault report at the 100 block of North Wamba Road. RP stated that a male had assaulted a female at the facility. No injuries were reported and the male left the facility prior to officer arrival. Officers assisted with detaining the male.
- Officers responded to a threats complaint at the 1100 block of Spokane Avenue. RP stated that they are the owner of the home and are renting it to someone who they are concerned about. RP stated that the renter is threatening neighbors. RP was advised on steps to take.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 2000 block of Benson Avenue. RP stated that a husky type dog is continually coming into their yard and is sometimes aggressive (though not currently). Officer advised RP to call if the dog becomes aggressive and information was given to CSO.

- Officers responded to a weapons complaint at the 800 block of Byron Road. RP stated they found what appears to be bullet holes in the building. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to an information report at the 2000 block of Miller Court. RP stated that personal laptop had been previously stolen and the tracking on the location was 'pinging' at this location. Homeowners allowed the officers to check for the laptop but it was not found at the residence.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 200 block of Gap Road. RP stated that someone left a vehicle in the parking lot. Vehicle was gone when officers arrived.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that customers were upset about their reservation being cancelled and were being verbally aggressive. RP wanted them moved along off of the property. The individuals moved along.

July 26 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 800 block of Court Street. RP stated that they had noticed that someone's vehicle dome light was on. Officers checked vehicle and nothing appeared to be disturbed.
- Officers responded to a report of property found at the end of Wine Country Road. RP stated that she was taking photos and noticed a baby stroller at the location. Officers noted that it had been there for a few days and had been confirmed unoccupied.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the OIE and Grant Avenue. RP stated that approximately 10 cows were in the roadway. Officers assisted with wrangling cattle.
- Officers responded to a loitering complaint at the 300 block of Canyon Drive. RP stated that ex son-in-law was sleeping in a rolled up carpet in her front yard. RP wanted him moved along and to be trespassed from the location. Officer gave male a ride to another location.
- Officers responded to a complaint of a parking violation at 102 Merlot Drive. RP stated that they consistently have vehicles that park in no-parking areas. Officer advised RP to consider better signage. Officer also spoke with the driver of the vehicle that was parking in the no-parking area who stated he will not park there in the future.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 300 block of Chardonnay Avenue. RP stated that a kitten had climbed into a vehicle engine area. RP and officers were able to rescue the kitten. Officers declined taking possession of wee kitten.
- Officers responded to a report of property found at EJ Miller Park. RP stated that a bicycle was left at the property. The bike was recovered by the owner prior to officer arrival.
- Officers responded to a domestic-no assault report at the 900 block of Parkside Drive. RP stated their son was angry and being aggressive, upending a table. Male was detained.
- Officers responded to a civil issue at the 1100 block of Spokane Avenue. RP needed to know what can be done about a male living at the location who seems unstable.
- Officer responded to a concern at the 1400 block of Riverside Drive. RP stated that she received a letter requesting information from an attorney. Officers gave advice to RP.
- Officer responded to a complaint at the 900 block of Myrtle Street. RP stated that a male is going around knocking on families doors (unwelcomed). RP stated that he is not being aggressive or threatening but it was unwelcome. Officer gave the male a courtesy ride to requested location.
- Officers responded to a two semi traffic non-injury accident at Loves. Parties exchanged information.

July 27 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at the 600 block of Court Street. RP stated they heard a female screaming and crying, but was unable to see her. Officer contacted the female. She declined needing help. No crime.

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a female in a VW was moving and bobbing around in her vehicle. Officers contacted occupant of the VW who stated all was well, as she was just listening to music and bobbing her head.
- BCSO/WSP officer assist for a traffic accident on I82 MP78.
