ACTIVITY LOG

Week of September 22 to September 28, 2023

September 22 (40 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an audible alarm at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Officers found the building to be secure.
- Officers responded to a male who flagged them down at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The male stated that he had items stolen from him in Yakima. He was advised to contact YPD to file a report.
- Officer responded to an informational call for the area of the Grant Street Park. RP stated that they were fishing and saw approximately 20 gang members at the park who started shooting their firearms. Officers attempted to contact the RP multiple times to no avail. No gang members were noted at the park.
- Officer responded to a complaint of a possible order violation at the Balloon Rally. It was found that the order had not been served. The subject in question left the area.
- Officer responded to a parking violation at the 600 block of 6th Street. A vehicle was parked within the downtown event area. The vehicle owner was contacted and advised to move his vehicle.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 100 block of Nunn Road for a brown and black dog at large. Officer was unable to locate the dog.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Evans Ave and Lillian Street. RP stated that there are three dogs loose in the area. Two animals returned to their home. The third was checked for a chip (which it had) and was successfully returned to the owner.
- Officers assisted SSPD with detaining an individual for a warrant.
- Officer responded to a loitering complaint at the Prosser Rest Area. RP stated that people are complaining about a pickup and trailer camping at the site all week. Officers checked and found that the camper is being towed. No problems found.
- Officers responded to a request for an assist to find a vehicle wanted in a hit and run accident. Officers were unable to locate.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1100 block of Yakima Avenue. A black lab was said to be running loose. Officer found the dog and returned it to its owner.
- Officers responded to a report of a non-injury accident at Prosser High School. RP stated that their daughter's parked vehicle had been hit. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of property destruction at the Prosser City Park. RP stated that they witnessed a person kicking the fence, ultimately breaking it. Officers found the broken area (and removed the hazard), but were unable to locate the responsible person.
- Fire Department assist for a house fire on Sellards Road.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 23 (33 Calls for Service)

- Officers performed patrols for the Balloon Rally.
- Officers responded to a report of property destruction at the 800 block of Court Street. RP state that his detached garage had been spray painted with graffiti. He advised that he would paint over it.

- Officer assist with a report of a couple wandering around near the park who appear to have been drinking. RP stated that the male appeared to have blood on his face. Officer was unable to locate the couple upon arrival.
- Officers responded to a weapons report at the 1100 block of Budd Avenue. RP stated that her daughter had been walking along the canal and had seen a male in camo gear with a rifle. Officers found the male to be a teen with a bb gun. Male was advised that he is not allowed to fire a bb gun in city limits.
- Officer responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the 400 block of SW Bennett Avenue. RP stated that there is a vehicle partially blocking traffic. Officer spoke with the responsible male who advised that he had run out of gas. He was given a courtesy ride to and from the gas station.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a female had been very rude to an employee and that the RP wanted the female trespassed, which she was.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there are goats at the location who look very skinny and do not appear to have food or water. Officer checked the location but found the goats to be very healthy. No issues found.
- Officer responded to a report of a hit and run accident. RP stated that a female had hit a sign and then left. Vehicle was not located upon arrival, but YPD was able to give information on the driver.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 24 (22 Calls for Service)

- Officers conducted Balloon Rally patrols.
- Officers located an abandoned vehicle under the Grant Street Bridge that was reported stolen out of Benton County. BCSO arrived and took over the investigation.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 1100 block of Claire Street. Officers spoke to the resident, who advised that it was a false alarm.
- Officers responded to property found. A good citizen found a phone at the Gateway Chevron and turned it in to the PD. It is currently at the PD.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1200 block of Bennett Ave. RP stated that someone had left a dog in the vehicle and that the dog was panting and looked distressed. Upon arrival, the officers noted that the vehicle was not hot and that the dog was resting comfortably. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at I82 and W Johnson Rd. RP stated that a male was wandering around the area, shaking the fence, looking like he was trying to break in. Officers were unable to locate a male at the reported area.
- Officers responded to a report of a noise violation at the 1100 block of Prosser Avenue. RP stated that someone at the location revs an engine every night (an ongoing issue). Officers were unable to locate the individual revving the engine.

- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 1100 block of Spokane Avenue. RP stated that a vehicle was parked at a vacant home and appeared to be in the garage. After checking, it was determined that the individual at the home was the tenant.

Officers contacted the male who stated he was trying to get a jump from someone so that he could get back to Yakima. He was advised that his license is currently suspended and that he should wait for someone to drive his vehicle.
- Officers responded to a report of property destruction at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a male was throwing bricks and rocks at vehicles in the area. Officers checked that area and the areas in the direction that the RP stated the male had gone but were unable to locate him. Officers did not see any damage to vehicles in the area.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 100 block of Wamba Road. RP stated that she needed assistance and there was no one to help her. Officers contacted the facility and were advised that they would talk to the RP. No issues found.
- Officers responded to a report of an order violation. This is an ongoing investigation.

- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the Prosser Airport. A stray dog was on the runway.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 600 block of 6th Street. RP stated that she found a puppy at SR22/Byron Road. RP was advised to contact BCSO as the found location was out of Prosser jurisdiction.
- Officers responded to a report of domestic assault at the 1300 block of Semillon Place. RP stated that her boyfriend physically assaulted her. After a short game of hide-and-seek, the male was taken into custody and delivered to Benton County jail.
- Officers responded to a question about license plate rules at the 1000 block of Gum Street. RP wanted to know if she could paint over the worn numbers on her license plate as replacing them is expensive. She was advised not to paint on her license plate.
- BCSO officer assist for a residential alarm at the 9100 block of S. Moore Rd. Officer checked the building and found it to be secure.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1300 block of Grant Avenue. A dog was wandering around on the sidewalk. Owner was advised to keep the dog on their property.
- Officer responded to a request for information (at Prosser PD) concerning his semi-truck. RP wanted to know if he could park his semi at the location (Airport property). He was advised that he could not and was given information on where he could legally park his truck. He complied.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at SW Montecito Drive and SW Kelandren Drive. A German shepherd was at large. The dog was returned to its home.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 600 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP was concerned about the male who lived there as they had not heard from him for a bit. Officers contacted the male and he was fine and stated he will contact the RP.
- Officer assisted a driver at the 3200 block of Wine Country Road. Driver had a disabled vehicle and needed a jump. Officer was able to assist the driver and get him on his way.
- Officers responded to a report of a No Contact Order (NCO) violation at the 1300 block of SR22. The address given by the RP was not found and repeated attempts to contact her were unsuccessful. Additionally, no current NCO was in place.

- Officer responded to a report of animal abandonment at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. A female (identified via video) came into the Prosser Animal Hospital and left a small kitten at the location. The officer located the female and told her that it is illegal to abandon an animal. This investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the 800 block of Brown Street. RP stated that her ex is parked on the road near her house (not on her property) and that this is a recurring issue. She stated that she has asked him to leave in the past. Officers advised RP to seek a protection order, and gave her instructions on how to do so. She was also advised to call if there is a disturbance.
- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of 6th Street. RP stated that a male came in to the location looking for someone named Lizzy. He then went into a different store before leaving. He was acting weird, according to the RP. The officer was unable to locate the male upon arrival.
- Officer responded to a parking violation at the 900 block of Sheridan Avenue. There was an unregistered trailer parked on the street. The officer contacted the responsible owner who said she will have it moved by end-of-day.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a male with two Chihuahuas came in and stole a burrito. Subject was not located upon arrival. RP stated she would like to have the male trespass. Officer advised the RP to call if he shows up again.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 400 block of 3rd Street (Farrand Park). A person was seen possibly sleeping in his car at the location. Officer checked with the person who was fine, just taking a nap.
- Officers responded to a report of three males getting physically aggressive with another male. RP did not want to see medics. Investigation ongoing.
