ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF AUGUST 14, 2020 TO AUGUST 20, 2020

AUGUST 14 (19 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance in the 1100 block of Court Street. Reporting Party (RP) could hear yelling coming from a nearby residence. Officers contacted a male and female who were intoxicated and belligerent and they refused to provide any information. Officers did not observe any signs of a physical disturbance and they went on their way.
- Felony threats complaint received in the 1100 block of Court Street. RP advised an ex-boyfriend had threatened her over the phone. Case forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office for review.
- Animal complaint received at the Prosser City Park. RP stated there were people with two dogs that were not on a leash and that one had attacked their dog. Officer made contact with an individual who had a dog in his vehicle. He advised his dog did not attack the RP's dog and that it was only playing. Male was advised that the park was closed and he needed to leave.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a disturbance on Missimer Road.

AUGUST 15 (24 calls for service)

- Noise complaint received in the 1000 block of Margaret Street. Report of loud music, yelling, and use of a chainsaw. Officers made contact at a residence and a male advised they were trying to keep the noise down, and had only started the chainsaw to cut wood to keep their bonfire going. Male agreed to keep the noise down.
- Officers assisted BCSO with an attempted burglary arrest in the area of North River Road and Moore Road.
- Theft of a kitten reported in the 1000 block of Sherman Ave. RP believed a juvenile in her neighborhood had taken her kitten. Officer made contact with the juvenile who said he had found the kitten and had let it go in his back yard. Officer located and retrieved the kitten, which was returned to the RP. RP did not wish to press charges and the juvenile was spoken to about taking property that did not belong to him.
- Animal complaint received in the 1000 block of Campbell Drive. RP reported her neighbor's dog had killed her cat during the night. Information was forwarded to the Community Service Officer for follow up.
- Shoplifting complaint received at Food Depot. RP stated an elderly male comes in daily and refuses to wear a mask and that on this day the male reportedly left without paying for an item of food. Officers have contacted the male on previous occasions and he is believed to have dementia. Officer made contact with the male's daughter who advised she would take care of the situation.
- Loitering complaint received at Prosser RV Park. RP advised of a male hanging out in a vehicle at the location. Officer made contact with a male who stated he was looking for his parents who had been evicted earlier in the day. The RP requested the male be trespassed from the location. Male and his companion were told to not come back to the property.
- Verbal disturbance reported at Cottage Court Market. Store Manager advised she refused to sell alcohol to a customer due to his level of intoxication and he caused a disturbance in response. Manager requested the male and his family leave and not come back for the evening.
- Report of a suspicious vehicle at the Catholic Church. Officer made contact with a male and female who were praying the Rosary in their vehicle due to not being able to enter the building because of COVID-19 restrictions.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a disturbance on Johnson Road.

AUGUST 16 (20 calls for service)

- Reckless traffic complaint received in the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP believed the driver was under the influence. Officer located the vehicle coming in on CR-12 and did not observe any signs of reckless driving.
- Suspicious vehicle reported at Armstrong Automotive. Report of a vehicle parked at the business all weekend with a flat tire and someone inside of it. Officer made contact with a male in the vehicle who said he was taking the vehicle to get the tire fixed in the morning. RP was contacted and advised the vehicle could stay at the location until the morning.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a disturbance on CR-12.

Traffic stop in the area of N Gap Road and Wine Country Road. Driver was found to have a suspended license and was cited and released for DWLS 3rd Degree.

- Report of a reckless driver received near McDonalds. RP thought the driver may be under the influence. Officer located and followed the vehicle on I-82 from exit 80 to 78, but did not observe reckless driving. Call was transferred to WSP.

AUGUST 17 (17 calls for service)

- Possible attempted burglary reported in the area of 5th Street and Bennett Ave. RP located what they thought might be tool marks on their door. Request for extra patrols in the area was made.
- Suspicious person reported in the alleyway between Sheridan Ave and Wine Country Road. RP believed the male was huffing and had a can of spray paint. Officer made contact with the male who only had a water bottle and an energy drink. No other issues were found.
- Disturbance reported at the Mini Mart on 7th Street and Wine Country Road. Officers determined it to be a verbal only argument between two males.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP stated his neighbor was acting erratically and had thrown a TV in the road, almost hit the RP with his car, and had been in the road yelling. Responding Officer contacted the male who was in his front yard putting his shirt back on. The male began talking about Nazi's and saying that he knocked one out. Other units arrived and the male panicked and ran inside, asking for his girlfriend. The girlfriend came outside and stated the TV had been put there earlier in the morning and that the male had not been driving. No crimes were found to have been committed.

AUGUST 18 (23 calls for service)

- Suspicious activity call in the 1200 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised they heard three screams from a female possibly coming from the bridge. Area checked, but nothing was seen or heard.
- Suspicious person reported in the 1300 block of Sheridan Ave. Report of a male in his 30's walking around the property. Area checked, but male was not located.
- Suspicious activity reported in the 600 block of New Gate Drive. RP's 18-year-old son came home with the RP's vehicle and it was damaged. RP thought their son may have been under the influence and involved in an accident. Officer made contact with the male who stated he was not under the influence, but had fallen asleep and ran off the road causing minor damage to the vehicle. Male was informed he may be contacted again if it was found he was involved in an accident.
- Suspicious vehicle reported in the intersection of Highland Drive and East Gate Drive. Report of a vehicle parked at the stop sign that was going back and forth in and out of the intersection. Officer responded to the area, but the vehicle was already gone.
- Suspicious vehicle reported above was called in again in the 600 block of Frontier Road. Officer made contact with the male driver who stated he was trying to locate a female friend who was on Higdon Road. Male left the area after contact.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 1100 block of Spokane Ave. RP stated an elderly male was at her residence and seemed confused. Medics were dispatched and transported the male to PMH.

AUGUST 19 (21 calls for service)

- Counterfeit report received at McDonald's. Vehicle in the drive thru tried to pay with a fake \$50. Male was contacted, but advised he did not know the bill was fake.
- Fraud report, RP saw a Facebook post showing someone trying to sell their EBT card. RP was given the phone number for the Washington Welfare Fraud Abuse Center.
- Hit and run report received in the 900 block of Ellen Ave. RP said within the past 24 hours someone had swiped the side of his car and hit his mirror causing damage. Photos were taken and RP was advised to inform his insurance company.
- Shoplifting report received at Food Depot. RP stated a male wearing a grey hoodie, black pants, and a bandana over his face had stolen a bottle of alcohol, taking off running down the alleyway.
- Loud music complaint in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. Report of a vehicle "thumpin and a bumpin". Officer checked the area, found that the music wasn't excessively loud, however the bass did make it seem louder. Female was contacted and advised to be mindful of the noise and bass level. She stated she would keep it down, no further issues were reported.

AUGUST 20 (28 calls for service)

- Suspicious vehicle reported in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised of a male and female sleeping in a vehicle in the parking lot. Officer made contact with the male and female who said they were waiting on a friend who lived at the location. They were advised that the RP wanted them to leave the property.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a stolen vehicle report.
- Report of an aggressive dog received in the area of Market Street and Yakima Ave. Officer located the dog as it was rushing and nipping at people walking in the area. The owner was located and was able to get control of the dog. The owner advised she would be surrendering the dog to the pound and it would not be a problem anymore.
- Officers were dispatched to the Best Time Food Mart for a theft that had just occurred. RP advised the suspect was a male wearing a black shirt and that he had stolen beer along with some food items. Officer located a male in the area carrying a full garbage bag. The male was ordered to stop, but he dropped his bag and took off running through yards and jumping over multiple fences. Officers checked area residences and sheds, but were not able to locate the male. The bag that had been dropped was collected and the stolen items were returned to the RP.
- Two vehicle non-injury accident report taken at Loves.
- WSP assist for possible DUI on I-82 that took exit 82 into Prosser. Officer Located the vehicle at Cottage Market and determined the driver was not under the influence, but had been driving for 12 hours and decided to stop so they could switch drivers.
