## ACTIVITY LOG

### Week of October 06 to October 12, 2023

#### October 06 (37 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a man had come in wanting a refund on chicken from the previous day and after being denied a refund, he threw the leftover chicken at an employee. He then left the business and drove away. RP did not want to press charges but wanted the man trespass. Officers were unable to locate the fowl throwing man.
- Officers responded to a report for information at the 1900 block of Elwood Avenue. RP stated that he had received a threat via the phone threatening to kill him if he didn't send money to them. Officers advised that this type of scam is happening all over the country and that it is important to not send money to people one does not know. Additionally, the officer advised the RP to block the number and to not attempt to contact the phone number that had called.
- BCSO officer assist for a non-injury traffic accident on W Johnson Rd/W CR 12.
- Officer responded to a subject walking along the roadway on Wine Country Road/SR 22. Officer gave the subject a courtesy ride to the gas station.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1100 block of Meade Avenue. RP stated there was a highly intoxicated male in that area that they were concerned about. The male was getting a ride from someone as the officers arrived.
- BCSO officer assist for a hit and run, non-injury accident on W Corral Creek Road/N Whitmore PR NW. A driver had become distracted and driven her car into a telephone pole at the location. She then chose to drive away and was pulled over and charged accordingly.
- Officers responded to a report of a solicitor at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there are a couple in a black Yukon that are driving around the parking lot trying to sell gold jewelry. Officers checked the area but did not locate a black Yukon. Shortly after, officers were advised that the suspect vehicle was a black Cadillac, which officers *were* able to locate. Officers advised occupants to not return to the previous location as per the request of the business employee.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a black Denali is driving around the location asking people for money. The vehicle then left EB on Wine Country Road. Officers were unable to locate the vehicle.
- Officers responded to a report of fireworks at the 900 block of Campbell Drive. RP was informed that the High School was shooting off fireworks this evening.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

#### October 07 (31 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a vehicle was left in the parking lot with a flat tire (since the previous day). RP was advised that they can impound the vehicle should they so desire, at the vehicle owner's expense.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. A male was wandering around the area possibly impaired. Officers were unable to locate the male upon arrival.

- Officers responded to a report of a parking violation at Alexander Court and Paterson Road. Officers noted a semi parked in a residential area, which is prohibited by Prosser Municipal Code (PMC) 10.04.460. Officers contacted a family member of the responsible owner who was advised about the PMC. Additionally, a warning was placed on the driver's side window of the semi.
- Officer responded to another parking violation by the same semi now parked at Evans Avenue/Brown Street. Responsible semi owner said that parking here had never been an issue before. He was reminded of the PMC code (10.04.460) and marked once again for a violation of the parking code.
- Officers responded to a report of a non-injury, two-semi truck collision at the 700 block of Wine Country Road.
- BCSO assist with a report of a shooting on Good Road. No shooting occurred. A juvenile had made the call. No problems were found.
- Officers responded to a weapons report at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that they had seen two males confronting each other in the parking lot and that one male had pulled out a gun and then shoved it into the vehicle (pointing it at the people inside of a vehicle). RP did not hear any discharge of a weapon. Officers located owners of the subject vehicle who stated nothing had happened and that nothing was amiss. No problems were found.
- Officers responded to a report of a domestic violence assault at the 400 block of North River Road. RP stated that while at a birthday party, her ex started fighting with a male that the RP was dancing with and while trying to stop the fighting, her ex had assaulted her. One male was detained for assault and taken to Benton County jail.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## **October 08** (26 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at Scenic Court/Scenic Drive. RP stated that a sedan was blocking traffic at the location. RP also reports that 2 males are walking around the vehicle with flashlights, and the RP did not know what they were doing. Officers contacted the vehicle driver who stated she was 'playing musical cars'. She was advised to make better choices and moved along.
- Officer responded to a welfare check for a 911 hang up. Officers found no issues at the location.
- Officers responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that the vehicle has been at the location all day. Officers noted that the vehicle was parked on private property and did not appear to be damaged. The vehicle was moved approximately 15 minutes later.
- Officers responded to a report of a noise violation at the 1100 block of Larch Street. RP stated that there is a dog barking non-stop and that this is a recurring issue.
- Officer responded to a welfare check for a 911 hang up. Officers contacted the caller and there were no problems.
- Officers responded to a non-injury, semi vs semi traffic accident at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. As this incident was on private property, drivers were advised to exchange information.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## **October 09** (44 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle at the 1400 block of Kinney Way. RP stated that the vehicle has been left there over the weekend. The RP realized it was a friend's vehicle. No issues.

- Officers responded to a report of property lost at the 100 block of Bennett Avenue. RP stated that his father had recently passed away and that a few of his items are now missing, including a firearm. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to a complaint of tall weeds at the 500 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that the weeds at the location were a code violation. Owner at the location advised he is working on the issue.
- Officers responded to an informational report at the 400 block of North River Road. RP stated that a neighbor keeps hitting golf balls onto his property. The officer was able to contact the neighbor who admitted to hitting golf balls towards the river but sometimes hitting them on to the neighbor's yard. He was advised to stop doing that which he agreed to do.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a couple was needing money (which the RP gave them) and they gave him jewelry in exchange.
- BCSO officer assist at the 300 block of Merlot Drive. Officers were checking out a complaint about a transient campsite.
- BCSO officer assist for a report of destruction of property at the 8000 block of N Pleasant Drive. RP stated that his car had been keyed, though he was not sure where it had occurred.
- Officers responded to a non-injury, semi vs auto traffic accident at Eastgate Drive/Highland Drive. Damage was minor and involved parties agreed to work out the information. Soon after, one party requested the officers again as the other party was arguing blame. The RP was advised that this is a civil matter.
- Officers responded to a destruction of property finding at the 1100 block of Market Street. A port-a-potty was once again tipped over, this time damage was noted. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## **October 10** (53 Calls for Service)

- Officers contacted a vehicle engaging in lewd activities at the 400 block of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street (Farrand Park). They were told to move on.
- BCSO officer assist with a traffic hazard on I82. A semi had followed a GPS to enter the freeway but had gone EB on WB lanes. He pulled over and called for assistance. Officers were able to close the freeway momentarily to get the semi on the proper direction of the freeway.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 3000 block of Wittkopf Loop Road. No issues, alarm was canceled.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the Police Department. A delivery driver had located a black terrier dog at NW Farm Supply. The dog had no tags and no chip. Update: owners were found for the friendly pooch.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 900 block of 7<sup>th</sup> Street. RP stated that he was concerned that someone at the location was dealing drugs to his brother. Officers contacted the parties at the location. No issues were found.
- Officers responded to a non-injury traffic accident at Merlot Drive/Chardonnay Avenue.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the Prosser Rest Area. RP stated that males are sleeping in the women's rest room. Call was split to WSP.
- Officers responded to a report of a civil issue at the 100 block of Wamba Road. RP stated that the boyfriend of one of the residents is sneaking into the building at night and staying with the resident. As overnight guests are not allowed at the facility, the staff would like him moved along. Advised staff that this is a civil matter. Male was not contacted.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a male had ridden by the establishment on his bike, looking at the employees and then had come closer to the building. Employees were concerned about going to their cars. Officer was unable to locate the male on the bike. Officer escorted employee to her car.

- Officer responded to an abandoned vehicle on N Grant Street. Officer noted that a vehicle was abandoned and essentially gutted. Officer will attempt to contact the registered owner.
- Officers responded to a call for information. The DOT had removed the election signs (missing from last week) as they were illegally placed. Constituent was contacted about where to pick up the signs.
- Officer responded to a business alarm at the 3000 block of Wittkopf Loop Road. Officers cleared the building. No problems.
- Officers responded to a building alarm at the 2200 block of Wine Country Road. The officers were contacted and told that all was well.
- Officer responded to a report of narcotics at the 100 block of N Wamba Road. This is related to a previous report of an unwelcomed overnight guest. The room of the resident with the unwanted guest now smells of narcotics. RP was advised that as there is no crime, there is no cause for a search warrant at this time.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 600 block of 5<sup>th</sup> Street. RP stated that a female is rummaging through the garbage at the location. RP asked that the female be trespassed from the location, which she was.
- BCSO officer assist with a non-injury, two-vehicle traffic accident on W Johnson Road/W Old Inland Empire Hwy.
- Officer responded to an information report at the 300 block of Casi Court. RP stated that her granddaughter was in a fight outside at the location with two other girls. Medics were called but subject did not want medical assistance. The granddaughter showed the officer a text (from her) inviting the other party to fight with her at her location. As the subject stated it was mutual, no crime took place.
- BCSO officer assist on N Missimer Road for a domestic violence-no assault. The two subjects parted ways for the evening.
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 500 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that he father-in-law was punched in the face multiple times by an unknown person. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 1300 block of Dudley Avenue. RP stated that there is an aggressive pit bull at the location. Officers were unable to find the dog.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1400 block of Kelandren Drive. RP stated that her husband had taken the vehicle and threatened to drive into the river. RP was concerned that he may have. Officers checked around but were unable to locate the husband.

- Officers responded to a civil complaint at the Prosser Police Department. RP state that she wants her boyfriend removed from her house. Officers advised that this is a civil issue as the boyfriend has been living there. RP stated that her boyfriend had shoved her into a car (today). When it was found that the incident had taken place in Grandview, the RP was sent to Grandview to file a report with their police department.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of Petra Avenue. RP stated that there is a loose dog (brown lab possibly) who is frequently loose and is aggressive to people and other

- BCSO officer assist with an animal complaint on W Johnson Road. RP complained of aggressive dogs at the location.
- Officers responded to a report of suicidal threats at the 900 block of Florence Street. RP stated that her daughter had made threats to harm herself while holding a stick. RP also stated that daughter had threatened to hit her dad with the stick. Female in question stated that her mother made the threats up and that she is trying to force her to go to rehab. No crime actually occurred and the female in questions agreed to leave the house with some of her things.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 100 block of Kelandren Drive. RP stated that two dogs were on her property. Officer contacted the owner of the dogs and told them to keep the dogs on their property.
- Officer responded to a request for information at the 900 block of Sheridan Avenue. RP had questions concerning filing a restraining order. RP's questions were answered.
- BCSO officer assist with a non-injury minor traffic accident on W Old Inland Empire Hwy/N Case Road.
- Officers responded to a call concerning a hidden phone at the 900 block of Lillian Street. RP stated that her 14 year old child has a phone that he is hiding from her. RP was informed that this is not a law enforcement matter.
