## ACTIVITY LOG

### Week of September 1 to September 7, 2023

#### September 1 (55 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a non-assault domestic disturbance at the 1000 block of Hemlock Street. RP stated that her boyfriend had been drinking and had stolen her phone. The boyfriend had left before officer arrival. No weapons were seen and no assault had taken place. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to a 911 hang up call. The number was traced back to the 100 block of Wamba Road. Staff knew nothing of the call. Officer checked around the area and found no issues. The call appeared to have originated from a fax number. No crime.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic accident on OIE. Upon arrival, officers discovered that the vehicle had not been in an accident but had merely broke down. No injury, no accident.
- BCSO Officer assist with a report of domestic violence with assault on S. Missimer Road. One male was detained.
- Officer responded to a report of theft at the 600 block of 8<sup>th</sup> Street (Spin Cycle Laundromat). RP stated that she had placed her wallet on a washing machine at the laundromat and then discovered it was missing. After observing the camera footage, it was found that the RP had dropped her wallet and a couple in a Black Chevrolet had picked up the wallet and took it to their vehicle. Officer is looking for the individuals on the video for theft. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 600 block of New Gate Dr. RP stated that their neighbor has a rooster on the property and wondered if that was legal. RP was told that it is NOT legal to have a rooster within the city limits. Information will be passed on to the CSO.
- Officers performed patrols for the HS football game. GO MUSTANGS!
- Officer responded to a report of a parking violation at the 1000 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that there is a silver Honda Odyssey parking at the location constantly and that the RP believes that someone is living in it.
- Officers responded to a phone report of child custody issues (civil). RP was found to be in Kennewick so the call was split to KPD.
- Officer responded to a report of found property at the 500 block of Wine Country Rd. RP stated that she found a purse in the roadway. Property is a PPD at this time.
- Officers responded to an informational report at the 100 block of Merlot Dr. RP stated that there are a large number of juveniles in the parking lot at the location and RP is concerned that a fight may abrupt (as many had phones out). No crime at this time.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

#### September 2 (42 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to seeing a male at the rest area who was acting suspicious, attempting to access a vehicle with a coat hanger. Additionally, the trunk of the vehicle was open and the contents had been pulled out. The male explained that it is his girlfriend's vehicle (she was in the restroom). Everything checked out. No crime.
- Officers detained an individual during a traffic stop due to a warrant. Individual was transported to BC jail.

- Officers found a business door open during regular patrol at the 2000 block of Miller Avenue (Prosser Heights Elementary). Responsible party was contacted and the building was found to be secure.
- Officers responded to a possible traffic accident at the 500 block of Bennett Avenue. A call came in with screaming in the background prior to a hang up. The originating location was found and the officer found it to be a family barbecue. Accidental call. No accident. No crime.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the Prosser Rest area. RP stated that there is a male climbing in and out of his truck, yelling/screaming non-stop, acting like he is on narcotics. RP is concerned that he may drive. Officers contacted the male, who refused medical assistance, but promised that he would keep his voice down.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving at W. Old Inland Empire Hwy/S. Missimer Rd. RP stated that a dark green Chevy Blazer was driving erratically, slowing down and speeding up, driving down the middle lane, and swerving. Unable to locate.
- Officer responded to a call for information at the Barn Restaurant. RP stated that people there had punched him in the face and that he thought one of them had a weapon. Upon arrival, the officer noted that the restaurant was not even open, and that the RP kept changing his story about what had happened and where the 'people' had gone. No persons were located. No crime.
- RPD officer assist at the 1000 block of Prosser Avenue. Officers were requested to contact individuals concerning family members in an ongoing case in RPD jurisdiction.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## **September 3** (35 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a noise violation at the 300 block of Casi Court. RP stated that loud music had been playing for several nights (12:30 am). Officer walked the neighborhood and did not hear unreasonable noise, but did find that there was a loud party nearby. He asked the party goers to turn the music down which they did.
- EMS Officer assist at the 1900 block of Mountain View Dr.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 100 block of Merlot Dr. RP stated that his ex-wife's boyfriend had threatened to harm him during child custody exchange. Officer monitored the exchange and the boyfriend was not present.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## **September 4** (38 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a noise violation at the 300 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that there has been a loud machine running for the past hour (12:14 am). Officers discovered a roto-rotoer running on the east side of the property. Officer contacted the plumbers who were working with a loader and the roto-rotoer truck and asked that they turn off the heavy equipment for the night. Workers advised that they are attempting to repair the water to the entire RV park.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Officers found the building to be secure.
- Officers noted an unsecure semi-truck during regular patrolling at the 500 block of Wine Country Road. Officer noted that a commercial semi-truck was parked with its door open and no occupant. The officer contacted the responsible party who checked the vehicle and found nothing missing or awry.

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 500 block of Cascade Court. RP stated there was a female outside yelling and that she had also heard a male subject. The male was making a strange noise and the RP is concerned. Officers contacted the male and female, who claimed that the male was giving CPR to the female after she fainted and that as she was coming to, she had inadvertently scratched the male while flailing her arms. Both refused medical assistance. No crime.
- Officers responded to a request for a next of kin contact from an out of state physician. Officers were not able to locate the next of kin as they had moved over a year ago.
- Officers responded to a disturbance at the Grant Street Bridge. RP stated that a male and female were arguing in a tent at the location and the female kept telling the male to let her go. Officers contacted the tent occupants who stated that they were only having a verbal disagreement. Both agreed to chill for the remainder of the day.
- BCSO officer assist with a DV suspect detainment on W King Tull Rd/N. Wilgus Rd. Subject was detained.
- Officers conducted patrol/took part in the State's Day Parade.
- Officer responded to a report of a vehicle prowler at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that her vehicle window had been smashed at some point between 0700 and 1200. RP was unsure if anything had been stolen but will contact the officer once they are able to check thoroughly.
- BCSO officer assist with a contact at the Barn Restaurant.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstance at 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Stacy Avenue. A female flagged down an officer and was concerned about an individual waiting at the bus station who was wearing a YCDOC inmate jumpsuit. Officers contacted the male who advised that he was released but that his clothing was ripped so the YCDOC allowed him to keep his jumpsuit. A family member was going to come and pick him up and he was advised to reverse his shirt to mitigate additional calls.
- Officers responded to a report of narcotics at the 800 block of 6<sup>th</sup> Street. RP stated that they had found a bag of 'white powder' at the location and was concerned that it was narcotics. The powder was found to be cake mix or other similar baking-related item.
- Officers responded to a male flagging them down at the Prosser Rest Area. RP stated that there is possibly an unresponsive male in the rest room. Officer checked the bathrooms and found one male only and he was walking around.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that the lights are off at the location and no one is inside, but that the door was unlocked. Officers contacted the owner who came and secured the building.
- BCSO officer assist in the area of OIE and Johnson, for a vehicle that had failed to stop. The subject was found at a residence and due to a felony warrant, was arrested and taken to BC jail.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised that she sent her children in to the store with her card and the card had been run, but the employee stated that it had not gone through and wanted to run it again. The RP stated it had already been charged. The employee would not give the items to the RP (children). The officer advised talking to the store manager the following day. No crime at this time.
- Officers responded to a report of a vehicle prowler at the 300 block of Chardonnay Ave. RP stated that her car was illegally accessed and approximately \$90 worth of items were taken. Camera footage was obtained of the individual who entered the vehicle. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of domestic violence at the 1400 block of Paterson Rd. RP stated that her two brothers were fighting. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of possible sexual abuse at the 700 block of Memorial Street. It was found that sexual abuse DID NOT take place. No crime.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.

## September 5 (31 Calls for Service)

- EMS officer assist at the 1800 block of Benson Avenue. RP stated that a female was going to be transported to PMH and they were not sure if she would be compliant. RP stated that she was being aggressive earlier so they were concerned. Subject was transported with no issues.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 1200 block of Meade Avenue. No issues were found. Employees were on site.
- Officers responded to a recovered stolen vehicle in the Yakima River near Crawford Park. A stolen car was found in the river, searched to find no occupants, and extracted from the river.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Crawford Park. Two husky type dogs were found and taken to Prosser Animal Hospital. No collars, no chips, no tags.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 100 block of Columbia Dr. RP wanted to have a camp trailer removed (towed) from her property. RP stated that her daughter and her daughter's boyfriend live in it and she does not want them on the property. She was advised that she can call a tow company on her own. She was advised to go through the court system to handle this civil issue.
- Court officer assist with serving a subpoena.
- BCSO officer assist with a non-injury traffic accident at W. King Tull/N. Griffin Road.
- Officers responded to a civil issue at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. RP stated that her daughter's boyfriend had dented her vehicle. Boyfriend admitted to accidentally hitting the vehicle with his scooter because the RP had distracted him. RP stated that she wanted her daughter and her daughter's boyfriend off of her property. Once again she was advised that this is a civil issue and she will need to go through the court system to get the two evicted from her property.
- BCSO officer assist with a disturbance at the 100 block of Abby Ave. One neighbor was beating on another's door and the occupant was scared. The male had retreated to his own lodging before officer arrival. BCSO case.
- BCSO officer assist with an assault at 1083 PR NW. RP stated that a male had just assaulted her brother and her boyfriend. There were multiple parties aggressive with one another. BCSO case.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## September 6 (47 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a traffic hazard at Wine Country Rd/Merlot Dr. RP stated that there is a disabled vehicle blocking the thru lane. Vehicle was moved off of the roadway.

RP is wondering if this is a violation of the NCO as he feels the texts that are being sent are an attempt at manipulation. Officer advised the RP to obtain a copy of the NCO for particular details.
- EMS officer assist with a male who was having breathing difficulties. EMS transported.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 300 block of Chardonnay Ave. RP stated that she believes someone is in the bushes near the building and he has been there the past few nights, watching the RP as they leave. Officer contacted the male and advised him to move along...which he did.
- Officers performed follow up work for ongoing investigations.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.
