QUARTERLY REPORT, SECOND QUARTER 2019

Patrol

During the second quarter of 2019 calls for service/self-initiated activity decreased 14% from the second quarter of 2018, from 2,408 to 2,061.

The Department hired Lateral Officer Brewster and Community Service Officer Babcock during the second quarter of 2019.

Police Department Overtime

Department overtime costs during the second quarter of 2019 indicates a 6% increase as compared to the second quarter of 2018. We are seeing a cost increase of approximately \$654.28.

This translates into an increase of around 18.75 hours in overtime use during the second quarter of 2019 as compared to the second quarter of 2018.

Staff Meetings

During the second quarter, supervisory staff meetings were conducted on April 24th, May 31st, and June 19th.

Training

Year to date training hours combined with pre-scheduled training for department personnel is approximately 707.5 hours.

During the second quarter of 2019:

Officer Sabalza attended Arresting Weapon Retention/Ground Survival and Control Instructors Course.

Officer Sparks completed Inspecting Hi-Voltage Electric-Drive Commercial Motor Vehicles training.

CSO Babcock attended WACE Spring Training Conference, and completed Investigating Animal Abuse for Law Enforcement, Animal Crime Scenes and Evidence Collection, Rescuing Animals from Cruelty and Disasters, and Large Scale Animal Cruelty and Natural Disasters training courses.

Chief Giles, Records Clerk Mendoza, and Administrative Secretary Lum completed First Aid CPR AED training.

All sworn officers completed DT, Taser, and Building Searches training.

All sworn officers completed mandatory quarterly firearms qualifications.

School Resource Officer Activities during the second quarter 2019.

- During the second quarter of 2019, the School Resource Officer (SRO) was assigned 66 case files, made two juvenile arrests and one adult arrest.
- During the second quarter, the SRO handled numerous assault reports, multiple narcotics complaints, malicious mischief reports, and parking complaints. The SRO also handled multiple hit and run reports and a burglary.
- The SRO assisted the four Prosser schools in traffic control, visited with Staff and Students on a regular basis, and participated in various school initiated drills and meetings.

Investigations

During the second quarter of 2019, clearance rate of Group A Offenses are as follows:

- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated second quarter in 2019 is 38%. Out of 140 offenses, 54 were cleared.
- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated second quarter in 2018 is 54%. Out of 112 offenses, 61 were cleared.

Clearance rates are dictated by the type of crime and the resources available to follow up the crime. It is anticipated that once the department is fully staffed and fully operational, a full time detective will be put in place, which should increase clearance rates.

Traffic Infractions

- During the second quarter of 2019 the Prosser PD conducted 724 self-initiated traffic stops/traffic complaints. As a result, 152 traffic citations were issued, which resulted in a traffic citation being issued 21% of the time, or approximately 2 out of every 10 traffic infractions encountered by patrol officers resulted in a traffic citation being issued.

Non-Criminal Traffic & Non-Traffic Infractions Issued-Second quarter of 2019 indicates a 12% increase over second quarter of 2018.

Burglar Alarm Responses

- During the second quarter of 2019 the Prosser PD responded to 42 total burglar alarms, all of which were found to be false alarms. During the same time period in 2018 the department responded to 40, indicating a 5% increase in false alarms.

Subsequently, the Department invoiced four premises for violating Prosser Municipal Code 9.20 False Alarms.

During the second quarter of 2019, commercial businesses accounted for 30 out of the 42 false alarm responses, which translates into the businesses being responsible for approximately 71% of our false alarm responses during this quarter.

Domestic Violence Incidents

- Increase in domestic violence (DV) related incidents in the second quarter of 2019 by 30% from 10 incidents in 2018 to 14 in 2019. This statistic does not include outside law enforcement requests for DV assists that the Prosser PD has provided.

Summary

As stated earlier, during the second quarter of 2019, calls for service have decreased by 14% from the second quarter of 2018, 2,408 to 2,061. We are seeing an increase in Group A Offenses, and decrease in Group B Offenses. We did not see a change in Felony arrests.
