WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 25, 2020 TO OCTOBER 01, 2020

SEPTEMBER 25 (20 Calls for Service)

- Phone scam reported in the 1500 block of Grant Ave. Reporting Party (RP) stated that people claiming to be from Amazon told her that her account was going to be charged if she didn't call them back. RP does not have an account with Amazon and did not give any information to the scammer. RP was advised to just not answer when they call.
- Report of a non-injury private property accident at Starbucks. RP wanted to report a collision that occurred an hour prior and stated they had already exchanged information. RP was advised that she had already done all that is required by law.
- Civil issue reported in the 1000 block of Gum St. RP advised she loaned her vehicle to her ex-boyfriend who was now refusing to return it. RP was told that it was a civil issue that would need to be handled through civil court.
- Report of an abandoned vehicle at the LDS Church on Highland Drive. RP advised the vehicle had been parked at the location for a few days and that the driver's side window was broken out. Officer ran the vehicle through the system and contacted the registered owner. The registered owner stated they had sold the vehicle about a month ago. RP was advised the vehicle was not coming back as stolen and it was their discretion if they wanted to tow it from their property.
- Civil issue at Loves reference a lost wallet. Officer assisted in getting the wallet returned to the RP.

SEPTEMBER 26 (19 Calls for Service)

- Noise complaint received in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. Officer checked the area and found it to be quiet.
- Graffiti found at Crawford Park. Restroom and pavilion were tagged with black spray paint during the night. City crews were dispatched to clean it up. Tagging was also found on the PUD substation wall. PUD was called and notified of the damage.
- Civil issue at Prosser City Park. RP called stating her child's dad had taken her child from the park. It was determined that the RP did not have a parenting plan and the child had been living with a grandparent, not the RP. RP was told that the issue was civil and was advised to take steps through the courts to obtain a parenting plan.
- Officers responded to a DV assault in the 1000 block of Sheridan Ave. Officers contacted the female victim and determined that her juvenile son who has special needs had gotten upset with her for not taking him inside a store that they have been trespassed from due to a prior incident. The victim stated that on the drive home her son started scratching and biting her and possibly hit her on the head. The female was checked by EMS and Officers spoke with the juvenile about not hitting his mother and explained as best they could that he is not allowed in the store. Per the mother's request, charges were sent to the Prosecutors Office for review in hopes that she can get some type of assistance with her son.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a traffic accident in the area of Missimer Road and Old Inland Empire Hwy. Officers conducted traffic control until Deputies arrived on scene.

- Lost weapon reported in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP called advising he believed he had left his firearm on top of his vehicle as he drove away. RP said he checked the area, but could not locate his firearm.
- Noise complaint received in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP complained of his neighbor's loud music. Officers made contact with the neighbor and advised him to turn the music down.

SEPTEMBER 27 (16 Calls for Service)

- Assault reported in the 1600 block of Sherman Ave. RP advised dispatch that a male at the location had assaulted a female. Officers made contact with a male at the residence who advised he had been sleeping before officers arrived. The male stated there had not been a disturbance and that no female had been there. Officers checked the residence and were not able to locate a victim. The RP's contact number was found to be out of service, and the residents at the address where the RP apparently told dispatch he lived did not know the RP.
- Suspicious vehicle reported near Chukar Cherries. RP called saying there was a blue Honda driving slowly down Wine Country Road and they thought the driver might be having a medical issue. Officers made contact with the vehicle and it was determined the vehicle had mechanical problems. The driver parked the vehicle and advised he would have it towed to a mechanic for repairs.
- Hit and run reported in the 1800 block of Highland Drive. RP called and said that it looked like someone had backed into his vehicle sometime during the evening.
- Loud music complaint in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. Officer contacted the male who was playing his music a little loud in his car in the front yard. Male was advised to keep the noise reasonable.
- Reported hit and run in the area of Wine Country Road and North River Road. RP stated she was stopped at the red light when she was rear-ended. Damage to the RP's vehicle consisted of a smudge. The suspect vehicle was described only as a white Ford pickup, possibly a F150 with a male driver. The suspect and vehicle were not located.

SEPTEMBER 28 (23 Calls for Service)

- Officers assisted BCSO by stopping a suspect vehicle from a suspicious circumstances call in the 400 block of North River Road. It had been reported that subjects were going to break into a storage unit. The vehicle was stopped on Wine Country Road and it was found the storage unit in question was apparently their own.
- Officer made contact with a suspicious vehicle parked behind Jubilee. A male was contacted in the driver's seat and asked what he was doing behind the building. The male stated he was there with a female and they were looking for clothing. Male was advised that he could not be taking items from the building because it is private property and the items are dropped off for the business to sell. While speaking with the male, Officer observed suspected narcotics and drug paraphernalia within plain view. The male was placed into custody and the female was located hiding in a dumpster where she claimed she was sleeping. Both were released pending a search warrant on the vehicle.
- Burglary reported at the high school construction site. Approximately \$20,000 in damage was reported throughout the property. Investigation is ongoing.
- Civil complaint in the 900 block of Alexander Ct. RP stated he purchased a vehicle and put his girlfriend's name on it. His girlfriend took the vehicle, refusing to give it back. RP was advised the issue was civil and he would need to go through civil court.
- Officer responded to a disturbance between neighbors in the 900 block of Alexander Ct. Officer arrived and found two males and a female involved in a loud argument. The parties were separated and it was determined that one of the males had thrown dog feces and liquid cheese

on the other involved parties vehicle and front door. The male was issued a citation for Malicious Mischief 3rd Degree and was released.

- Suspicious person reported in the 1500 block of Sheridan Ave. As Officers were heading to the area, the RP stated the male had gone across the street and was potentially stealing stuff from a residence in the 200 block of 9th Street. Officers made contact with a male inside of the residence, which had been previously condemned. The male was taken into custody for Criminal Trespass 1st Degree. Suspected narcotics were observed within a vehicle at the location and it was seized for a search warrant. A search warrant was also performed on the residence and multiple items of paraphernalia and narcotics were located and seized.
- Traffic stop in the area of Guernsey Street and Main Street. Driver was cited and released for DWLS 1st Degree.
- Suspicious circumstances reported in the area of Wine Country Road and Wamba Road. RP stated there were juveniles in area along with multiple vehicles. When the RP made contact with the juveniles they claimed to be playing hide and seek and left the area when RP asked them to, but RP wanted to report it in case criminal activity was later discovered.

SEPTEMBER 29 (14 Calls for Service)

- Disturbance reported at Carl's Jr. Report of a male customer who was yelling, screaming and throwing items. RP stated the male threw his burger at an employee because he claimed it had been made wrong. The manager asked the male to leave and he cursed at her. The male left the property without further incident.
- Lobby contact, RP wanted to report that on the night prior, a male riding his bicycle had ran into her vehicle, but he refused any assistance and did not want the police called. Officer made contact with the male bike rider who advised he was okay and did not call the police because he was delivering a pizza and needed to keep going.
- Noise complaint received in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. Ongoing issue between neighbors.
- Disturbance reported at Horse Heaven Inn. Male who was staying at the hotel was acting paranoid and kept calling the front desk saying he needed information on other guests. Male was asked to leave and did so peacefully after contacting a family member.

SEPTEMBER 30 (17 Calls for Service)

- Disturbance reported in the 100 block of Merlot Drive. Motorcycle owner was upset that the driver of a sedan parked too close to him. Both parties advised it had been verbal only and the motorcycle owner agreed to leave.
- Information report at the PD. Dispatch advised a female had picked up the lobby phone and yelled that she needed to use the bathroom. Female then swore at the call taker and hung up. Upon Officer arrival, female had already left the location.
- BCSO assist at the PD Lobby. RP had received a call from the "DA" advising him he had a warrant for his arrest. RP decided to turn himself in to the PD. BCSO determined the call to be a scam.
- Reckless traffic complaint in the area of Vineyard Street and Kinney Way. RP advised that vehicles have been using Vineyard Street as a drag strip and requested Officers conduct extra patrols in the area.
- Suspicious vehicle reported in the 1600 block of Sherman Ave. RP advised a pick-up had been parking near the City Yard and that a with a female had been seen walking away from it on a daily basis. Officer found the vehicle to be legally parked and registered to a nearby address.
- Information received in the 500 block of Eastgate Drive. RP wanted to know what he could do about his brother stealing from their mother. RP was told to have his mother report the crimes if she wished to be a victim.
- Stolen property recovered in the area of Alexander Ct and Benson Ave. Previously reported stolen license plate was located and turned in. License plate was removed from the system as stolen and the victim was notified.

- Traffic hazard in the area of Bennett Ave and Sadie Street. Semi had two flat tires on its trailer and was unable to move. Driver had mechanic on the way.
- Narcotics complaint in the 900 block of Sheridan Ave. DOC Officers conducting a house check observed narcotics in plain view. A search warrant was obtained and multiple items of suspected narcotics and paraphernalia were seized. Case was referred to the Prosecutors Office for review.

OCTOBER 01 (24 Calls for Service)

- Malicious mischief reported at Housel Middle School. Three juveniles were seen on video within the fenced area and one of the juveniles wrote on a teacher's door with what appeared to be washable marker.
- Disturbance report received in the 400 block of Petra Ave. It was determined that a female resident had said unkind words to other residents who were congregating in the smoking area. One male on-scene became upset with Officers response when they advised they could not arrest the female for being unpleasant. Officers strongly advised apartment management to address the on-going issues with the residents.
- Officers assisted RPD with an attempt to locate one of their runaways who was reported to be at EJ Miller Park. The runaway was not located.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a welfare check at the Grant St Bridge. It was reported that two juveniles were preparing to jump off a pipe into the river. The juveniles were contacted warned to make better decisions.
- Fraud reported at Taco Bell. RP discovered her lost debit card had been used at the location over the weekend. Investigation is ongoing.
- Traffic complaint received in the area of 6th Street and Bennett Ave regarding a semi-parked in the street. Officer found the semi was not within the lane of travel and was not blocking.
- Noise complaint received in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP reported that her upstairs neighbor was making a lot of noise. Officer asked if it was going on at the time of the call and she advised it was not. Officer advised the RP to get with management and to call back if the noise persists past quiet hours of 10 pm. No other calls were received.
- Noise complaint in the 1100 block of Prosser Ave. RP called and said his neighbor was outside throwing and breaking things. Upon Officers arrival, nothing was seen or heard.
