ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF APRIL 24, 2020 TO APRIL 30, 2020

APRIL 24 (23 calls for service)

- Strong arm robbery in the 1300 block of Wine Country Rd. Reporting Party (RP) advised the male suspect reached into the cash register and grabbed cash out of the open register. The suspect fled and RP was able to give a vague description of the suspect. Officers contacted a male subject in the Grant Ave area but the male did not fit the description given to officers by dispatch. After reviewing the video footage, officers determined the male subject they contacted was indeed their suspect. The officers did an area check and many house contacts that resulted with negative results. The suspect was later detained and booked to jail on 04/26/2020.
- A disturbance occurred in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP stated that she believed a female subject was trying to run her over with her vehicle. The female subject was contacted by officers.
- Parking complaint in the 400 block of Wine Country Rd. RP advised of a small delivery truck partly blocking the driveway. The vehicle was impounded after attempts were made to contact the owner but were unsuccessful.
- A Hit and Run occurred in the N Gap Rd and Mccreadie Rd area. Several RP's advised there was a vehicle that was driving recklessly. Officers were able to catch up to the driver. The male subject was arrested for multiple warrants and suspicion of DUI. The case was transferred over to Washington State Patrol (WSP).
- Suspicious vehicle in the Petra Ave and Basalt loop area. RP stated a vehicle had been driving slowly through the area. RP thought the vehicle could be connected to the vandalism happening in the area. The vehicle was no longer in the area at Officer's arrival.
- Officers assisted Benton County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) on a weapons call in the PR NW area. RP advised of 5 to 6 gun shots and lights going on and off in a building. When officers arrived to the area they heard more gunshots but there were no other vehicles present in the area. The officers made contact with residents near the building who said they heard the shots but stated it is not uncommon to hear the shots and that they don't know where they come from. Officers checked the surrounding areas and determined the area clear after no further shots were heard.

APRIL 25 (15 calls for service)

- A disturbance was reported in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. RP advised he heard people screaming in an alley and could see someone holding on to a vehicle door and later on standing in front of the vehicle. When officers arrived, they found a female subject had backed up into a fence, damaging her car bumper. No injuries or other damages were reported.
- Disturbance call in the 1000 block of Market St. RP advised of juveniles skateboarding on her property. When she asked them to stop, the juveniles responded with profane language. RP wished for juveniles to be trespassed when located. The juveniles were no longer in the area when officers arrived.
- A complaint about a party taking place in the area of Evans Ave. RP was concerned the party goers were not following current safe distancing guidelines. An officer drove by the location and determined there were less than 10 people and were all reported to be family.

APRIL 26 (6 calls for service)

- Two German Shepherds were found in the 400 block of Nunn Rd. RP stated the two dogs arrived onto their property wearing a leash. The dogs did not appear to be aggressive and RP decided to keep the dogs tied up until the Community Service Officer (CSO) could go out on Monday.
- A Suspicious vehicle was reported in the 1000 block of Sadie St. RP advised there was a vehicle parked in the alley with three males hanging around in the area. It was found the vehicle belonged to someone visiting a residence and the owner moved the vehicle from the alley.
- An Animal problem was reported in the 1000 block of Alice St. A pit bull jumped the fence and attacked a dog that was being walked down the street. The pit bull also bit and scratched the other dog's owner. The information was forwarded to CSO.

APRIL 27 (14 calls for service)

- Fraud report in the Playfield Ave area. RP stated that two unauthorized withdrawals were made using his Xoom account. RP had already reported to his bank who was already investigating the incident. RP was given his case number and advised to file a report with Internet Crimes Complaint Center (IC3).
- Report of a hit and run in the 400 block of N River Rd. When officers arrived, they determined it to be a parked car door hitting another parked vehicle. This was determined to be a civil issue.

APRIL 28(16 calls for service)

- Welfare check in the Wine Country Rd and Wamba Rd area. RP advised of an older male who appeared to be staggering on the sidewalk. The officers determined the male had just been released from the hospital. The male was given a ride to his house.
- RP advised a male subject had damaged his laptop in the 1400 block of Wine Country Rd. The male subject was contacted and cited for Malicious Mischief in the 2nd degree.
- Suspicious circumstance in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP was worried because she believed money was missing from her bank account. RP's daughter was contacted and she advised she would look into the situation.
- Reckless driving was reported in the OIE HWY and Wamba Rd area. RP advised his car was almost hit by another vehicle that was swerving on the road. The RP advised it seemed as if the driver was falling asleep while parked in the middle of the road. The officers made contact and arrested the female driver for DUI.
- Officers assisted BCSO with a welfare check in the N Gap Rd and N Wamba Rd. area after a 911 call came in and disconnected. The officers were unable to locate the RP and tried calling back but the call went straight to a voicemail that was not set up.

APRIL 29 (9 calls for service)

- Theft reported in the 1900 block of Highland Dr. RP advised his vehicle's rear license plate had been stolen. The RP was able to provide the license plate number to officers and was advised to remove remaining plate and contact the Department of Licensing (DOL) for replacements.
- Welfare check in the 900 block of Kinney Way. RP advised of a person laying in the grass with his shoes lying next to him. RP was unsure if the person was breathing or conscious at all since he had been laying in that area for a long time. Officers made contact and determined the male was just taking a nap. Officers advised the male to move along since he was scaring people; the male agreed and left the area.
- Hit and Run in the 6th St and Wine Country Rd area. RPs vehicle was struck from behind by another vehicle. The suspect vehicle initially stopped and pulled along side the victim vehicle. The male driver asked the victims if they were hurt, then apologized and fled the scene. Officers were unable to verify the address on the registration, and the victim's description of the suspect did not match the description of the registered owner of the suspect vehicle.

APRIL 30 (18 calls for service)

- A loose Calf was reported in the area of Merlot Dr. RP advised he did not know the calf's owner but thought it belonged in a nearby pasture. The officer was able to get the calf back into the pasture safely.
- A Runaway was reported in the 1000 block of Alexander Ct. RP advised her 17 year old son had told her the night before that he was going to church but he never returned. The RP tried calling him and got worried after he wouldn't answer her calls. The juvenile showed up back to his house later in the day
- A disturbance was reported in the 1200 block of Bennett Ave. RP advised of a male who was throwing items at cars. The officers contacted the male who confessed to throwing some rocks and breaking a flower pot. The owner of the flower pot did not wish to press charges but the male was later sent a citation from Richland for throwing rocks at cars. The male was escorted onto a bus to Yakima and left the city limits.
- Medical Assist in the 800 block of Ellen Dr. RP advised he took muscle relaxers for pain but began to feel strange. RP believed he had overdosed on the pills. EMS arrived and assisted the RP but determined he did not need to go to the hospital.
