ACTIVITY LOG

Week of October 13 to October 19, 2023

October 13 (42 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 900 block of Market Street. RP reported that someone had knocked on her door and then run off (ding-dong-ditching). The subject was recorded on RP's video wearing a mask and a hoodie. The subject then left in a car. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate the subject.
- Officer responded to a request for information at the 1200 block of Meade Avenue. RP wondered at what time she could begin using a leaf blower in the morning so as not to violate the noise ordinance. Officer advised her that the noise ordinance is in effect from 10pm-7am each day.
- Officers responded to a report of narcotics at 6th Street/Dudley Avenue. RP stated that a male in a dark vehicle appeared to be smoking something out of a glass pipe. Officer was unable to locate the subject.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of New Gate Drive. RP stated that neighbors at the location were being verbal, slamming doors, being loud. No problems found.
- Officer responded to a report of a traffic hazard at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there was a male wandering/running around in the road, seeming a bit unaware and the RP is concerned that he will get hit by a car. Officers spoke to the male who stated that he did not need medical assistance. He was advised to stay out of the road.
- Officer responded to a report of information on Molly Rose Court. RP stated that her child and her child's friend were the ones who were ding-dong-ditching from an earlier incident. She was advised to speak with her children concerning the dangers of pranking people. She was understanding and apologetic for her child's actions.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at Wine Country Road/Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that a blue Audi was swerving and speeding down the median. Officer was unable to locate the vehicle.
- Officer responded to a 911 hang up at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. Contact was made with the caller. No problems were found.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 100 block of N Wamba Road. No issues found.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at North River Road/Petra Ave. A pit bull was in the roadway. The owner was contacted and advised to keep the dog on their property.
- Officers responded to a parking violation at Petra Avenue/Basalt Loop. Officer noticed a vehicle illegally parked in a no parking zone. A written warning was placed on the windshield.
- Officers responded to a destruction of property at the 1100 block of Market Street. Officer noted that a port-a-potty had once again been knocked over. A passerby had witnessed two juveniles in the area approximately 30 minutes prior. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a 3 car collision at Wine Country Road/S Wamba Road. Cars 1 and 2 were stopped for an officer passing with lights on, car 3 ran into the back of car number 2, which then hit car number 1. Minor injuries.
- Officers responded to a noise complaint at the 1100 block of Larch Street. RP reported that a dog is barking constantly. Officer contacted a resident where the barking dog was at, provided her a copy of Prosser Municipal Code 6.16.105. She was advised to stop the dog's barking.
- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check. RP stated that his gf has been sick and she is not answering her phone. Officer checked on her and she was fine.

- Officers noted an illegally parked vehicle at the 1200 block of 5th Street, during regular patrols. During the check of the vehicle, they noted 2 persons inside, one of which was a male with a nco for the other person in the car, a female. As this was a violation of the nco, the male was arrested and booked into BC jail.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 14 (43 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a request for assistance at Riverside Drive/Wine Country Road. Some kids were fishing and caught what may be a record small mouth bass and wanted an officer to see it. They requested and were given information on how to submit a record smallmouth bass (the record in WA for a smallmouth bass is 8.75 lbs). The individuals were wanting to talk to the Dept of Fish and Wildlife, but they were not open.
- Officers responded to a weapon report at the 800 block of Brown Street. RP stated that they heard a single gunshot. Officers checked the area, but no gunshots were heard.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of suspicious circumstances on W Old Inland Empire Hwy. RP stated that two females had knocked on the door and when the RP did not answer, the females started rummaging through the RPs shed. When the RPs husband went outside, the two females stated they were looking for a gas can. They then took off in their vehicle, speeding towards Prosser. RP wants them trespassed. Officers were unable to locate the females.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a man in a gray Chevy Tahoe had asked the RP to pull over at the location. RP stated that the man pretended like he was broken down to get her attention. The RP recognized this as a possible scam so did not pull over, but she wanted the officers to be aware of the incident.
- EMS Officer assistance at the 300 block of Port Avenue A.
- WBFD officer assist with a grass and fence fire at the 1300 block of Wine Country Road. It appears a gas tank caught a fence and surrounding grass on fire. Officers assisted with traffic control.
- Officers responded to a report of a parking violation at the 900 block of Margaret Street. RP stated that an RV is blocking the entire alley and appears to be parked there (not running). Officer contacted the owner of the RV at the location and advised that the RV needed to be moved.
- WSP officer assist on SR22 for a DUI arrest.
- Officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstances at the 1500 block of Bennett Avenue. RP stated that there is a vehicle parked on a dead end road close to the railroad tracks (this is a posted no trespassing area). RP did not know if the vehicle was occupied. An officer checked the vehicle which was occupied by a male and a female and a very strong odor of marijuana. The female chose to walk away while the male was released to his parent.
- Officers responded to a report of a domestic violence assault at the 1900 block of Miller Avenue. A male was taken into custody and booked into BC jail.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 15 (36 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1800 block of Wine Country Road. RP said her friend had made some statements that had caused concern. Incident was split to medics.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic accident on I82. A sedan had blown a tire and the vehicle skidded through a sign at the location. Driver declined medical. Split to WSP.

- Officer responded to a civil issue at the 1800 block of Benson Avenue. RP stated that their landlord entered the property without notification and removed property. Officer attempted to contact the RP multiple times to no avail. The RP later called and canceled the report.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Concord Way/Kinney Way. RP stated that there is an aggressive dog near the location that had attempted to attack her dog (who was on a leash). The RP was concerned that the dog may bite a child. An officer did not locate the dog outside. No crime at this time, but the officer will pass on information to the CSO.
- BCSO officer assist for a non-injury traffic accident on I82. Split to WSP.
- Officer responded to a report of property lost at the 600 block of 6th Street. RP stated that they had lost a ring from his pocket at some point during the evening.
- Officer responded to a report of a one vehicle, non-injury traffic accident on W Johnson Road/N Missimer Road. Vehicle was traveling on Johnson with a heavy trailer load. The driver lost control of the load and left the road hitting a fence (minor damage).
- Officer responded to an informational call about a damaged 'road closed' sign on Kinney Way/Park Ave. The RP moved the sign out of the road, but wanted officers to be aware.
- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving on I82 via WSP. RP stated that a white Ford truck was swerving all over the road. Officers were told the vehicle took the first exit to Prosser, but the vehicle was not located.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 16 (36 Calls for Service)

- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving on SR 22. Advised by WSP that RP stated that a driver had attempted to race the RP and almost hit other cars. Officer located the vehicle but did not witness any reckless driving.
- Officer responded to a traffic hazard on Market Street/SR 22. As a vehicle was towing another vehicle, the towing strap broke, leaving one vehicle in the lane of travel. No injuries.
- Officers responded to a medical incident at the 900 block of Anna Street. Split to EMS.
- BCSO officer assist with an alarm on Snipes Road. A security company had observed an individual in a red hood attempting entry at the location. Officers were unable to locate the individual upon arrival.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint on Wine Country Road/N Albro Road. RP stated that they had hit a small dog. They stated that the dog had not been on a leash and they were unable to stop in time. Officer was unable to find an injured dog in the area despite checking twice. He did, however find a dead rooster in the area that appeared to have been recently deceased.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless traffic at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that a Honda Civic was brake-checking, throwing items at the RPs vehicle, and causing problems resulting in people honking at them. Officers were unable to locate the Civic.
- Officer responded to a report of a phone nuisance/scam at the 200 block of Bratton Street. RP stated that someone had contacted his spouse saying that he was under investigation by the Prosser Police Department. He wanted to make sure that he wasn't. A similar incident happened a few years ago to this RP. He was assured that as far as the officer knows, we are not currently investigating him.
- Officer responded to a report of fraud at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that her debit card was being fraudulently used at Harvest Foods. She had already reported it stolen to her local police department but wanted our department to know that it was being used here in Prosser. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of information at Grant Avenue/6th Street. RP stated that there are 2 males walking in the area that are wearing orange vests and carrying clip boards. RP stated that they are concerned as the males are looking into the back of people's vehicles. Officer

contacted the males who had business company equipment. The males stated they are canvassing neighborhoods for damage inspections. No problems found.

- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at OIE and Wamba Road. RP stated that there is a male laying in the road and moving around. When he stood up, he did not appear to be hurt. Cars were having to swerve around him. Officers contacted the male who stated that he had been looking for his earbud. He was advised to refrain from laying in the road.
- Officer responded to a report of a phone nuisance/scam. RP stated that a Facebook scam had fraudulently taken money from her. RP stated that she has reported the account, contacted her bank, and canceled her debit card.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 17 (43 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 200 block of Merlot Drive. RP stated that a male had called the Veterans crisis center stating that he may have taken too much of his medication. Officers contacted RP who stated that the male is fine and does not need assistance.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 1000 block of 5th Street. Officers attempted to contact the RP multiple times to no avail (also, no message was left as phone mailbox was full). RP called again and stated that a rifle was stolen out of her son's vehicle. No forced entry as the window was open. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 1100 block of Dudley Avenue. RP stated that there is a female in a car at the location who is hunched over and acting strangely. Officers contacted the female who stated that she is just waiting for people who are in the courthouse. The officer noticed that the vehicle was parked illegally and told her that the vehicle needs to be parked legally. Someone came out and re-parked the vehicle.
- Officers responded to a destruction of property report at the 1000 block of Parker Court. RP stated that there are multiple areas of graffiti in the alleyway at the location.
- Officer responded to a loose black male German shepherd at the 1900 block of Benson Avenue. The dog had no tags or microchip. Lost dog was posted on Facebook.
- Officers responded to a report of information at the 1300 block of Sommers Ave (City Park). RP stated that a middle-school aged male was smoking (marijuana) in the city park bathroom. Officer contacted the male and did not smell marijuana on him. No issues at this time.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at Grant Avenue/10th Street. RP stated that there is a small, white husky dog running around at the location. Officer was unable to locate the dog upon arrival.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1300 block of Meade Avenue. A chocolate lab was running around the area. Officer contacted the owner and advised them to keep their dog on their property.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at the 1100 block of Wine Country Road. RP stated that there is a truck that was left in the parking lot. Keys were in the ignition and tools were in it. The local businesses were not aware of anyone belonging to the truck. RP was concerned that it was stolen. Officers checked the vehicle. It was not stolen.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 18 (38 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officers assist with a report of a hit and run (non-injury) accident at Wine Country Road/S Wamba Road. RP stated that a vehicle rear-ended her and then took off. Another RP called in saying that she had spotted the vehicle that had taken off. Subject vehicle was not located before continuing north on OIE. The license plate was noted and the investigation is ongoing.

- Officer responded to a request for a welfare check at 7th Street/Meade Avenue. RP stated that there is a Gold Honda CRV in the area that has a small child inside who is unattended. The vehicle is running and the child is not in distress, but it had been parked there for app 30 minutes. The car was gone upon officer arrival.
- Officer responded to a report of a broken vehicle window at the 800 block of Myrtle. RP stated that her vehicle window was broken and that she suspected perhaps it was flying rocks from a neighbor's lawn mower. The neighbor denied knowledge of broken window. RP was advised that this is a civil matter.
- Officer responded to the previous graffiti markings incident by painting over them.
- Officer responded to a report of a burglary at the 1200 block of Prosser Avenue (the old high school). RP stated that a group of students broke into the building and heavily vandalized the classrooms. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at CR 12/W Hoisington Road. RP was concerned about his mother who was having some issues. The mother was given a ride back to the son.
- Officers responded to a report of reckless driving at the 1800 block of Highland Drive. RP stated that there are two vehicles that are speeding through the neighborhood, then slowing down, then flashing their lights. Officers checked the area but did not locate the vehicles in question.
- BCSO officer assist for suspicious circumstances at Gap Road/Huard Road. RP stated that she saw a van in the area and due to recent burglaries, RP was concerned about it. Everything checked out, as the van was security for the orchard.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

October 19 (42 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run (non-injury) accident at the 800 block of Park Avenue. RP stated that their vehicle was hit but they are not sure when or where it occurred. This is an informational report only at this point.
- EMS officer assist with a medical issue at the 1500 block of Paterson Road.
- Officers responded to a report of found property. A citizen brought in a bicycle that they found at the on-ramp to I82. Bicycle is currently at the police department.
- Officers responded to a non-injury, two-vehicle traffic accident at the 500 block of Wine Country Road. Parties exchanged information.
- Officers responded to a report of an animal complaint at the 1200 block of Grant Ave. An owl was squatting in a bay at the location and officers helped to remove the owl and then release it in the wild.
- Officers responded to a non-injury, two vehicle traffic accident at Chardonnay Avenue/Wine Country Road. One driver was following another too closely and was unable to stop prior to hitting the other car. Both cars were towed from the scene.

RP stated that there is a dark Jeep type vehicle parked near the mailboxes occupied by three individuals. RP was unable to get the license plate but was concerned about going to the mailboxes. Officer was unable to locate the vehicle upon arrival.
- BCSO officer assist with a three-car, injury traffic accident. One male was arrested following the incident on suspicion of DUI.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a traffic hazard at N Griffin Road/W King Tull Road. A horse was running in the roadway. Officers attempted to contain the horse which was eventually captured by the owners.
