ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF MAY 15, 2020 TO MAY 21, 2020

MAY 15 (18 calls for service)

- A fraud was reported in the 900 block of Alexander Ct. the Reporting Party (RP) advised someone had used their personal information to claim unemployment. The RP was referred to the State Employment Office.
- A noise complaint in the 600 block of Ellen Ave. Officers arrived and determined the music was not audible from the street or the alley behind the home and found no other issues.
- Suspicious activity was reported in the 600 block of Merlot Dr. RP advised of smelling cigarette smoke around the area while trying to go home from work. Officers arrived and checked the area but found no suspicious activity or persons.

MAY 16 (7 calls for service)

- Welfare check in the 800 block of Market St. A child was heard playing with a cell-phone before a female grabbed the phone. The female advised there was no emergency and that the child had accidentally called the emergency number while trying to unlock the phone.
- Disturbance call in the 800 block of Myrtle St. RP advised an intoxicated male was upset because he wanted to leave and his family did not want him to drive due to his intoxication level. When officers arrived, they were able to de-escalate the situation. The male party calmed down and agreed to stay at his family's home, and went to bed at the location.
- A hit and run in the Wine Country Rd and North River Rd area. RP advised of a suspect vehicle that had struck another vehicle and then proceeded to drive away. Officers checked the surrounding areas for the suspect vehicle but it was no longer in the area.

MAY 17 (9 calls for service)

- A business alarm was triggered in the 100 block of Merlot Dr. It was later determined a delivery semi truck was unloading at the location. No other issues were found.
- A disturbance was reported in the 1100 block of Yakima Ave. RP advised of a female yelling at someone. When the officers arrived, the female did not want to talk to officers. No crime was determined.

MAY 18 (27 calls for service)

- A suspicious circumstance in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. RP advised he smelled cigarette smoke outside of his house and thought it might be his father who is not allowed on the property. When officers arrived, they checked the area but found nobody else on the property or anything suspicious.
- Officers assisted with a male on the ground in the Gap Rd and Wine Country Rd area. RP advised the male was riding his bike when suddenly he veered into the grass and collapsed on the ground. A Washington State Patrol (WSP) officer performed CPR while medics arrived. The male was breathing again and was transported to the hospital.
- Officers did a welfare check on a male that appeared to be throwing up in the area of Gap Rd and Wine Country Rd. The RP advised the male got into a truck and drove away. An area check was performed but the male was no longer in the area.
- Disturbance in the 1200 block of Bennett Ave. RP advised his girlfriend and he had gotten into an argument prompting him to throw her purse outside. The female party then stated that she was upset and began yelling at her boyfriend. Officers advised about No Contact Orders (NCO) but both parties turned it down. The female said she just wanted to get home and was given a courtesy ride while the male drove himself home to Toppenish.
- A fraud was reported in the 900 block of Campbell Dr. RP advised someone is collecting unemployment money under his name. The RP was given a case number and was advised to contact the unemployment office.
- A child's bike was located on Byron Rd near the river. RP requested officers check the area since she was worried a child may have fallen into the river. Officers did not notice anything in the water and only found a child's bike toy. Officers determined that bike had been there for approximately a week.

MAY 19 (26 calls for service)

- Unemployment fraud in the 1100 block of Walker Place. RP advised someone was using her information to claim unemployment. She was advised to contact the unemployment office.
- Disturbance in the 1400 block of Grant Ave. Two females went to a family's house in order to collect a jersey from a recently deceased person and visit the family. The two females made negative comments about the deceased person causing the family to become angry and ask the females to leave their home. Both parties became verbal. When officers arrived, both families were advised of NCO's, but both decided they would just stay away from each other's homes. No other issues found.
- Med assist in the 1400 block of Riverside Dr. A female hit her head on a birdbath when she attempted to walk with a plate of food outside of her apartment. When officers arrived, they determined the female was highly intoxicated and she was then taken to the hospital.
- Unemployment fraud in the 900 block of Lillian St. RP advised her personal information was being used to claim unemployment. Officers gave her a case number and advised her to contact the unemployment office.
- Verbal disturbance in the area of Colena St. RP advised of a male and female arguing in their car while another male poured liquid from a clear container onto the ground. When officers arrived the vehicle was no longer in the area. The vehicle was later located but no other issues were found.
- Unemployment fraud in the 600 block of Guernsey St. RP advised she was contacted about an unemployment claim. She was advised to contact the unemployment office and was given a case number.
- Verbal disturbance in the 1400 block of Sheridan Ave. RP advised he could hear someone screaming and then heard banging sounds. When the officers made contact, the male suspect advised he had disciplined his daughter. Officers made contact with the male's daughter and determined she was ok. The male apologized for the noise.

- Civil dispute in the 1800 block of Wine Country Rd. RP advised his manager was having his vehicle towed due to him parking in a spot that is not his but is always unoccupied. When officers arrived, no other issues were found and both parties were advised it was a civil matter.
- A business alarm went off in the 1000 block of Meade Ave. When officers arrived, it was determined that it was the janitors and no issues were found.
