QUARTERLY REPORT, FIRST QUARTER 2023

Patrol

During the first quarter of 2023 calls for service/self-initiated activity increased 2% from the first quarter of 2022, from 1,574 to 1,604.

Calls for service and self-initiated activity is influenced by changes in state legislation placing limitations on police officer contacts and arrests, also the police department has been operating with four vacant positions (four officer vacant positions, and one newly hired officer that is awaiting to attend the academy) for much of the first quarter.

After a nationwide search, Jay King was selected as the new Prosser Police Department Chief of Police upon the retirement of Chief Giles.

Officer Sereno was hired and will be attending the Basic Law Enforcement Academy starting in May and Administrative Secretary Brito resigned.

Police Department Overtime

Department overtime costs during the first quarter of 2023 indicates a 16% increase over the first quarter of 2022. We are seeing a cost increase of approximately \$9,957.24.

This translates into an increase of approximately 119.5 hours in overtime use during the first quarter of 2023 as compared to the first quarter of 2022.

The rise in overtime is directly attributed to the Department's current staffing level.

Staff Meetings

During the first quarter, supervisory staff meetings were conducted on January 26th, and March 13th.

Training

Year to date training hours combined with pre-scheduled training for department personnel is approximately 221 hours.

During the first quarter of 2023:

Senior Administrative Assistant Mendoza attended Use of Force, Public Records Act-Law Enforcement Records Basics, and Introduction to Sealing and Expunging Records training.

Officer Orate attended Firearms Instructor course.

Officer Bustamante Attended Emergency Vehicle Operators Instructor (EVOC) and Basic Field Training Officer (FTO) courses.

Officer Forsyth completed annual Crisis Intervention (CIT) refresher course, EVOC Instructor and Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) training.

Officer Garza attended ACCESS2 training.

All sworn officers and CSO Olivera completed LETS training.

All sworn officers completed mandatory quarterly firearms qualifications.

Investigations

During the first quarter of 2023, clearance rate of Group A Offenses are as follows:

- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated first quarter in 2023 is 31%. Out of 38 cases, 12 were cleared.
- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated first quarter in 2022 is 33%. Out of 105 cases, 35 were cleared.

Clearance rates are dictated by the type of crime and the resources available to follow up the crime. It is anticipated that once the department is fully staffed and fully operational, a full time detective will be put in place, which should increase clearance rates.

Chart shows the number of offenses. Cases can have multiple offenses, which is why there is a difference between the number of cases and the number of offenses.

Traffic Infractions

- During the first quarter of 2023, the Prosser PD conducted 506 self-initiated traffic stops/traffic complaints. As a result, 76 traffic citations were issued, which resulted in a traffic citation being issued 15% of the time, or approximately 1 out of every 10 traffic infractions encountered by patrol officers resulted in a traffic citation being issued.

Non-Criminal Traffic & Non-Traffic Infractions issued first quarter of 2023 indicates a 3% decrease from first quarter of 2022.

Commercial Vehicle Inspections

- During the first quarter, three Commercial Vehicle Inspections were conducted.

Traffic Accidents

- During the first quarter, the department responded to 25 traffic accidents.

Burglar Alarm Responses

- During the first quarter of 2023, the Prosser PD responded to 29 total burglar alarms, all of which were found to be false alarms. During the same time period in 2022 the department responded to 38, indicating a 24% decrease in false alarms.

Subsequently, the Department invoiced five premises for violating Prosser Municipal Code 9.20 False Alarms. Commercial businesses accounted for approximately 79% or 23 out of the 29 false alarms were committed by non- residential alarm holders.

Domestic Violence Incidents

- We are seeing a 33% decrease in domestic violence (DV) related incidents in the first quarter of 2023 from 18 incidents in 2022 to 12 in 2023. This statistic does not include outside law enforcement requests for DV assists that the Prosser PD has provided.

Reserves

- Prosser Police Reserves contributed approximately 44 hours during the first quarter 2023.

Community Service Officer (CSO) Activities First Quarter 2023

- The CSO processed 51 new dog licenses during the first quarter 2023. There are a total of 133 dog licenses for 2023 and an overall total of 301 including 2 kennel licenses.
- The CSO processed 204 rental licenses during the first quarter 2023. There are a total of 204 properties with 457 individual units.

- The CSO impounded 7 dogs. 6 were transferred to local area rescues and 1 was reclaimed by their owners. No animals were euthanized.
- CSO had 2 code enforcement abatements, was assigned to xx calls for service, xx case files, and issued two infractions.

Crime Free Rental Housing

- During the first quarter of 2023, zero Crime Free Rental Housing violation notices were sent out to landlords.

- Records Requests processed first quarter of 2023 indicates a 22% increase over first quarter of 2022.
