THIRD QUARTER 2019 QUARTERLY REPORT

Patrol

During the third quarter of 2019 calls for service/self-initiated activity increased by 4% from the third quarter of 2018, from 2,271 to 2,359.

Police Department Overtime

Department overtime costs during the third quarter of 2019 indicate an 11% decrease from the third quarter of 2018. We are seeing a cost savings of approximately \$2,660.47.

This translates into a decrease of 18.75 hours in overtime use during the third quarter of 2019 as compared to the third quarter of 2018.

The department has been operating short two full time officers and had two additional officers out on extended leave during the third quarter of 2019.

Investigations

During the third quarter of 2019, clearance rate of Part I Offenses are as follows:

- Clearance rate for Part I Offenses investigated third quarter in 2019 is 38%. Out of 107 cases, 41 were cleared.
- Clearance rate for Part I Offenses investigated third quarter in 2018 is 41%. Out of 97 cases, 40 were cleared.

Clearance rates are dictated by the type of crime, and the resources available to follow up the crime.

Traffic Infractions

- During the third quarter of 2019 the Prosser PD conducted 594 self-initiated traffic stops/traffic complaints. As a result, 170 traffic infractions were issued, which resulted in a traffic infraction being issued 29% of the time, or approximately 3 out of every 10 traffic infractions encountered by patrol officers resulted in a traffic infraction being issued. This figure includes both criminal and non-criminal traffic infractions.

Non-Criminal Traffic & Non-Traffic Infractions Issued- Third quarter of 2019 indicates a 12% increase over third quarter of 2018.

School Resource Officer Activities during the third quarter 2019.

- During third quarter of 2019 the SRO was assigned 77 case files, made 1 adult arrest and 1 juvenile arrest.
- The SRO handled one assault complaint, which resulted in an arrest of a juvenile. The SRO handled other various reports and complaints regarding harassment, narcotics, missing children, suspicious circumstances and various welfare checks regarding students not attending school.
- The SRO dealt with multiple parking complaints, issuing both verbal warnings and written infractions.
- The SRO assisted the four Prosser schools in traffic control, visited with staff and students on a regular basis, and participated in various school initiated drills and meetings.

Traffic Accidents

- During the third quarter, the department responded to 46 traffic accidents.

Burglar Alarm Responses

- During the third quarter of 2019 the Prosser Police Department received 34 total burglar alarms, all of which were found to be false alarms.

Subsequently, the Department invoiced seven premises for violating Prosser Municipal Code 9.20 False Alarms.

During the third quarter of 2018 the department responded to 39 alarm calls, during this same time period in 2019, we responded to 34, indicating a 13% decrease in false alarms.

During the third quarter of 2019, 14 commercial businesses accounted for 28 out of the 34 alarm responses, which translate into the commercial businesses being responsible for approximately 82% of our alarm responses during this quarter.

Crime Free Rental Housing

- During the 3rd Quarter of 2019 there were 5 Crime Free Rental Housing violation notices sent out to landlords.

Domestic Violence Incidents

- Increase in domestic violence (DV) related incidents in the second quarter of 2019 from 6 incidents in 2018 to 15 in 2019. This statistic does not include outside law enforcement requests for DV assists that the Prosser PD has provided.

Summary

As stated earlier, during the third quarter of 2019, calls for service have increased by 4% from the third quarter of 2018, 2,271 to 2,359. We are seeing an increase in Part I Crimes by 10%, and a decrease in part II crimes by 21%.
