## ACTIVITY LOG

**Week of February 02 to February 08, 2024**

### **February 02** (29 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a civil issue at the 1400 block of Meade Avenue. No issues were found.
- Officer responded to a report of a noise violation at the 1000 block of Hemlock. RP stated that there is a dog at the location who has been barking all morning. The officer parked in the area to verify the complaint and then contacted the owner of the barking dog, advising her that it is not okay to have a dog barking all morning. She agreed to bring the dog inside.
- Officers responded to a report of a runaway child at the 100 block of SW Malibu. The child was eventually located and returned home.
- Officers responded to a report of a theft at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. The RP stated that while she was cleaning in a closed bathroom, she had her phone on a cart and when she went to help a customer, her phone was stolen from the cart. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint on Merlot Drive. The RP stated that there is a brindle-colored pit bull mix dog at large in the area. The officer was unable to approach the dog.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at Wine Country Road/North River Road. Officers assisted with traffic control as the traffic light was acting up.
- Officer responded to a report a non-injury traffic accident at SR 221/SR22. This call was transferred to WSP.
- Officers responded to a report of a traffic hazard at Wine Country Road/North River Road. The RP stated that the traffic light is not cycling properly. Prosser Public Works was notified.
- Officer responded to a civil issue at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that a guest was upset that he was not accommodated in a room close to his friends, but when he was given a room closer to his friends, he changed his mind and wanted his original room. He became further upset when he said that his (original) room was dirty and was told he was the one who had made it dirty (when he had been in there before moving to the new room). This is a civil issue. No crime was committed.
- Officers responded to an assist at the 1400 block of Meade Avenue. No crime took place.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1400 block of Meade Avenue. The RP then refused medics and stated that she was fine.
- Officers responded to a report of an accident at the 1200 block of Quarter Horse Trail. The RP stated that someone had driven into his yard and destroyed some of his property. The driver had then tried to drive away but due to vehicle damage, was stopped in the middle of the road. Officers responded and arrested the driver on suspicion of DUI. The vehicle was towed.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

### **February 03** (38 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a possible sex offense on King Tull Road. One male was arrested and taken to BC jail.
- Officer responded to a report of threats at the 1100 block of Prosser Avenue. The RP stated that her girlfriend's ex-boyfriend threatened to harm her (the RP). Investigation ongoing.

- Officer responded to a report of reckless driving on Merlot Drive. The RP stated that someone was swerving at the location. The officer located the vehicle but did not note any swerving or other violations.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that she had found a dog at the North Prosser Market and had collected it as she was concerned for its safety. She was advised that there was no animal control available at the time and she advised that she will hold the dog until Monday and attempt to contact BCSO animal control (as the dog was found outside of city limits).
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that there is a female in a running vehicle at the location that has her head back with mouth open. The RP was not sure how long the female had been there. Officers contacted the female who was fine, but was taking a nap.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of Petra Avenue. The RP stated that there is a dog at large at the location. This may be the same dog from an earlier incident. Animal control was not available.
- Officers responded to a report of dumping on SR 22. The RP stated that someone was dumping items under bridge. Officers contacted the male who was actually cleaning up brush along the rock wall.
- Officers responded to an informational report at the 300 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. The RP and his neighbor both thought they had heard gunshots in the area. The officers checked the area and did not find suspicious activities of any sort.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a DV assault on W 134 PR NW. The RP's ex became verbal and physical with the RP's father. One female arrested and booked into BC jail.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 1400 block of Meade Avenue. No issues were found.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## February 04 (28 Calls for Service)

- PPD and RPD officer assist with a report of DV happening in a vehicle. The subject was apprehended at Love's and taken into custody. He was transported to RPD.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at SW Montecito Drive/SW Kelandren Drive. The RP stated that there are 5 puppies at large in the area. The RP found the owners of the puppies prior to officer arrival.
- Officer responded to a report of a traffic complaint at the 100 block of Old Inland Empire Hwy. The RP stated that a vehicle is parked in the bike lane and has been there all day. The officer contacted the responsible vehicle owner, who moved the vehicle.
- BCSO officer assist with an incident in Grandview.
- BCSO officer assist on N Gap Road. The RP stated that there was a vehicle that drove by twice, shooting a weapon approximately 7 times before leaving the area. The RP stated that she saw this from her camera. Officers checked the area and did not find damage of any kind nor any evidence of gunshots. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 900 block of Yakima Avenue. The RP stated that her daughter had received a call in the wee hours of the morning from an unknown caller who asked her to hang out. She muted the call and ignored him, which upset the caller, who then started calling her vulgar names. The officer advised the daughter what to do should he call again.
- Officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstance at the 1300 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that there is a male standing outside who is tugging on the door. As the

- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## February 05 (30 Calls for Service)

- Officer assist with a call from Turlock, CA PD. A male who was reported missing in October was found (alive) in Turlock, CA.
- Officer responded to a parking violation at Petra Avenue/Basalt Loop. A vehicle was parked in a no parking zone. The officer pink tagged the vehicle for removal.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 300 block of Nunn Road. The RP stated that they found a crying puppy the previous evening apparently left out in the rain at the location. The RP believes that she knows where the puppy is from, but attempts to contact anyone at the suggested address were unsuccessful. The officer impounded the puppy and posted a pic of it on Facebook in an attempt to locate the owners.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that there has been a dog staying at the location. The dog was not located at the time of the contact.
- BCSO officer assist for a report of suspicious activity on King Tull Road. There were some individuals at the location who were loading items into a truck. When confronted, the individuals stated that the owner of the property had requested that they pick up the items and deliver them. When the owner was contacted, he denied asking anyone to move the items.
- Officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1400 block of Prosser Avenue. RP stated that a male had waved at her and followed her around her yard a few days ago and is now knocking repeatedly on her door. The officer contacted the male and told him to stop bothering people, which he agreed to do.
- Officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1500 block of Paterson Road. The RP stated that there is a male walking around carrying a golf club, following people. The officers contacted the male and told him to move along.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1400 block of Dudley Avenue. The RP stated that there is an ongoing problem with a dog that barks all day and all night. The officer parked in the area, but did not hear any barking at all.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

## February 06 (31 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the Prosser Police Department. The officers noticed an injured goose in the area. They were able to capture the goose and take it to Prosser Animal Hospital for treatment.
- Officer responded to an informational report at the 200 block of SR 22. Construction work for water pipes is being done along SR 22, and markers are being left in the easement areas along the road. One resident has been pulling construction markers in front of his residence. The resident was also being verbally aggressive with the construction workers. Workers were able to verify that the markers were legally placed in the easement. The officer tried to contact the resident to no avail. A message was left on his door.
- Officer responded to an animal complaint at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. This is the same dog that has been at large for several days. The CSO officer has thus far been unable to get close to the dog to impound her. The officer has attempted multiple times to catch this dog and will continue to try.

- Officer responded to a report of possible phone nuisance/scam. The RP stated that she received a phone call stating that she failed to get served. The officer advised the RP to not answer calls from unfamiliar numbers.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 100 block of Spruce Avenue. The officer checked the residence but no one answered. Nothing appeared out of the ordinary at the residence.
- Officer responded to a report of threats at the 400 block of North River Road. The RP stated that her ex is threatening her. Investigation ongoing.
- Officer responded to a request for assistance over the phone. The RP stated that their vehicle was parked on a side street near Love's and is now gone and they are wondering if it was towed. The officer tried to contact the RP but their phone was not working.
- Officer facilitated the transfer of the previously impounded puppy to Pronto Puppy Rescue.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident at the 500 block of 6<sup>th</sup> Street. The RP stated that someone had hit their car, causing damage, but they are not sure where it occurred. Investigation is ongoing.

- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check for a possible assault. Investigation is ongoing.

The RP stated that their children had heard a loud thump in the backyard and the RP's husband went to investigate. He observed two males in all black, wearing headlamps in his back yard. The husband stated that he yelled at them and one pointed a silver revolver at him while backing out of the yard. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate anyone.
