QUARTERLY REPORT, SECOND QUARTER 2023

Patrol

During the second quarter of 2023 calls for service/self-initiated activity increased by 0.8% over the second quarter of 2022, from 1,737 to 1,751.

Calls for service and self-initiated activity is influenced by changes in state legislation placing limitations on police officer contacts and arrests, also the police department has been operating with four vacant positions (four officer vacant positions, and one newly hired officer that is attending the academy) for much of the second quarter.

Leslie Johnson was also hired as the part-time Administrative Secretary.

Police Department Overtime

Department overtime costs during the second quarter of 2023 indicates a 57% decrease as compared to the second quarter of 2022. We are seeing a cost decrease of approximately \$35,348.17.

This translates into a decrease of around 603.25 hours in overtime use during the second quarter of 2023 as compared to the second quarter of 2022.

Training

Year to date training hours combined with pre-scheduled training for department personnel is approximately 809 hours.

During the second quarter of 2023:

- Officers attended Emergency Vehicle Operator Course training (EVOC)
- Officer Garza attended Use and Operation of Police Radar Training

- Chief King attended the Basic Law Enforcement Equivalency Academy, Open Government Training Act, Patrol Tactics Course and the WASPC Chiefs and Sheriff’s Spring Conference
- Administrative Secretary Johnson completed required ACCESS2 training
- Officer Orate attended Public Information Officer for First Responders training

Investigations

During the second quarter of 2023, clearance rate of Group A Offenses are as follows:

- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated second quarter in 2023 is 39%. Out of 44 offenses, 17 were cleared.
- Clearance rate for Group A Offenses investigated second quarter in 2022 is 28%. Out of 96 offenses, 27 were cleared.

See attachments (A) and (B) for a comparison of clearance percentages between second quarters of fiscal year 2023 and 2022.

Clearance rates are dictated by the type of crime and the resources available to follow up the crime. It is anticipated that once the department is fully staffed and fully operational, a full time detective will be put in place, which should increase clearance rates.

Chart shows the number of offenses. Cases can have multiple offenses, which is why there is a difference between the number of cases and the number of offenses.

Traffic Infractions

During the second quarter of 2023, the Prosser PD conducted 423 self-initiated traffic stops/traffic complaints. As a result, 47 traffic citations were issued, which resulted in a traffic citation being issued 11% of the time, or approximately 1 out of every 10 traffic infractions encountered by patrol officers resulted in a traffic citation being issued.

Non-Criminal Traffic & Non-Traffic Infractions Issued-Second quarter of 2023 indicates an 18% decrease from second quarter of 2022.

Commercial Vehicle Inspections

Officer Forsyth conducted one commercial vehicle inspection during the second quarter 2023.

Traffic Accidents

During the second quarter, the department responded to 44 traffic accidents.

Burglar Alarm Responses

During the second quarter of 2023, the Prosser PD responded to 54 total burglar alarms, all of which were found to be false alarms. During the same time period in 2022 the department responded to 43, indicating a 25% increase in false alarms.

Subsequently, the Department invoiced six premises for violating Prosser Municipal Code 9.20 False Alarms.

During the second quarter of 2023, commercial businesses accounted for 44 out of the 54 false alarm responses, which translates into the businesses being responsible for approximately 81% of our false alarm responses during this quarter.

Domestic Violence Incidents

Increase in domestic violence (DV) related incidents in the second quarter of 2023 by 15% from 13 incidents in 2022 to 15 in 2023. This statistic does not include outside law enforcement requests for DV assists that the Prosser PD has provided.

Reserves

- Prosser Police Reserve Officer Colvig contributed approximately 53 hours during the second quarter 2023.

Community Service Officer (CSO) Activities Second Quarter 2023

- The CSO processed 6 new dog licenses during the second quarter 2023. There are a total of 148 dog licenses for 2023 and an overall total of 329 including three kennel licenses.
- The CSO processed 4 rental licenses during the second quarter 2023. There are a total of 208 properties with 461 individual units.
- The CSO impounded 4 dogs during the second quarter of 2023. 4 animals were transferred to local area rescues and 0 were reclaimed by their owners. No animals were euthanized.
- CSO had 0 code enforcement abatements, was assigned to 118 calls for service, 0 case files, and issued 0 infractions.

Crime Free Rental Housing

During the second quarter of 2023, no Crime Free Rental Housing violation notices were sent out to property owners.

Police Department Records Requests Second Quarter 2023

- Public Records Requests processed second quarter of 2023 indicates a 28% decrease from second quarter of 2022.
