ACTIVITY LOG Week of March 15 to March 21, 2024

March 15 (17 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of theft at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that an unknown male had stolen a reflective safety jacket from the locations. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a report of a vehicle repossession at the 400 block of North River Road. No issues.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of Merlot Drive. The RP stated that a female is sleeping at the location and when asked to move along, she started yelling at the employees, causing a disturbance. The business asked that she be trespassed (which she was).
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at 6th Street/Spokane Avenue. The RP stated that there is a husky/shepherd mix dog at large in the area (this same dog was loose previously).
- Officers responded to a report of an assault at the 700 block of Eastgate Drive. The RP stated that her brother had assaulted her. The brother was gone when officers arrived. One male was (later) arrested for DV and transported to BC jail.
- Officers responded to a report of a lost firearm at the 10 block of Merlot Drive. The RP stated that someone had left their firearm in the bathroom at the location. The customer who had left the firearm later collected it from the RP (employee) prior to officer arrival.
- An officer facilitated the collection of an impounded dog at the police department.
- Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at the 100 block of N Wamba Road. They checked the facility and spoke with an employee at the location. No disturbance was located.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

March 16 (25 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a non-injury traffic accident on I82.
- Officers responded to a report of a no-assault domestic disturbance at the 1100 block of Sheridan Avenue. The RP stated that his brother was being belligerent, causing problems. The brother eventually apologized and the two separated.
- Officers responded to a report of information at the 600 block of 6th Street. The RP stated that there were gang members at the location and she was concerned for possible issues. The officers spoke to the employees at the location who stated that the suspicious individuals had already left.
- An officer responded to a report of a noise violations at the 1500 block of Paterson Road. The RP stated that there is a dog at the location that is barking non-stop. The officer *did* locate the barking dog and will have the CSO contact the owner.
- An officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that someone was pushing a grill down the street after removing it from the fire department property. Officers contacted the fire department who stated that it was fine. No crime.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at Paterson Road/Nell Street. The RP stated that a mid-size black and white dog was at large in the area. The officer attempted unsuccessfully to capture the dog. Information was forwarded to the CSO.

- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1300 block of Rohman Drive. The RP stated that the previous day, several juveniles had come to the location and tried to gain access to the home before gaining access to the back yard. There is a video of the incident which will be uploaded to the officer. Investigation ongoing.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

March 17 (19 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a suspicious circumstances at the 1300 block of SW Kelandren Drive. The RP stated that someone is throwing something at her window and shining a red light into it (1:42 am). The officers noted that the gate for the RP's yard was ajar but there were no obvious signs of damage to the property. The officers were unable to locate anyone in the area.
- Officers responded to a report of a hit and run traffic accident at the 400 block of North River Road. The RP stated that someone had hit his vehicle at some point in the night. There is no video and no leads.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1100 block of Yakima Avenue. The RP stated that there is a pit bull at large in the area. The officer drove around and spoke with individuals in the area, but was unable to locate the dog.
- Officers responded to a report of a non-assault domestic disturbance at the 1400 block of Paterson Road. The RP stated that her husband is drinking and being verbal with everyone at the location. The RP decided to stay elsewhere for the night. No crime took place.
- Officers responded to a report of assault at the 100 block of Columbia Drive. This was a verbal between a mother and daughter. No signs of injury from either party. Both agreed to stay away from each other for the night.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

March 18 (29 Calls for Service)

- An officer responded to a report of a 911 hang up at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The officer contacted an employee at the location who stated that there does not appear to be any emergency.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 1200 block of Dudley Avenue. The RP stated that they could hear someone yelling from behind Napa Auto Parts (2:51 am). Split to medics, who transported an ill male to the hospital. No crime.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at the 400 block of North River Road. The RP stated that she had photos and a video of the results of an assault that happened earlier in the day. It is unclear where the incident took place. The officers tried to make contact at the supplied location but no one appeared to be awake.
- BCSO/EMS officer assist for a traffic accident with injuries at W Evans Road/N Hinzerling Road. One driver rear ended a tractor as he did not see it due to the sun shining in his eyes.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1000 block of Hemlock Street. The RP stated that there is a barking dog in the area. The officer contacted the owner of the barking dog, who stated that a neighbor's dog gets to barking, causing her dog to bark. The officer contacted the neighbor as well and warned both dog owners to control the barking or a citation may be issued.
- An officer responded to a 911 hang up from the area of the 700 block of Memorial Street. The officer contacted an individual at the phone number provided who stated that it was an accidental misdial.

- Officers responded to a report of weapons at the 1100 block of Yakima Avenue. The RP stated that a male had come in with a gunshot wound to his foot. This was an accidental discharge. No crime.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint at the 500 block of Cabernet Court. The RP stated that a pit bull was off leash in the area and had attacked him and his dog. Investigation ongoing.
- An officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that they had found a card skimmer on a diesel pump at the location. They mentioned that keypad on that pump was not functioning and customers have been having to pay inside. The RP is unaware of any customers complaining of credit card fraud.
- An officer responded to a report of property found at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. An employee at the location turned in to the officer lost IDs/credit cards collected at the location for the past month.
- An officer assisted a citizen at the 1000 block of Sadie Street who recently purchased a vehicle and wanted to make sure that the vehicle had not been stolen (it was not a stolen vehicle).
- Officers responded to a warrant following a traffic stop on N Gap Road / I 82. One male was taken into custody and booked into BC jail.
- An officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at Meade Avenue/7th Street. The RP stated that as they were driving by the bus stop they thought that they had seen a male holding another male down on the ground. The officer checked the area. There were two males and a female at the location and the female was yelling and 'stretching' on the ground. No problems were seen.

March 19 (19 Calls for Service)

- Officers responded to a report of a burglary at the 300 block of 6th Street. The RP stated that the building was broken into at some point in the night. The glass door was broken and drawers had been gone through. The RP will email the video in. This investigation is ongoing.
- An officer responded to a report of a parking violation at Miller Court/Eastgate Drive. The RP stated that a vehicle in the area is parked too close to the stop sign. The officer checked the vehicle in question who was actually parked legally.
- An officer responded to a request for a welfare check at the 500 block of Cascade Court. The RP wanted a juvenile checked on. The officer contacted the juvenile and all was well. No issues.
- Officers responded to a partially (road) blocking vehicle at Grant Avenue/Grande Road. The vehicle had run out of gas and help on the way. No issues.
