ACTIVITY LOG

Week of August 25 to August 31, 2023

August 25 (37 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstance at the 1200 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated that she entered the store with lights on and open sign on as well. RP stated that there were no workers inside and that the alarm started going off. Officer contacted the current owner.
- Officer responded to a civil complaint at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that she has a male and female couple (one of which is her child) living in a trailer on her residence without permission. This is an ongoing problem and the RP was advised again that she will need to serve the couple with an eviction notice.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 100 block of Wamba Road. RP stated requested that his grandmother be checked on as he had not heard from her in several days and no one at the location was answering phone calls. Officer notified the relative living at the location.
- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at 6h Street and Dudley Avenue. RP stated that she heard a child's voice screaming and saying "no" somewhere near the location. Officer found that it was children playing at the location. No problems.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 3000 block of Wittkopf Loop Rd. Building was secure.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

August 26 (42 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a domestic assault at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a male and female were having an argument in front of the establishment. Officers discovered the male and female to be parent and child, both of whom appeared to have been drinking. The son was trying to keep the parent from doing something rash after she had had an argument with her friend. Neither claimed physical harm. No crime.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 300 block of 4th Street. RP had found two brand new kittens in the dirt at the location. Officer advised her to contact a pet rescue organization.
- Officers performed patrols at the Beer and Whisky Festival.
- Officers responded to a disturbance at the 19000 block of N Griffin Road. RP stated that a man and woman were arguing at the location and that the man was pulling aggressively on the woman. RP drove past twice and the vehicle and couple were still there arguing. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle upon arrival.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1300 block of Sheridan Avenue. RP stated that there is a male at Benton REA that appears unconscious. Officers contacted the male and he advised that he has no issues and is just napping while waiting for the bus.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a transient female is digging in the dumpster and it is making customers uncomfortable. RP says this is an ongoing problem and the RP does not want to approach the female. Officers contacted the female and let her know that the RP does not want her in area.
- During a traffic stop at the Prosser Rest Area, a passenger in the vehicle was found to have an extraditable warrant out of Idaho. Male was taken into custody and transported to BCSO jail.

- Officers responded to a report of a burglary at the 1200 block of Bennett Avenue. RP stated that the location had been broken into overnight. There are videos of a female stealing cartons of cigarettes, a box of lighters and some quarters. Video footage will be provided to PPD. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

August 27 (43 Calls for Service)

- Officers performed patrols at the Beer and Whisky Festival.
- BCSO Officer assist for a minor injury traffic accident on I82 in the construction area.
- Officers responded to a report of child abuse on Prosser Avenue. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a civil report at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that she wants her daughter and her daughter's boyfriend off of her property. She was told that she needs to file eviction papers on them.
- Officers responded to a report of a domestic with no assault on the 900 block of Florence Street. RP stated that they were hearing cursing and yelling at the location. This was a verbal between juvenile siblings and their mom. No crime took place.
- BCSO officer assist at Rainbow Court Cabins for a welfare check. RP stated that there is a female at the location that appears to be having issues.
- Officers responded to a death investigation at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. A trucker had passed away in his vehicle. No signs of foul play.
- BCSO office assist at the 800 block of Higdon Road. Female arrived at the location and was not welcome. RP advised that it is his mother and she is acting strange after 5 days of no sleep (she has a history of narcotics use). Female eventually left.
- BCSO office assist with a warrant service at the 800 block of Higdon Road. Subject no longer lived at the location.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

August 28 (45 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a request for a welfare check on Yakitat Road and W. Gibbon Road. RP stated that there was what looked like a family walking along the highway (at 3:13 am). Officers contacted the subjects who were walking. They had been getting a ride home from the Tri-Cities to Sunnyside. The male who was giving them a ride decided that he no longer wanted to take them home and kicked them out of the vehicle. BCSO gave them a transport home.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there is a female looking around the location, yelling but no one else is around. Officers patrolled the area but were unable to locate the female.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP state that at some point over the weekend there was a theft of air filters, covers, and fuel. Investigation ongoing.
- BCSO officers assist with a report of domestic violence on N. Bunn Road. RP stated that her sister was physically assaulting their mother. BCSO took over.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that her adult daughter was not supposed to be drinking but appears to have been drinking. Officers spoke with RP and daughter. Daughter was not causing a disturbance and started walking home.

- Officers responded to a report of malicious mischief at the 1000 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that someone has been messing around with items on her property. No report was taken but officers took the information.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 1300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that their package was delivered to the wrong address and that he had video of it being left at a different address. RP asked the residents at the address where it was left and they denied having it. After the officers arrived and saw the video, they went to the house where package was delivered and they admitted to having it. The package was returned to its rightful owner who did not press charges.
- Officers responded to a weapons report at W. North River Rd. RP stated that a male had come in with a .22 caliber gun-shot wound to his foot. The male admitted that he had accidentally shot himself in the foot while trying to shoot something in his yard. This resulted in a minor injury. No crime.
- Officer responded to an off-road vehicle complaint at the 1100 block of Colena Street. RP stated that there are a few juveniles who are riding a go cart around the area, tearing up the grass in the park. RP stated that they are not currently riding but that they were and she knows where the juveniles live. Officer contacted the home of the juveniles and advised the parent that the go cart is not legal to drive on the road as it is not licensed for that.
- Officer responded to a noise violation complaint at the 1300 block of Grant Avenue. RP stated that a male is walking around the neighborhood with a boom box playing very loudly (at 11:30 pm). Officers were able to contact the male who agreed to keep it down.
- Officers performed multiple traffic stops.
- Officers performed follow up activities for multiple on-going cases.

- Officers responded to a residential alarm on the 300 block of Old Inland Empire Highway. Officers met with a neighbor of the resident who was responding to a medical issue with the resident and put the code in incorrectly. No crime.
- Officer responded to a business alarm at the 2000 block of Wine Country Road. All was secure as it was an accidental alarm set off by an employee.
- BCSO officers assist with traffic accident on W. OIE Hwy and S Steele Road. RP stated that a Ford F150 had gone off the road. No obvious injuries.

RP stated that there is a male hiding near the bridge with a baseball bat and that he started to follow the RP and her friend who were walking. - Officers responded to a medical call at the 1300 block of Semillon Place. A male was transported to PMH.
- Officers responded to a weapons report at the 800 block of Higdon Road. RP stated that his brother was on narcotics and was arguing with the RP while holding an axe. The situation was defused and the brother walked away. No one was willing to file a report.
