ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2020 TO SEPTEMBER 17, 2020

SEPTEMBER 11 (30 calls for service)

- Suspicious person reported in the 700 block of 6th Street. Male was contacted sitting at a table outside of Brewminatti drinking coffee. Manager requested he be moved along, which he did.
- Traffic hazard reported in the 400 block of Petra Ave. Report of a large semi unloading sod for a construction site. Driver moved after he was done unloading and there was plenty of room to go around.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft in progress in the 1100 block of Sherman Ave. Upon Officers arrival, it was found that the homeowner's children were on site with a friend and it was all just a big misunderstanding.
- Request for extra patrol received at the Wine Country RV Park. Reporting Party (RP) stated that sometime during the night a grill and propane tank had been stolen from a guest. RP did not observe anything on video and the person it was stolen from was not available to a give report at the time.
- Trespass order at Bern's. Male was issued a trespass order for 1 year for harassing staff and customers as well as refusing to leave when denied service.
- Civil issue in the 800 block of Court Street. RP called and said that her husband had sold their car without her permission and the people that he sold it to were now threatening to take her to court to get the title. RP was advised to obtain a lawyer, due to it being a civil matter.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 1400 block of Roza Vista PL. RP called and said he hadn't seen or heard from his kids for a week. Officer made contact with the mom and kids and they were fine. Both the RP and mother were advised that they needed to figure out their child custody issues and that Officers will not be doing checks daily because they are refusing to talk with each other. Both stated they understood.
- Anonymous call received from the PD lobby, RP said she was calling about an ongoing issue with a male shooting a dog. RP was gone upon Officers arrival, information was passed on to the Community Service Officer for follow up.
- Traffic hazard in the area of 6th Street and Meade Ave. Traffic was backed up due to a section of 6th Street being closed off for outdoor restaurant seating. Officer observed traffic finally thin out but it would continue to be an issue during the weekend due to heavier traffic, the section being closed off through Sunday, and the construction going on in the area.
- Malicious mischief reported in the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. Officer contacted the RP who showed the Officer were spray paint had been used to mark different areas of his yard and shop. Just as the Officer was leaving, a man and three boys showed up holding spray paint cans. The boys admitted to the RP that they had broken in and then sprayed some paint and took a few cans with them. Officer had each boy apologize to the RP and promise not to do it again. Officer then advised the boys of the consequences of their actions and potential charges they could have received. They all promised never to do this again. RP was satisfied with the outcome.
- Report of a male harassing employees and customers at the Prosser Food Depot. Male was issued a no trespass order for one year.
- Noise complaint received in the 200 block of Port Ave. Report of loud music in the area. Officer observed about 15-20 teenagers hanging out. They were all told to move along. RP stated this has been an ongoing issue for a few months. Officers will continue to conduct extra patrols in the area.

SEPTEMBER 12 (13 calls for service)

- Animal complaint received in the 800 block of Market Street. RP called stating that he saw a large porcupine in the street on Market Street. Officers combed the area, but the prickly suspect escaped.
- Officers responded to a motor vehicle accident in the 400 block of Wine Country Road. It was determined a vehicle was pulling into the parking lot and the driver mistakenly pressed the gas pedal instead of the brake pedal. The vehicle collided with a building, which was unoccupied at the time. No injuries were reported.

Narcotics complaint received in the area of Old Inland Empire Hwy and N Wamba Road. RP called to advise he found two syringes laying in the road. Upon arrival, Officer found the syringes to be unused and still capped. Officer disposed of the items.

- Trespass report received in the 200 block of 9th Street. Officers observed individuals at a residence that had been tagged by the City as condemned. Officers contacted a male who tried to talk his way into being allowed onto the property. Officers gave the male 15 minutes to vacate the scene before he would be arrested. The male eventually left and was given directions on how to legally enter the residence.
- Officers assisted WSP on SR-22 and Market Street with a two vehicle non-injury traffic accident. Officers assisted with traffic control until WSP arrived.
- Disturbance reported at Love's. RP advised he was involved in a verbal disturbance with an unknown male at the pumps. RP stated it was completely random and there had been no interaction with the male prior to the contact. The male took off in a vehicle and the RP was not able to get the license plate.
- Noise complaint received in the area of Miller Ave and Mercer Ct. Officer made contact with a residence and found that there was a loud band playing at the location for a party. The homeowner advised the band was finishing up and the music would quiet down.
- Non-reportable accident occurred between two semis in the Lobe's parking lot. Information was exchanged.
- Verbal disturbance reported at the 6th Street Bridge. Officers made contact with a male and female who advised the disturbance was verbal only.

SEPTEMBER 13 (17 calls for service)

- Officers assisted BCSO with a vehicle rollover on North River Road. Driver was initially trapped, but was able to get out before EMS arrived. Prosser Officer helped with traffic control until BCSO arrived.
- Fraud reported in the 1800 block of Benson Ave. RP called and stated that she believed her sister had cashed her inheritance check. RP could not tell for sure that she did, but advised she had not received check when she was supposed to. Ongoing investigation.
- Vehicle prowler reported in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP reported that she believed her vehicle was broken into while in Prosser sometime during the end of August and that \$2,600.00 worth of merchandise had been stolen.
- Assist PMH, Doctor called inquiring on how to handle reporting a DV Assault. Officer found out that the assault happened in Grandview and referred him to Grandview Dispatch.
- Reckless traffic complaint received in the area of W Gibbon Road and Wine Country Road. Vehicle was reported as swerving on I-82. Officer observed the vehicle parked and unoccupied at the registered owners address.

SEPTEMBER 14 (20 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 1000 block of Margaret Street. Report came in of a male and female who were physical. Officers arrived and contacted several subjects. All parties contacted at the residence claimed there had been no disturbance.
- Request for a welfare check received in the area of 6th Street and Playfield Ave for a report of an elderly male who was at the location and not making sense. Family of the male was contacted and arrived to transport him back home.
- Civil complaint received in the 1500 block of Meade Ave regarding a Juvenile that would not leave the location. The mother was contacted and the juvenile left with her without further incident.
- Officers responded to a disturbance reported in the 1200 block of Stacy Ave. Officers determined the disturbance was verbal only and parties agreed to separate for the night.
- Traffic stop in the area of W Gibbon Road and Wine Country Road. Driver was cited and released for DWLS 3rd Degree.

SEPTEMBER 15 (24 calls for service)

- Officers responded to a 911 hang-up at the Inn at Horse Heaven. The area was checked and staff was contacted, no issues were reported.
- Theft reported at Love's. Suspects reportedly took items and left in what was believed to be a black Mercedes. Ongoing investigation.
- Narcotics complaint received in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised she found a marijuana pipe on top of a table that is located in a common area for the apartments. Officer retrieved the pipe for destruction. No crime, issue to be handled by the apartment manager.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the area of Merlot Drive and Wine Country Road. Report of multiple individuals walking around who the RP thought appeared to be on narcotics and was worried about them driving

while under the influence. Responding officer located the suspect vehicle unoccupied and did not observe any other issues in the area.

- Noise complaint received in the 900 block of Sheridan Ave. RP heard loud banging against her wall. Officers checked the area, but did not observe anything out of the ordinary and did not hear any loud noises.

SEPTEMBER 16 (13 calls for service)

- Theft report received in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP stated his ION speaker was stolen from his front porch the day prior. Speaker was described as black with a handle and wheels.
- Theft reported in the 8000 block of S 1366 PR SW. RP advised four kayaks went missing from their property sometime between last Thursday night and Friday morning. The kayaks were described as Lifetime brand lime green and fire orange in color.
- Order violation reported in the 300 block of 7th Street. RP called saying her ex-boyfriend had violated their restraining order. After hearing all of the details, it was determined that the order had not been violated and no crime had been committed.
- Suspicious circumstances reported at the Mustang Plaza. RP advised of a subject acting strange and possibly on narcotics. Officers contacted the subject, who identified himself as Alexander Hamilton and gave his address as 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, which was obviously false information. The male was advised to stay away from the Mustang Plaza and avoid causing any more problems.
- Request for a welfare check received at Burger King. RP advised of a truck in the parking lot with a male inside that had been at the location for a long time. Officers made contact with the male, and found there were no problems. The male moved along.

SEPTEMBER 17 (25 calls for service)

- Officers responded to an alarm at PTM Market. Upon arrival, Officers found a juvenile male outside, sweeping the parking lot at approximately 02:40 am wearing only a pair of shorts. The juvenile said he was cleaning the place, but that no one had asked him to. There were no signs of entry into the building. The juvenile was transported home and his parents were contacted.
- Traffic stop in the area of Chardonnay Ave and Merlot Drive. Driver was cited and released for DWLS 3rd Degree.
- Malicious Mischief reported in the area of Alice Street and Canyon Drive. Multiple vehicles were found to have orange marking paint on them. All vehicle owners were advised and the paint was fresh enough that they were able to wipe it off with no damage.
- Disturbance reported at Prosser City Hall. RP called saying there was a man screaming into the windows. A City employee was able to get the male to move along and last saw him running after the BFT Bus. Officers could not locate the male, but the description was that of the male that identified himself as Alexander Hamilton and that night shift had dealt with on various suspicious person calls. The male was not seen the rest of the day.
- Report of suicidal threats received in the area of Semillon Place. RP called saying that her son who is 18 didn't want to log on to do school work and left the house saying he was going to go out to the highway and get hit by a truck. Officers searched the area but did not locate him. RP said he was probably just at his friend's house and she did not believe he was actually going to hurt himself.
- Information received in the 1800 block of Wine Country Road, RP stated that her husband had tried to get gas using his debit card, but that it wouldn't go through. RP later had two separate charges show up on her bank statement. RP contacted the owner of the station who said it should drop off within 24 to 48 hours, but it hadn't and she now could not get a hold of him. Officer contacted the owner and he said he asked the RP to bring in the bank statement and that he would get with Conoco Corporate and get it taken care of. The owner said he never heard from the RP after that. Officer relayed the information to RP.
- Theft reported in the 100 block of SR-22. Contractor reported three metal doors worth \$600 a piece had been removed and stolen from the property.
- Disturbance reported in the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. Neighbors were arguing over fallen tree limbs and a motor for a truck on the property. Officers deescalated the problem and no crime was found to have occurred.
- Suspicious person reported in the 1100 block of Budd Ave. Elderly male with dementia had wandered from his house to the neighbors and did not know where he was. Officers located a family member to take him home.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 1100 block of Budd Ave. Elderly male had again gone to the neighbor's house, but this time just walked inside. Officers were able to get him home with help from the family.
- Suspicious circumstances in the 1100 block of Bud Ave. Elderly male left his house again and wanted to talk with the neighbors. Family came and picked him up.
