## ACTIVITY LOG

### Week of August 18 to August 24, 2023

#### August 18 (59 Calls for Service)

- Officer assist with a report of suspicious activity on Merlot Drive. RP stated that there were persons outside the business just sitting and it was making the RP uncomfortable. Persons were uniformed and in a marked truck, waiting for after hours to complete a scheduled installation. RP was unaware of the scheduled work. Uniformed persons decided to leave and attempt a return on another day.
- Officer responded to an information report at the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that her ex is stalking her and won't leave her alone. RP left the area prior to officer arrival and so did the ex. Officers were unable to locate the male.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1000 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that there are males in the area that appear to be on narcotics, one of which appeared to be passed out (but breathing). Officers found four males in the area in a silver mustang. One of the males claimed to be very tired but not in need of medics. All were advised to move along.
- Officers responded to a request for an assist at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a male needs a courtesy ride as he is just sitting in the parking lot. A kind person gave the male a ride prior to officer arrival.
- Court officer assist with serving papers at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road.
- Officer responded to a business alarm at the 200 block of Chardonnay Avenue. Building was found to be secure with no sign of forced entry.
- Officers responded to a report of assault at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that he was an impounder trying to impound a semi-trailer and the driver of the truck it was attached to became physical with him. RP did not want to press charges but the manager at the local business requested the aggressor be trespassed. Both parties shook hands and the driver apologized.
- Officer responded to a business alarm on Merlot Drive. Officers checked doors and windows and found the building to be secure.
- BCSO officer assist with a non-injury traffic accident at Wine Country Road and I 82. RP stated that a white Dodge PU had driven off of the road.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at N. Old Inland Empire and Van Buren Road. RP stated that a very young looking, unattended male was sitting on the curb and RP wanted to make sure he was ok. Male was given a courtesy transport to the bus stop.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

#### August 19 (44 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with an audible alarm on King Tull Road. Officers began checking the areas while the manager was en route. No problems found by the officers.
- Officers responded to a noise violation report at the 300 block of Casi Court. RP stated that the music is being played too loudly and is getting louder. Officers noted that a large party was taking place at the location. The homeowner was advised to turn the music down, to which he complied.

- BCSO officer assist for a disturbance report at W. Apricot and W. CR 12. RP was in a verbal disagreement with grandmother. RP disconnected and would not answer the phone. Officers checked the area but could not locate the RP.
- Officer responded to an information report at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a parked car was hit by another vehicle, a pickup. The car suffered no damage but the RP thinks the other driver may have been drinking. Neither party was on site upon officer arrival.
- Officers responded to a noise violation complaint at the 1500 block of Grant Ave. RP stated that loud music was being played at the location. Officer found a resident blasting his car subwoofers. As it was not yet 10 pm, no violation was found. Officers reminded the resident of the Prosser Municipal Codes, to which the resident was very cooperative.
- Officers responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that the vehicle had been at the location for several weeks. Officers contacted the person staying in the car, who advised they were ok. Vehicle occupant advised that he will be moving the vehicle shortly.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 1100 block of Wine Country Road. Uninvolved RP stated that there is a male at the location that is harassing people and throwing beer bottles. Both parties at the location stated that they were driving down WCR, passing each other while driving. One male passed the other vehicle, flashing an obscene gesture because the other vehicle's driver was driving too slowly. He then threw a drink can at the vehicle. The male in the second vehicle pulled over and confronted the can throwing driver. This appears to be a case of road rage with no crime.
- EMS officer assist at the 1800 block of Benson Ave. RP stated that a male at the location leaned back too far in his chair, fell, and was bleeding from the head. EMS arrived and assisted the male.
- Officer responded to a male riding a quad vehicle at the 900 block of Florence Street. Male was contacted and advised of the legalities of riding a quad on the city streets.
- Officers responded to a report of a runaway at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Budd Ave. RP stated that while at the location working, a male was yelling and threatening the workers. Male is a resident in the area. RP did not want to press charges, but wanted to share the information.
- Officers responded to a complaint at the Farmers Market. RP stated that he rides his electric bike in the area of the farmers market every week and an individual there complains to him and tells him that he cannot ride it at the farmers market. Officer spoke with the RP who agreed that he would walk it through the market from now on.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

## **August 20** (35 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1900 block of Elwood Avenue. RP stated that there is an injured squirrel in the road and an elderly neighbor was spending all day outside with it. RP was concerned for the squirrel and also the neighbor, and was hoping for the removal of the squirrel. Officers spoke with the RP and the neighbor and advised on actions to take.
- Officer responded to a suspicious circumstance report at the 1300 block of Sommers Avenue (Prosser City Park). RP stated that there is a male subject going in and out of the restroom, acting suspicious. RP believes male is under the influence of narcotics. Officers made contact with a male and female at the location in the bathrooms. Subjects left with no incident.
- GVPD Officer assist with a male arrested in Benton County on a warrant. Male was transported to jail.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the Prosser rest area. RP stated that a white husky was tied to a sign outside and no one was close to the animal or paying attention to it. Officers

spoke with the animal owner, who stated he tied him up only temporarily while he was using the restroom.

- BCSO officer assist with a possible disturbance at Petra Avenue/North River Road. One party located their stolen vehicle and the second party was a male that they suspected had stolen it. BCSO arrived and arrested the male.
- Officers performed a welfare check for a primarily silent 911 call. Officers checked the residence where the call originated from, where the residence stated it was an accidental pocket dial.
- Officers responded to a report of a missing wallet at the 1000 block of Gum Street.
- BCSO officer assist with a warrant service. A male was arrested on two outside agency warrants.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that there is a lot of activity coming in and out of their residence and she is concerned about narcotics use. RP states that the activity is taking place in a trailer on her property that her daughter brought to the property. No activity was seen by the officer.
- BCSO officer assist with an animal complaint on N. Missimer Road. RP stated that there is a large steer in the road walking towards Johnson Rd.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

## **August 21** (34 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an alarm at the 2000 block of Wine Country Road. Officer found the building to be secure.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 900 block of 7<sup>th</sup> Street. RP stated that two males were arguing, one hiding inside the bathroom and one outside of the bathroom. RP was worried the argument may turn into something more. Both parties separated and went in different directions.
- Officer responded to a request for information on the Crime Free Housing Program.
- EMS officer assist for a 12 year old female who had slipped into the canal on the north side of the Grant Street Bridge. Officer was able to pull female from the fast moving water to safety where she was assessed by the EMS team.
- Officer responded to a civil issue at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. RP requested information on child visitation rules. Officer advised accordingly.
- Officers responded to a traffic hazard at 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Bennett Avenue. A pickup truck hauling a loaded horse trailer broke down in the intersection. Driver was able to get vehicle off of the roadway and found a tow truck to get his vehicle and trailer to their destination.
- Officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that there is a tow truck parked in front of the home and RP is concerned that the driver of the tow truck may start walking around his property. Tow truck belongs to neighbor's dad. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances. RP stated that the locks on her front door appear to have been tampered with but may be due to her key getting damaged. RP noted that she has footage of a male walking around the front of her residence but only outside of the fenced yard. No video footage of anyone attempting entry.
- Officer responded to a report of a vehicle prowler at the 1200 block of Kinney. RP stated that her window was broken and her purse was taken from the car. The card was used in multiple places between Prosser and Toppenish. Officer requested footage from Love's. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there is a male who appears to be transient who is messing with the security cameras across from Loves at the rest area. Officer contacted DOT and the RP. Male was not at location upon officer arrival. Suspicious behavior only at this point. No crime.
- BCSO officer assist at W North River Road and S Webb Road for a suspicious individual.

## **August 22** (36 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at the 900 block of Anna Street. RP was worried about her mother who was living at the location with her boyfriend. Officers contacted the mother who stated that she is fine and there is no issues.
- Officer responded to a report of a parking violation at the 300 block of Casi Court. RP stated that there is a vehicle blocking her driveway and that it is an ongoing issue. Officer contacted the owner of the vehicle and had them move their vehicle. He also advised them to not block the neighbor's driveway.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 1200 block of Mustang Court. RP stated that a male came to the door and stated that he worked for a security company. Male did not have a card or paperwork. Officer was unable to locate the male.
- Officer returned at large dogs (from Facebook posting) to the rightful owner.
- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1400 block of Sunset Drive. RP stated that there is a male in a gray Ford Escape who appears to be slumped over in the vehicle. Officers checked on the male, who was working on his iPad.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving on the I82. RP stated that a female was swerving and RP noticed the female holding drug paraphernalia while driving. Officers were unable to locate the female.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the 400 block of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. RP stated that the wind is blowing an open gate into the roadway. Responsible owner of the gate shut the gate.
- Officers responded to a report of Destruction of Property at Wine Country Road and Stacy Avenue (Railroad Bridge). Officer documented and covered up graffiti found at the location.
- Officers responded to a traffic complaint at Highland Drive/Memorial Street. RP stated that there was a traffic hazard due to two skateboarders in the area. Officers checked the surrounding area but were unable to locate the skateboarders.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

## **August 23** (47 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a burglary suspect detainment in Grandview.
- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that she was at location trying to check on her husband (who was inside of his semi-truck). He was not responding to her phone calls and he had stated he wasn't feeling well. Eventually, he answered her call.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1300 block of Sommers Avenue. RP stated that there is a black poodle type dog in the park that appears to be blind. Officer forwarded information to the CSO.
- EMS officer assist for a medical issue at the 400 block of Petra.
- Officers responded to a civil question at the 1000 block of Colena. RP asked what could be done about all of the soliciting in the area as it appears to be an ongoing issue. Officer advised that the business license of the individual soliciting can be checked for legitimacy, but that solicitors are allowed to do door-to-door sales between 8 am and 8 pm.
- Officers responded to a report of a non-injury, non-reportable traffic accident at the 300 block of Chardonnay Avenue. Both parties exchanged information.

- Officers assisted with the recovery of a package sent to the wrong address at the 1400 block of Prosser Avenue. Officers were able to get the package to the right person.
- Officer responded to a report of a phone nuisance/scam on Merlot Drive. RP stated that she was receiving calls from a juvenile in Prosser telling her to perform lewd acts. RP also stated that this has been an issue for several months. Officer was unable to locate the juvenile based on the phone number and the RP was advised to block the phone number (which she did).
- Officer responded to a request for civil assistance near the airport. RP was advised that the situation is a civil issue and in Benton County jurisdiction.
- BCSO officer assist with a house alarm on the 6000 block of S. Steele Road. Officers checked the house and there was no sign of forced entry.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that someone was knocking on the door and perhaps had tried to open the door. Officer discovered an attempted delivery notice on the door and upon checking the video, discovered that it was a delivery driver trying to drop off a package.
- Officer responded to three dogs at large on W. Richards Road. Officer was able to contact the owner and return the dogs to their home.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

## **August 24** (43 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a report of a noise violation at the 300 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that there is loud music coming from south of the RV park. The noise was from a concert nearby. No violation.
- Officer responded to a non-injury, non-reportable traffic accident at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Both parties exchanged information.
- Officer responded to a report of a parking violation. RP stated that a white Toyota Camry was parked at a stop sign blocking traffic. Vehicle was not found by officer.
- BCSO officer assist with an arrest warrant on Miller Court.
- Officer responded to a civil complaint at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that she wants a male removed from her property, and that her daughter not be allowed to use the RP's electricity to power their RV. Officer advised RP that this is a civil matter and that she will need to seek an eviction order to manage her situation.
- Officer responded to a civil complaint at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that they had provided services to a semi-truck and the semi driver had not paid for the services. The owner of the trucking company stated that the RP had overcharged him and would not pay. Officer advised the RP that this is a civil matter and the RP stated he will go through the owner to get payment.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at N. Gap Road and W. King Tull Road. RP stated that someone had dropped off a husky puppy at the location and she was unable to care for it. Incident was outside Prosser City limits and was transferred to BCSO.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Nunn Road and Hagarty Lane. A husky was at large. Officer reunited the dog and its owner.
- Officer responded to a report of a theft at the 900 block of Lillian Street. RP stated that his plate compactor was missing, having been stolen sometime late the previous evening or early on this day. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.
