ACTIVITY LOG

Week of September 8 to September 14, 2023

September 8 (38 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a non-injury traffic accident at Kinney Way/Lincoln Court. A moving vehicle struck a parked vehicle. No injuries reported.
- BCSO officer assist for a report of an assault at Wine Country Road / I-82. A female stated that another female had stabbed her. She was not forthcoming with information. BCSO Case.
- Officers responded to a request about a noise permit at the 1300 block of Rohman Drive. RP wanted to know if he needed a noise permit for a party that he was having. Officer advised that a permit is not needed, but that he should just be considerate of his neighbors.
- Officer responded to a report of identity theft at the 1000 block of Elm Street. RP stated that she had received a new driver's license in the mail (unwarranted) and was concerned for identity theft due to her personal information being compromised. RP had contacted the fraud department and made a report, but stated that she has not had new activity on her banking at this time. Officer advised that she keep a close eye on her accounts.
- Officers responded to a report of illegal dumping at the 700 block of Brown Street. RP stated that a male suspect who lives near the location has been using the business dumpsters illegally. Officers attempted to contact the male to no avail. Officer left a note at the residence requesting a phone call.
- Officer responded to a civil request for information at 6th Street and Meade. RP had left a note for someone challenging them to a fight and wanted to know if that was legal. Officer advised RP that while one can defend themselves as necessary, one should not go looking for a fight.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a male had taken two beers and had left after threatening to hit someone. The male dropped the beer and ran from the establishment. RP requested that the male be trespassed. Officers were unable to locate the male.
- Officer responded to a report of loitering at the 700 block of Memorial Street. RP stated that there was a male on the property loitering, but that he had left for a business nearby. Officers were unable to locate the male.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at 7th Street/Meade Avenue. RP stated that a Ford Explorer had pulled out in front of them (causing them to have to slam on their brakes). RP followed the driver for a short period and then stopped. Officers were unable to locate the driver.
- Officers responded to a civil matter at the 500 block of Cascade Court. RP stated that he had purchased an item from his son (who lived with his ex) and his ex would not give it to the RP. Officer referred the RP to civil court for resolution.
- BCSO/EMS officer assist at W CR 12/W Johnson Rd. for a two-vehicle accident with injuries.
- Court assist for serving papers at the 1400 block of Dudley.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 9 (30 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of breaking glass at 6th and Sheridan Avenue. RP stated that they heard glass breaking and were concerned that it may be coming from a vacant home or a local business. Officers found there to be no vacant homes in the area and also checked nearby businesses but did not find any broken glass in the area reported.
- BCSO officer assist with a single vehicle, minor injury accident on CR12. DUI suspected.

- Officers responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle at the 300 block of Chardonnay Avenue. RP stated that the vehicle was left in the parking lot, taking up multiple spots. The vehicle is unoccupied at this time. RP was advised that she can call a tow company if she wants it removed.
- BCSO Officer assist with a weapons report at Lincoln Grade. RP stated that several people were walking on Lincoln grade and, after firing his legal weapon several times, one male returned his weapon to his waistline. At some point, the male grabbed at his weapon, accidentally discharging it into his upper thigh/groin area. He was taken by his acquaintances to PMH and then to Kadlec, in stable condition. Accidental discharge. No crime.
- Officers responded to an audible alarm at the 3000 block of Wittkopf Loop Road. Officers checked the building which had an unsecured door. Officers cleared the building and secured the door.
- EMS officer assist with a medical emergency at Wine Country Road and Alexander Court.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a sex offense on King Tull Road. Case was turned over to BCSO due to location.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a male in a gold pickup dropped a sick puppy off in front of the business and left. Officers advised the RP that the PPD cannot take a sick puppy.
- Officer responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the 600 block of Frontier Road. RP stated that a customer had lured a dog out into the road and now the dog is walking around on the roadway causing a traffic hazard. Officer found that neither the dog nor the customer were causing a traffic hazard. Officer advised the RP that animal control does not work on the weekend so PPD is unable to collect the dog. The officer suggested that she is welcome to take the dog to a shelter if she wishes.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that his daughter had found a dog at the park who is sick or injured. Officer advised that the PPD cannot collect the injured dog. RP was advised that they can take the dog to an emergency vet in Pasco.
- Officers responded to a report of a court order violation at the 1500 block of Paterson Rd. RP stated that she was attending a sporting event and saw her ex, whom she has an order against. According to the documents, the ex was not breaking any laws by attending the sporting event. The officer conducted extra patrol in the area but did not note any issues. RP was advised to contact the officer if there were any additional issues.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a suspicious person at the 400 block of North River Road. RP stated that there is a male at the location who is cleaning the RPs door with a broom while listening to the radio. Officers contacted the male, who was cleaning cobwebs off of the building at the request of the owners. No crime.
- Officers responded to a report of Reckless Traffic at W. Old Inland Empire Hwy/W. Corral Creek Rd. RP stated that a dark blue jacked up truck was traveling into oncoming traffic and had almost gone into the ditch. Officer was unable to locate the driver.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 10 (32 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an information only report at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle had come through the drive-thru, with what appeared to be teen occupants. RP stated that they were belligerent and appeared to have possibly been drinking. RP also stated that they had observed alcohol in a cup holder. Officer was able to locate the vehicle, but the occupants had gone into a restaurant. Officer observed them and they did not appear intoxicated at all. Additionally, he did not see any alcohol containers in the vehicle. Lastly, the officer observed the driver after leaving the restaurant and did not see any signs of intoxication.

- Court officer assist with serving court documents at the 700 block of Memorial Street.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 1000 block of Prosser Avenue. RP stated that while he and his family were getting ready to leave the location, a neighbor approached the RP and began challenging him to a fight. RP stated that this is not the first time. Investigation ongoing.
- BCSO officer assist with a two vehicle traffic accident involving injuries at W CR 12/W King Tull Rd.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1800 block of Benson Avenue. RP stated that a vacant house at the location had a door open all day. Officers checked and found the keys to be in the door. No problems or signs of criminal activity were found inside. Officer secured the home and placed the keys in the lock box.
- Officer responded to a report of an alarm at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. Officer did not find anything amiss at the location.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 11 (55 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1200 block of Riverside Drive. RP stated that his chocolate lab escaped and wanted to know if it has been seen around. The escaped pooch had not been spotted by the officer.
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a female had hit her after they had an argument and that a male with the female had shone a flashlight into the RPs eyes resulting in a seizure. RP refused medics and did not want to press charges. RP was advised to stay away from the male and female.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle has been parked at the location since 09/07. RP has witnessed people frequently coming and going from the vehicle (though it was unoccupied at the time the officer arrived). RP stated that the driver had come in to the facility one time to use the restroom. Vehicle is registered, with the owner living in Grandview. GPD was given the information and the RP was advised that the owner of the facility can have the vehicle towed from the property, but should give 24 hour notice for the intent to tow.
- Officer responded to a report of fraud at the 1000 block of Prosser Avenue. RP stated that they had approximately \$15000 scammed due to an online scam. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer met with a dog owner whose dog had been impounded. Owner was advised to get his dog microchipped and to get him a collar and a license.
- Officers responded to an audible alarm at the 2200 block of Wine Country Road. Officers spoke with employees. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of a disruptive juvenile at the 900 block of 7th Street. RP stated that there is a student who frequently comes in to the library and is disruptive. Officer advised that he cannot enforce library etiquette and that the RP should request that the juvenile leave the facility.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless traffic concerning the areas around the school buses.
- Officer facilitated the transfer of two impounded stray puppies to the Pronto Rescue facility in Benton City.
- Officer assist with a request for information at the Police Department lobby. RP wanted information on obtaining a no contact order. RP was advised to go through the court system.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 1500 block of Paterson Road. RP stated that there is an issue with a child custody exchange (one parent did not show up).

- GVPD officer assist with locating firearm wielding juveniles who were trying to rob someone. While PRPD officers were in route, GVPD officers located the juveniles.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

- Officers responded to a weapons report at the 900 block of Alice Street. RP stated that they had heard gunfire. Officers checked around the area of the complaint but were unable to locate any gunfire or other issues.
- Officers responded to an information share of a runaway out of Yakima who may be headed to the Tri-Cities.
- Officers responded to a report of a civil issue at the 300 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that his wife had recently stopped working at the location and she was trying to collect her things. RP stated that the new manager at the facility was not giving her all of her possessions. Ex-employee contacted the previous manager to attempt to settle things. This is a civil issue. No crime.
- Officer responded to a traffic complaint at 700 Wine Country Road. RP is wondering if the construction crew working across from Love's is responsible for the rocks and debris in the road. Officer advised RP that the location is an active construction site and that things may end up in the road. Officer advised he will take a look at the area.
- EMS officer assist with a medical request on the 1100 block of Chianti Lane.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit-and-run traffic accident (no injury) at Prosser High School. RP stated that as he was backing up his vehicle (to reposition), a silver Toyota Tundra backed into his Honda Accord, causing damage to the vehicle. Video footage is being used to see the incident. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a non-injury traffic accident at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Drivers exchanged information.
- Officers responded to a civil call at the 1000 block of Anna Street. RP state that her ex is threatening to take pictures of her to use against her for custody issues. RP wanted to know about getting a restraining order. Officer advised RP that she will need to go through the court system to get an order.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 13 (38 Calls for Service)

- Officers detained one individual following a traffic stop for a SSPD warrant at Wine Country Road/North River Road.
- Officers responded to an informational report about a possible vehicle prowler at the 200 block of Ladera Street. RP advised that his ring camera recorded a male looking into his vehicle. The male was not seen entering any vehicle, so there is no crime at this time.
- Officers responded to a report of a vehicle prowler at the 200 block of SW Malibu Drive. RP stated that both of her vehicles had smashed windows that had occurred sometime during the night. Investigation ongoing.

- BCSO officers assist for a report of reckless driving on W. Old Inland Empire Hwy/N. Hinzerling Road. RP stated that a Silver Toyota Tundra was driving all over the road. Vehicle not located.
- Officers responded to an informational report of a vehicle prowler at the 1300 block of SW Kelandren Drive. RP stated that her vehicle was broken into at some point in the night. She did not want to file a report but wanted the officers to be aware of the incident.
- Officer hosted an event for a group of children at the Police Department (pictures on Facebook).
- Officers responded to a report of a vehicle prowler at the 1300 block of SW Kelandren Drive. RP stated that someone entered her vehicle due to an unlocked back seat door and stole items from her vehicle. Investigation ongoing.

Location tracking showed the case to be in the area of the airport. Officers checked the suggested area but did not locate the case. RPs data had previously been showing Prosser Minnie Storage. Officer advised RP to contact him should another location come up.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1600 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated that an individual was on the property acting erratic and that she had been on location acting that way for the past day. PMH requested that the individual be trespassed, which she was.
- BCSO officer assist with a verbal domestic report on W. Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that her ex is in the garage. Ex stated he is collecting his property. Both agreed that the dispute was only verbal. Ex collected his items and was going to leave.
