ACTIVITY LOG

Week of September 29 to October 5, 2023

September 29 (37 Calls for Service)

- RPD officer assist with detaining a subject for a warrant during a traffic stop at S Wamba Rd/Wine Country Road. One male was transported to BC jail.
- BCSO Officer assist with a report of an accident on I82 exit 86. Rather than an accident, the vehicle appeared to be safely off of the road and unoccupied. Vehicle did not appear to have been in an accident at all.
- Officer responded to a report of a non-injury accident at Wine Country Rd/Merlot Dr. Car 1 says semi rolled into her at the stop sign while semi driver claims front car rolled back into the semi. This is a civil issue.
- Officers responded to an audible alarm at the 700 block of Memorial Street. Employee advised there is no problem at the location.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 1300 block of Sommers Ave. RP stated that two transient individuals were in the bathroom for an extended period of time. Officers checked and there were no problems.
- Officer responded to report of a civil issue at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. RP stated that she has moved from the location and that the male living there is not allowing her to get her things. As this is a civil issue, the RP was advised to seek civil resolution. The male at the location asked for information about getting a no-contact-order, which he was given.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 800 block of Court Street. RP stated that a male is walking around area, looking into cars and she felt he was perhaps casing the area. The RP did not see him attempt to get into any cars. He wandered off down the alley. Officers were unable to locate the male upon arrival.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that they witnessed an exchange of a handcuffed teenage girl from one car to another along with paperwork and was concerned for the teenager. After obtaining the license plate information, it was found that this was an exchange of a person from one bail bondsman to another. The female was booked into the Yakima County Jail.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

September 30 (45 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 1100 block of Market Street while on patrol. A port-a-potty at the location had been knocked over. The officer did not note damage to the unit and there did not appear to be waste anywhere about.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless traffic at Gap Road/Wine Country Road. RP stated that the driver was swerving, almost hitting the RP and another driver but was now parked near the rest area. After contacting the driver, officer detained her for a warrant from Sunnyside PD. Driver was transported to Sunnyside jail.
- Officers responded to an informational report on Merlot Drive. A Good Samaritan had purchased gas for a couple and they insisted on paying him with jewelry. He wanted to give the information on the jewelry in case the items came up stolen.
- Officers responded to a report of theft at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that 3 approximately middle school aged males entered the store and 1 of them hid a bottle of

MD20/20 in his shirt and walked out with it. The RP did not know the males but will send the video of the incident to the police department. Later in the day, the offending juvenile and his parents resolved the issues with the RP, who was compensated for the item and did not wish to pursue charges.

- Officer responded to a report of information at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a semi-truck driver (customer) smells like he has been drinking. The semi (and driver) had left the area upon officer arrival. Information on the truck and driver was passed on to WSP.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 200 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that there is a female causing a disturbance at the Subway. The female was yelling randomly and appeared to be wielding a rake (which she put down). RP was concerned that the female may need help. Officers were unable to locate the female after checking the area.
- Officers responded to a non-injury, blocking accident at 6th and Wine Country Road. Two vehicles were stopped at the stop sign and a third vehicle did not stop in time, hitting the 2nd car, which then hit the first car.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there is a male walking towards the Conoco who is punching the air and appears to be on narcotics. Male not located.
- Officer responded to a business alarm at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. No problems were found.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 01 (44 Calls for Service)

- Officers detained a driver for a DWLS 3rd degree as well as a warrant out of Snohomish County. The driver was transported to BC jail.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving on I82. RP stated that a vehicle was driving WB in EB lanes. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle but passed the information on to WSP.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident at the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that at some point in the night, someone had struck the driver's side door of her vehicle. There was no video of the incident.
- Officers responded to a report of a blocking, disabled vehicle at N Gap Rd/I 82. A truck and horse trailer was disabled at the location. A tow truck was able to clear the hazard.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1000 block of Memorial Street. RP stated that someone had dumped 2 puppies at the location. RP agreed to keep the puppies until the CSO could be contacted on Monday morning.
- Officers performed patrol duties at the car show.
- Officers responded to a 911 hang up from the 2100 block of Wine Country Road. Officers checked the number and spoke to the residents. No problem was found.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a male in a white minivan had stolen multiple items before leaving the location, which was captured on video. Officers were unable to locate the van.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that someone, possibly under the influence, was in the bushes at the location perhaps trying to camp there. RP stated she just wanted the person to be moved along. Officers contacted the female, who did not appear to be under the influence. She agreed to move along.
- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check on Elm Street. RP stated that someone is possibly abusing a child before disconnecting. Officer checked the area thoroughly but did not observe any unusual activity.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving on I82/Gap Road. RP stated that a black mustang was driving all over the road and had exited the freeway. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle.

- BCSO officer assist with a weapons report on North Crosby Rd. RP stated that a vehicle was parked at the end of their driveway and the men inside the vehicle had guns (exposed). Officers were unable to locate the vehicle upon arrival.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 02 (41 Calls for Service)

- Officer located a vehicle parked at Crawford Park (1:39 am). Occupants were advised to take activities elsewhere.
- Officer responded to a report of a noise violation at the 1100 block of Larch Street. RP stated that a dog had been barking for the past several hours. Officer checked the area and only heard a very faint barking. No issues found otherwise.
- Officers responded to a report of weapons at Wine Country Road/North River Road. RP stated that as she was driving, someone shot through her back window. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at Wine Country Road/Merlot Drive. RP stated that due to a power outage the traffic light is not working. City employees were made aware.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at SW Montecito Dr/SW Kelandren Dr. RP stated that there is an ongoing issue with a dog that is relieving itself on her property. Officer was unable to locate the dog.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1200 block of Playfield Avenue. RP wanted assistance capturing the cats from inside her residence. Officer advised the RP that we do not manage cats and that she should attempt to catch them with an animal trap.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Larch St/Walker Pl. RP stated that a person in the area is throwing their dog's waste from her yard over the fence into the road. Officer spoke with the resident and warned her not to do this.
- Officer responded to a 911 hang up at the 900 block of 7th Street. Officer spoke to the caller and she advised it was an accidental dial.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard on Merlot Dr. The hazard was removed prior to officer arrival.
- Officers responded to a noise violation complaint at the 200 block of Canyon Drive. Officer spoke to the RP who advised the loud music had ceased.
- Officers responded to numerous reports of shots fired from the Lincoln Grade area. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 03 (27 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an informational report of a vehicle that was taken at gunpoint out of Grandview. Vehicle was not found in Prosser.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at Wine Country Road/SR 22. RP stated that two Walter Clore campaign signs had been stolen and 1 had been replaced with a Jim Chesley sign. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at the 1200 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated that there is a vehicle swerving and flashing their headlights before parking at the location. Officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but the vehicle took off towards Grandview. GPD was made aware of the situation.
- Officers responded to a report of threats at the 1000 block of Sheridan. RPs son had been threatened that if he did not pay money to a cash app, a photo would be released (of them). No such photo exists. The number was blocked and the app was deleted (Instagram).

- Officer responded to a civil report of a vehicle issue. RP was having issues with a car dealer in Union Gap and was withholding a current payment until issues were resolved. Dealer repossessed the vehicle in response. This is a civil issue.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 600 block of 6th Street. RP stated that there is a cat in a cage in the back of a pickup truck at the location and they were concerned for the cat. Officers observed the cat and found that the feline had plenty of space and a bowl inside the cage. The cat did not seem at all concerned or distressed in any way.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 1000 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that there was a male wandering around the area yelling (~8pm). RP stated that the yelling male is a resident in the area. The male had gone into his home prior to officer arrival. RP stated that they do not feel threatened by the male.
- Officers responded to a referral from Adult Protective Services at the 1800 block of Benson. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of Memorial Street. RP stated that there is an unwanted subject in the parking lot. A vehicle with 3 males in it were driving around the parking lot and one had become verbal with the RP. He requested that they be asked to leave. They were contacted and moved along.
- Officers responded to a domestic report at the 800 block of Alexander Court. RP stated that there was a domestic situation happening with slamming sounds, crying, and yelling. Officers were able to contact the subjects in the argument and both agreed that neither had become physical, just verbal. The male subject decided to sleep in his car for the evening.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 04 (40 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a vehicle swerving in both lanes on Wine Country Rd/S Wamba Rd. Vehicle refused to stop initially but eventually stopped. Driver was detained on suspicion of DUI and was ultimately booked into BC jail.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 800 block of Ellen Ave. RP stated that his ex was upset and took off. He was concerned that she was ok. Officers were unable to locate the ex and the RP was advised to call if further issues occurred.
- Officer participated in Coffee with a Cop at Sun Terrace.
- Officers responded to a report of graffiti at the 1100 block of Budd Avenue.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless traffic at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle was driving recklessly and almost hit them. Officers were unable to locate.
- Officer responded to a report for information only at the 700 block of Memorial Street. RP stated that her ex was following her around town. She does not have an NCO in place and the ex is scheduled to pick up their common child. She stated that she does not feel safe releasing her child to the ex and was then advised on actions that she could take.
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 300 block of Casi. RP stated that there was a dispute happening at the location. There were three parties involved in the disturbance. All parties were requested to submit statements about what happened (as there were differing stories). Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a civil issue at the 1500 block of Paterson. RP stated that he was supposed to have picked up his daughter from the location but she had already left. The RP was needing assistance contacting his ex or his daughter. His daughter contacted him to say she was with a friend. The RP is concerned that she may call his ex and was concerned about which friend she was with. The RP was advised that this is a civil matter.
- Officer responded to a request for information on donating his vehicle. The CSO will contact the RP about the junk vehicle form.

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1200 block of Bennett Ave. RP stated that there is a male perhaps sleeping between the Eagles Lodge and Burns. This call was split to medics.
- Officers responded to a report of a court order violation. RP stated that their daughter has an NCO on someone and that someone is accessing the daughter through an app on line. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1000 block of Fir Street. RP stated that she picked up a wandering dog from the interstate. She was advised that the officer could not take the dog at this time, but that the CSO should be in the next day.
- Officers responded to a vehicle that had parked at the intersection of Merlot Dr/Port Ave. The driver was out picking roses from a business property. They were moved along.
- Officers responded to a civil issue at the 400 block of North River Rd. RP stated that she is having ongoing custody issues with her ex. She was advised to seek legal counseling for a parenting plan and was given information on filing paperwork at the courthouse.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of Walker Place. RP stated that his daughter showed up wanting money. When she didn't get it, she became irate and started kicking the residence before leaving. Daughter was gone upon arrival of officers. No damage was noted.
- Officers responded to a report of noise violation at the 1100 block of Larch Street. RP stated that a dog had been barking for hours and that the RP would like a text from the officer. As officers don't text, the officer tried calling the RP to no avail. Voicemail had not been set up.
- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 100 block of Spruce Ave. RP stated that a (known) female had come to her door appearing to be under the influence of something, acting very paranoid. The RP told the female to leave and she left in an unknown vehicle. RP was told to call if she shows up again.
- Officer responded to a parking violation at Evans Ave/Brown Street. A semi-truck was parked illegally. The officer pink tagged (warning) the semi.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 05 (49 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1300 block of Grant Avenue. RP stated that a black vehicle had been parked at the location while running for 45 minutes. RP did not recognize the vehicle and it was making her nervous. Officers contacted the driver who was waiting in the running car for a ride to show up. She then left with that person. No crime.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 2200 block of Wine Country Road. False alarm, the food truck was accessing the kitchen and set the alarm off.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at W Old Inland Empire/W Hess Rd. RP stated that there is a vehicle who is all over the roadway headed west bound. Was split to Prosser from BCSO. Vehicle was not found.
- BCSO officer assist for a possible medical issue at Wine Country Road/Alexander Court. Medical not needed. No crime.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at Wine Country Road/North River Road. RP stated that a black Chevy Tahoe had cut them off on the bridge. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the 700 block of Eastgate Drive. RP stated that a vehicle is parked in a dangerous spot at the location. Officer observed the area and noted that vehicles are not being hindered by the parked car. No issues.
- BCSO officer assist with a suspicious circumstance on W North River Road. RP stated that there is an unknown vehicle parked in the area and two males are looking around the area and appear to

- Officers responded to an alarm at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The alarm came from a delivery truck but officers were unable to locate the truck upon arrival.
- Officers responded to a report of a noise violation at the 500 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle was blasting music from his vehicle (9:45 pm). Officers contacted the vehicle and the occupant agreed to keep the music down.
- Officer stopped for a vehicle pulled over at 6th Street and Sherman Ave. Driver had a flat tire. Officer offered assistance with the tire change, which the driver declined needing.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
