ACTIVITY LOG

WEEK OF December 30, 2022 to December 05, 2023

December 30 (15 Calls for Service)

- Malicious mischief reported on the 1400 block of Meade Ave, the RP advised he believed a neighbor had punctured one of his tires and had been stalking him. The RP advised there was no proof that his neighbor had actually caused the damaged to the tire. Officers advised the RP he could petition the court for a no-contact order.
- Loitering at McDonald's, staff advised a male was at the business all day begging staff and customers for money. The subject was asked to leave the premise, he complied and left the area.
- Disturbance reported on the 600 block of New Gate, the RP advised her and her son were arguing because her son isn't supposed to drive but he had taken her car anyway. During the argument her son threw her phone at her and damaged it. The male was transported to Benton County Jail due to warrants and for malicious mischief.

December 31 (20 Calls for Service)

- Stolen vehicle reported on the 1200 block of Kinney Way, the RP advised he turned on his vehicle with the car fob so it could warm up, the vehicle was on for a few minutes when it was stolen. The vehicle was recovered within Prosser, a few days later and was returned to the registered owner.
- Order violation reported on the 900 block of Margaret Street, the RP advised her boyfriend was outside of her residence and advised there was a no contact order in place. Officers advised the RP, there is not a no-contact order, but was advised to petition the court for a no-contact order.
- Noise complaint on the 1000 block of Alexander Drive, multiple calls received regarding loud music from a residence. Officers checked the area and did locate the residence playing music but it was not excessively loud, the calls were also received prior to the noise ordinance time frame. The residence was advised of the noise ordinance.
- Assist EMS on the 900 block of 6th Street, dispatch advised a female was unconscious at the residence. Officers and EMS made contact with the female who became conscious and became verbal with officers and medics and advised she did not require assistance. No further contact was made.

January 01 (07 Calls for Service)

- Suspicious vehicle reported at Minnie Storage, the RP advised they had seen a vehicle at the location with a car door open and a storage unit was half open. Officers contacted the male, who was renting the storage unit. No further issues arose.

January 02 (15 Calls for Service)

- Stolen vehicle reported on the 900 Alexander Court, the RP advised she left her car warming up and went inside to get her purse, when the RP returned, the vehicle was gone. A few hours later a traffic stop was conducted in the area of Wine Country Road and 6th Street on the vehicle due to reckless driving and it being stolen. Officers made contact with the suspect who was arrested

for being in possession of a stolen vehicle and for attempting to elude. The registered owner arrived and retrieved her vehicle. The suspect was transported to Benton County Jail.

- Theft reported on the 1500 block of Paterson Road, the RP advised a few tool boxes and tools were missing from the back of his truck. Officers are investigating this incident.

January 03 (15 Calls for Service)

- Welfare check requested in the area of Yakima Ave and Guernsey Street, the RP advised she saw a small child with a backpack and thought he was possibly trying to hitchhike. Officers made contact with the child, who advised he was walking to school. Officers advised the child there was no school until the following day. The child returned home.
- Accident reported in the area of 6th Street and Stacy Ave, a pedestrian was struck by a vehicle due to the driver failing to yield. Officers made contact with the elderly driver who advised she did not see the female due to poor eyesight. The pedestrian was evaluated by medics and was transported to Kadlec Hospital. The driver was picked up by a family member, who was also informed of the situation.

January 04 (18 Calls for Service)

- Loitering at the post office, an officer was flagged down by someone at the post office who advised a male was inside the post office and was worried because the male was walking up and down and learning back and forth. Officers made contact with the male who advised he was fine, the male left the area. No further issues arose.
- Theft reported at Harvest Foods, The RP advised the suspect was in line to pay for a soda and donuts when he decided to get out of the line and walked out of the store without paying. Officers are investigating this incident.
- Accident reported in the area of Kinney Way and Evans Ave, the RP advised her car slid due to road conditions and she had hit someone's fence. Officers arrived and inspected the damages and contacted the owner of the fence. The damages to the fence and vehicle were minor that both parties agreed to settle the damages amongst themselves.

January 05 (16 Calls for Service)

- Dumping reported at Jubilee Ministries, the RP advised a former volunteer had dumped a lot of trash in front of the dumpster. The RP advised he wanted officers to be aware of this incident.
- Animal complaint reported on the 1100 block of Sheridan, the RP stated there have been various cats and skunks in the area, and advised the feral cats have been attacking any skunks that come onto her property and are making her home smell bad. The resident advised another resident in the area has multiple cats and has been feeding and maintaining the feral cats. The CSO made contact with the residence and noticed an abundance of food left out of the porch and makeshift shelters. The resident was contacted who advised she did not own any cats and stated the food and shelters had been placed there by another person. The resident was informed for the new city ordinance prohibiting the feeding of feral animals.
- Domestic disturbance of the 1800 block of Highland Drive, the RP advised a female at the location was being hit by her husband. Officers made with the female involved who advised the male had already left the area. Officers spoke with the female who denied any assault or crime had occurred, the female did admitted that there had been yelling and her phone had been thrown by the male. The female advised she did not want to be a victim and ended contact with officers.
