ACTIVITY LOG WEEK OF MAY 22, 2020 TO MAY 28, 2020

MAY 22 (29 calls for service)

- A Domestic call was answered in the 600 block of New Gate Dr. The reporting party (RP) advised she was getting verbal with her son and it escalated. She then told officers the male had a knife and she was able to take it away from him. When officers arrived, they took the male into custody. No injuries were reported.
- Officers answered six fraud calls. The RPs advised their personal information was being used to claim unemployment. The RPs were given a case number and advised they contact the unemployment office.
- Personal property was turned in after it was left behind at a local business. Nobody claimed the property in the month that the establishment had it therefore the business's manager decided to turn it in to the police.

MAY 23 (17 calls for service)

- A call was made advising there was a suspicious person sitting at a park bench with a flashlight. The RP advised he couldn't describe the person since it was dark. When officers arrived, they contacted the subject and determined it was a male who was catching worms for fishing.
- A fraud was reported in the 1000 block of Brown St. The RP advised that an unemployment and two retirement claims were filed using her personal information. Officers gave her a case number and advised that she keep an eye on her credit cards and bank accounts, and to contact the unemployment office.
- A theft occurred in the 600 block of Merlot Dr. The RP advised she observed two males run out with a cart full of various items. The two males then loaded those items into a vehicle parked outside the business and immediately drove away. When officers arrived, the vehicle was no longer in the area.
- A report of a dog attack in the 1900 block of Benson Ave. RP advised that a dog left the yard and attacked his two dogs while he was walking them. Officers attempted to contact the owners but were not able to. This case was referred to the Community Service Officer (CSO).
- An abandoned vehicle was reported in the 1000 block of Market St. RP advised there was a vehicle that had been parked on the street for over a month and had eggs all over it. When officers arrived, they determined the vehicle was not abandoned and was parked in front of the residence it is registered to. Officers tried to contact the owners but had no results, no other issues were found.
- RP came into the police department because she was concerned she had gotten a counterfeit fifty-dollar bill. Officers advised that she take the bill to the bank to determine its authenticity.

MAY 24 (20 calls for service)

- Suspicious circumstance in the 700 block of Cherry Ln. An Officer drove by the property and saw a lot of stuff on the lawn and the doors open on the vehicles out front with no one around. The Officer made contact with the homeowners and they advised they were just packing for a trip. No further issues were determined.
- Officers assisted a disabled vehicle in the area of OIE HWY and Steele Rd. The vehicle was blocking traffic after getting a flat tire. The officer assisted with changing the car tire and no further issues were found.
- Birthday drive by in the 1500 block of Sheridan Dr. A 4 year old's birthday was spruced up just a little more when three patrol vehicles came by with lights on.
- Disturbance near the 1300 block of Sommers Ave. RP called saying he saw two people fighting. Officers made contact with a male and female and they both said that they were just playing around. Both parties were advised to be mindful of their behavior while out in public. No further issues were found.
- Debit card fraud in the 400 block of Petra Ave. RP advised there was fraud on her ex-husband's debit card as well as her own card. The RP contacted her bank who is also helping her with this case.

- A female tried paying for items with counterfeit money. After the employee realized it was fake, she asked the female to pay with real cash. The female paid with real money for the items and turned in the rest of the fake money to the employee who then reported it to officers. No other issues were found.
- Officers assisted with an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) call in the 300 block of Wine Country Rd. An Officer was flagged down by a citizen who explained that her fiancé was having real bad chest pains. EMS was dispatched and they transported the male to Prosser Memorial Hospital (PMH).
- An alarm call in the 300 block of Merlot Dr. Officers arrived on scene, checked the building, and determined it was secure. No further issues were found.
- Extra patrol was requested in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. The RP advised she is currently remodeling a house and left a wheelbarrow with some materials in it. She was worried due to the thefts in the area that her things might be stolen and requested extra patrol in the area.

MAY 25 (8 calls for service)

- Animal complaint in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP stated a male had hit a dog multiple times to keep it from barking. When the officer arrived, he contacted the residence but was advised there were no dogs on or in the residence.
- Civil dispute in the Merlot Dr area. RP advised she had filed a report with the Richland Police Department over a stolen generator. Her ex-husband who she claims stole the generator was parked in the area with the generator on the back of his truck. The male claimed it was a different generator he had just purchased. Officers arrived and took pictures of the generator and its serial number and advised both parties this was a civil case.
- Welfare check in the 1400 block of Meade Ave. RP advised her friend was highly intoxicated and fell, causing an injury to her head. The female was transported to PMH by EMS. No other issues were found.
- Disturbance in the 700 block of Wine Country Rd. The RP advised a male was being verbal with the manager and refused to leave when asked. Officers arrived and spoke with the male and he agreed to move along.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported in the 900 block of Memorial St. RP advised two people got out of the vehicle wearing dark clothing. When officers arrived, three males advised they were just hanging out. The officer reminded them of the closing hours of the area and asked them to pick up their garbage before they left the area. The males complied and left the area shortly after.

MAY 26 (24 calls for service)

- Noise complaint in the 900 block of Alexander Ct. When officers arrived in the area three females, locked the door and two ran out the back of the house. Officers were able to make contact with all three females, who were intoxicated, and found one was underage. The officers spoke to the females about underage drinking as well as drinking and driving. Officers also found a 2-month-old child that was unattended in the residence. A sober adult was contacted and arrived while officers were there and took responsibility for everyone.
- A very thoughtful citizen dropped off Gift Cards for the police department staff. Staff was very grateful and excited.
- Officers assisted Washington State Patrol (WSP) after a male driver was seen hitting a female passenger. A WSP officer took custody of the driver and the female was medically assisted due to an injury she received. The investigation was taken over by WSP
- A male violated a No Contact Order (NCO) in the 1000 block of Alexander Ct. The male went to a residence and screamed and knocked at the residence door. The male was gone when officers arrived.
- Officers received three calls regarding Identity theft. The RPs advised their personal information was used to claim unemployment. They were given a case number and referred to the unemployment office.
- A helicopter landed near the 600 block of Merlot Dr. The landing was unauthorized and the RP advised it was so close to the lampposts it knocked the tops off the lamps. When officers arrived, the helicopter was no longer in the area. Officers were able to determine there was no damage done to the lights.
- Welfare check in the 1400 block of Riverside Dr. RP advised he was talking to his girlfriend on the phone and she was highly intoxicated and fell. The female was complaining of pain and saying she could not get to the door. EMS arrived and took over.

MAY 27 (18 calls for service)

- A white stallion was on the loose in the Whitcoff LP area. The RP advised another passerby was calling the owner. The owner was contacted and contained the horse.
- A suspicious person was reported near the 200 block of Wamba Rd. The RP advised he saw a male talking to himself and waving his arms. The RP suggested the man may have been on narcotics since he was acting strangely. When officers arrived the male had already left the area. No further issues were found.
- A suspicious person was reported in the 1900 block of Highland Dr. The RP advised seeing a female on his yard. The RP asked the female to leave his property. The female left but the RP stated she was also looking into his neighbor's yard. The RP stated that nothing was taken. When officers arrived, the female was no longer in the area.
- RP called in saying there was someone in a canal yelling for help. He advised seeing someone grabbing onto a rope trying to stay afloat. Officers along with Dive Rescue and other agencies arrived and searched the area but were unable to locate anyone.
- A male was stopped for not having a front license plate on his vehicle. The officer then determined the driver was driving with a suspended license (DWLS) and charged him with DWLS 2nd degree. The male then complained of feeling "tingly" and in pain, EMS went to the area and evaluated him. Family members of the male driver arrived and took the vehicle. No further issues were found.

MAY 28 (14 calls for service)

- A Suspicious vehicle was reported in the 1400 block of Dudley Ave. The RP advised there was a male in a car that had been parked in front of her garage for a while. Officers made contact with the male who was with a moving company and was waiting for the rest of the crew to show up. The male showed officers his paperwork for the job and soon a moving truck showed up. No further issues were found and the RP said it was ok for the male to park there.
- Identity theft was reported in the 900 block of Campbell Dr. The RP advised that she had been notified that someone tried to claim unemployment benefits using her personal information. She was given a case number by the officer and was advised to contact her bank and other credit card companies to notify them of the fraud.
- Officers assisted a driver who was stuck in the pea gravel in the CR 12 and Wine Country Rd area. The RP requested a tow truck pull her vehicle out and the officers contacted one for her. No other issues were found.
