ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF OCTOBER 09, 2020 TO OCTOBER 15, 2020

OCTOBER 09 (23 Calls for Service)

- Multiple calls received of a suspicious person at PMH. Reports of a male wearing a construction vest, who appeared agitated walking around the area. Officers made contact with a male who was holding a sign and walking along the sidewalk and crosswalk. The male stated he was protesting the hospital due to poor treatment in the past. The male stated he would stay on the sidewalks and not impede anyone's travel.
- Officers responded to a disturbance call in the 1800 block of Benson Ave. Two subjects were arguing over items being left outside of the apartment. Officers recommended they petition the court for no contact orders.
- Information report, Reporting Party (RP) advised one of their employees had used a company credit card in Tri-Cities and Spokane areas without authorization. It was recommended that the RP contact the law enforcement agencies where the purchases took place.
- Information report, RP advised she had left some items, including money at the Holiday Inn after checking out. Her items were mailed to her, but the money was not. Hotel staff was contacted and advised they had not found any money, only the RP's other personal items.
- Traffic accident reported in the 100 block of Kelandren Drive. RP advised a young child accidentally rode her bike into his parked car, causing a dent. RP had already spoken with the child's grandparents and was provided with a case number for insurance purposes.
- Request for a welfare check received in the 900 block of Lillian Street. RP was worried about a female resident because she had not used any electricity for two months. Female was contacted and was found to be fine and not in need of assistance.
- Lobby contact, RP wanted to report her juvenile son as a runaway. It was found the juvenile was last seen in the county, BCSO was advised of the details.
- Dispatch advised of an open 911 line with a child or female screaming before disconnecting. The call came back to the 300 block of Basalt Loop. Officers checked the area of Basalt Loop and North River Road, but were unable to locate any signs of a disturbance.
- Suspicious female reported to be going door to door in the 1900 block of Elwood Ave. Officers made contact with a female in the area who said she was from Sunnyside but has been living in Prosser for the past week. The female stated she was going door to door looking for work. Female agreed to leave the area.
- Officers responded to a disturbance in the 1000 block of Alexander Court. Adult male without a job, was upset because his family wanted him to move out of the house.

OCTOBER 10 (10 Calls for Service)

- Disturbance reported in the 600 block of Wine Country Road. RP advised that a male had hit a female in the face at the location. Officers contacted the female who said the disturbance had been verbal only and that the male had already left the area. Officers found that there was an

active DV no contact order between the two. A citation was issued for the male and was forwarded to the Prosecutor for charging.

- Multi agency assist, BCSO had a pursuit with a RPD burglary/assault/vehicle theft/eluding suspect in Benton City that started to head west. Officers made preparations to assist if the pursuit came into the Prosser area, however the suspect stayed close to Benton City. The male suspect was later arrested by BCSO after taking officers on another pursuit.
- Officers assisted KPD with an arrest of a male located in Prosser who was wanted for harassment charges.

OCTOBER 11 (8 Calls for Service)

- Loitering complaint received in the 200 block of 9th Street. RP advised of people living in a tent outside of a condemned residence and stated that individuals have also been going inside of the residence. The area was checked, but no one was observed inside the house.
- Traffic stop in the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Driver was found to have active warrants. During contact, male admitted to the presence of controlled substances within the vehicle. The vehicle was seized for a search warrant. Multiple items of suspected paraphernalia and narcotics were located. Charges of Meth Possession with intent to deliver were forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office.

OCTOBER 12 (19 Calls for Service)

- Officers observed a male wanted for felony harassment within a vehicle in the area of 6th Street and Prosser Ave. The male was initially uncooperative. After several minutes and instruction, the male got out of the vehicle and onto the ground. The male was highly intoxicated and was transported to PMH for medical clearance before being booked into the Benton County Jail.
- Theft reported in the 1000 block of Elm Street. RP advised his son's green Trek bicycle had just been stolen by a male described as Hispanic, with frizzy hair wearing a maroon shirt and shorts. The male was last seen heading westbound on Bennett Ave. Officers were unable to locate the suspect male.
- Suspicious person reported in the 900 block of Florence Street. RP stated a male and female in a white newer Dodge pickup truck were in the area on 10/11/20. RP thought it was suspicious because the male was going door to door asking to buy trailers. RP believed the male might have been casing the area.
- Report of a possible DUI driver in the Prosser area received. RP advised an intoxicated male was driving a grey Toyota Camry with black rims and no plates. The suspect vehicle was not located.
- Burglary reported at the Prosser Minnie Storage. RP discovered that her lock had been changed on her storage unit. The property owner cut the lock so the RP could gain entry and she found that several expensive items were missing.
- Traffic stop in the area of Anna Street and Evans Ave. Driver was found to have a suspended license. Upon contact, Officer observed suspected drug paraphernalia and narcotics within the vehicle. The vehicle was seized for a search warrant. While executing the warrant, multiple high-end items including luxury purses were located. The victim of the above burglary was contacted and identified many of the items as belonging to her. Drug paraphernalia, suspected narcotics and other possible stolen property was seized from the vehicle. Charges to be forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office for Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, and Narcotics Possession.

OCTOBER 13 (15 Calls for Service)

- Report of a highly intoxicated female at the Holiday Inn. Staff requested she be moved along. The female was located in her underwear on the back side of the hotel. Officer's convinced her to contact family to pick her up and stood by with her until they arrived.

- Suspicious person reported in the 600 block of 7th street. RP advised a male dressed in a full Captain America suit with a POW flag as a cape was walking around down town. The male was contacted and advised he was walking around town in support of "Walk for Firefighters and Homeless Vets" the male said he was waiting for the bus and would be headed to Tri-Cities next.
- Officers recovered the bicycle reported stolen on 10/12 in the 1000 block of Anna Street.
- Suspicious activity reported at McDonald's. RP advised a transient male was spray-painting a bicycle at the location. Officers made contact with the male and determined he was removing paint from a bike that he owned.

OCTOBER 14 (15 Calls for Service)

- Officers assisted SSPD with attempting to locate a vehicle involved in a drive-by shooting in their jurisdiction.
- Allegation of financial exploitation received at Sun Terrace. The alleged victim was contacted and advised the Officer that no exploitation was occurring.
- Hit and run report received in the 300 block of Merlot Drive. RP advised their vehicle was parked and had been struck by an unknown vehicle sometime within the last few days.
- Trespass complaint received at Whitstran Steaks and Spirits. RP advised a male had been cutting through the property on his way to the alley and it was making the outdoor guests uncomfortable. RP also stated the male had been caught pilfering through items at the back of the business. RP was advised to call when it is occurring so a trespass order can be issued and given to the male.
- Attempted burglary reported in the 800 block of Alexander Court. RP advised unknown subjects attempted to gain entry to her apartment on 09/20 while she was out of town. Officers found signs of damage to the RP's door, doorframe, and lock.
- Possible no contact order violation in the 1000 block of Fir Street. RP received text messages from who she believed to be from her ex-boyfriend. The texts consisted of threats to harm her and her children. Investigation is ongoing.

OCTOBER 15 (23 Calls for Service)

- Suspicious person reported in the 800 block of Alexander Court. RP stated a female was sitting in his parking space and was acting oddly. He stated she was spouting out random information and numbers. Officers made contact with the RP and female and determined no crime had occurred. Both were advised to avoid each other and go about their night.
- Suspicious persons reported in the 500 block of North River Road. Officers made contact with a male and female and warned them about trespassing.
- Suspicious item reported at Keene-Riverview Elementary. RP advised a backpack had been left on a bench outside of the building all morning. The backpack was determined to belong to a staff member who had misplaced it.
- Disturbance reported in the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. Disturbance appeared to be a verbal only argument over child custody issues. No specific address or call back number was provided to the Dispatcher and no disturbance was located when officers checked the area.
- Suspicious circumstances reported near the Grant Street Bridge. RP called saying a man in a white van had stopped and tried asking her 11-year-old son where a good place to fish was. RP said that her son backed away and when he took out his phone, saying he was going to call the police the man turned around and got in his van and drove off. The vehicle was described as a newer Chevy van white in color. Officers checked the area, but did not find anything.
- Information received in the 300 block of Chardonnay Ave. RP stated that a female that has a no contact order against him keeps showing up at his place of employment, trying to get him fired. The manager of the business said the female was in the parking lot and every time the RP would come back from a delivery, she would give him a bad time. The RP advised he knows he is not to

have contact with the female, but was unsure of what to do. RP was told that he could get an order against her, prohibiting her from contacting him.

- Suspicious circumstances reported in the 300 block of Gap Road. RP called saying a door to the business was standing wide open. Officers cleared the building and noticed three other doors had been left unlocked. Nothing in the store looked to be disturbed. Officers secured the building and notified the manager of the situation.
