Week of March 29 to April 4, 2024

March 29 (25 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist for a report of reckless traffic on I82/MP 80. The RP stated that a driver was swerving while driving and had almost went off the road a few times. This call was split to WSP.
- Officers responded to a report of loitering at the 600 block of Merlot Drive. The RP stated that there is a male that was acting suspicious. When the RP asked him to leave, he ignored her. The officers contacted the male who stated he was showing his friends the plants, etc. He was advised that the owner did not want him at the location for several months.
- Officers responded to a report of a road rage incident at the 1600 block of Grant Avenue. The RP stated that she had witnessed (she was a passerby) two cars apparently involved in a road rage incident pull over at the location. Individuals from both vehicles got out and a physical fight ensued. The officers were unable to locate either car upon arrival at the park.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at the 100 block of Spruce Avenue. The RP stated that two dogs at the location had gotten into a fight. The dogs were separated.
- An officer responded to a suspicious vehicle at the 6000 block of N Gap Road. An officer went to the location to check on it but it was gone upon officer arrival.

- An officer responded to an animal complaint at 7th Street/Bennett Avenue. The RP stated that there is a small dog at large in the area. As the CSO was not working, the RP stated that he would attempt to contact him on Monday.
- Officers responded to an assist at the 1900 block of Miller Avenue. The RP was having a civil issue with her juvenile child. No crime took place.

- BCSO officer assist with a report of reckless traffic on I82/MP 80. The RP stated that a driver was headed EB in the WB lane. The call was split to WSP.

- An officer responded to a report of property found at the 1300 block of Sommers Avenue. The RP stated that they had found a backpack and jacket that was left at the park. Items were taken to the PD for safekeeping.
- Officers participated in the Coffee with a Cop at Brewminatti.
- BCSO officer assist with a report of a vehicle theft on W CR 12. The vehicle was stolen during the night.
- Officers responded to two dogs at large at the 500 block of Evans Avenue. The dogs were secured at their home.
- An officer facilitated the transfer of a husky dog to the Benton Franklin Humane Society.
- Officers responded to a residential alarm at the 1300 block of Prosser Avenue. It appears that a dog likely set it off. No crime noted.
- An officer responded to a report of a non-injury, non-reportable traffic accident on Merlot Drive. Drivers worked out the details.
- An officer responded to a report of a civil issue at the 1800 block of Highland Drive. The RP stated that his son had borrowed his truck but had not returned it (for over a month). The officer called the son, leaving a message for him to return the vehicle.

The RP stated that a female at the location appeared to be on narcotics and screaming, revving her vehicle engine. The RP was concerned that the female might try to drive. The officers contacted the female and found that she had an active warrant. She was arrested and booked into BC jail.
- An officer contacted a vehicle parked at the 400 block of 3rd Street after hours. The individuals in the vehicle were advised of the park hours and moved along.
- Officers performed follow up activities for several cases.
- Officers conducted multiple traffic stops.

March 31 (28 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist with a business alarm on W Snipes Road. Video captured some individuals on the property possibly trying to steal gas.
- Officers responded to an alarm at the 600 block of Wine Country Road. The officers contacted a male subject at the location who was accessing his tools. No crime.
- Officers responded to a report of property destruction at the 1400 block of Paterson Road. The RP stated that her vehicle was damaged during the night. The back window was shattered and the tires were punctured. Video surveillance was not captured. Investigation is ongoing.

This caused a verbal disturbance. The officers spoke to both parties. The RP apologized for antagonizing the dog, and the dog owner was given some options to prevent further issues.
- An officer responded to a report of property lost at the 1300 block of Sommers Avenue. This matched up with the bag that was taken to the PD earlier in the week. The bag was returned to the RP.
- An officer located two separate vehicles both occupied by a male and female at the 200 block of 3rd Street. Both sets of occupants were advised of park hours and were moved along.

April 01 (29 Calls for Service)

- BCSO officer assist for a business alarm on W Hanks Road. Alarm was set off by employee.

- Officers responded to the report of a theft at the 1100 block of Sherman Avenue. The RP stated that he had left his weapon on a shelf during a family gathering and when he went to collect it the next morning it was gone. Investigation is ongoing.

- An officer responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at W King Tull Road/N 1239 PR NW. The RP stated that a drone was circling the neighborhood and the residents were concerned that it may be being used to scope out the neighborhood for future thefts. The officer was unable to locate the drone upon arrival.
- Officers stopped to check on a disabled vehicle at the 1100 block of Market Street. The car had a flat tire and the occupants were waiting for help. No issues.

A no-contact order is not currently in place. The officer will try to contact the subject, but advised the RP to seek a no-contact order if desired.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances at the 1200 block of Prosser Avenue. The RP stated that there is an individual at the location who is going through the trash. An officer contacted the male who agreed to leave the trash cans alone.
- Officers responded to a report of theft at the 700 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that a male came in and stole an unknown number of items. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a request for a welfare check at E 8th Street/Meade Avenue. No issues were found.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at the 400 block of 7th Street. The RP stated that a dog has been left in a vehicle at the location and has been in the vehicle for at least an hour. The officer checked with the owner of the vehicle (and dog). The dog was not under duress and did not appear to be under any stress. No issues.
- An officer responded to an informational report at the 200 block of Gap Road. The RP stated that the sheds at the location were broken into (again). Video footage will be uploaded to the officer.
- Officers responded to a business alarm at the 800 block of Memorial Street. Officers checked with the business and all was well.
- An officer responded to a request for assistance via a phone call. The RP stated that they were trying to find their vehicle and thought it may have been towed in Prosser.
- An officer responded to a request for assistance at the 1000 block of Hemlock. The RP stated that her neighbor was barking at her dog inciting her dog to bark.
- BCSO officer assist with a disturbance on the 2000 block of Sales Yard Road. A female was harassing residents at the location. The female was arrested and booked into the BC jail.

- An officer responded to a report of a fraud at Gateway Chevron on Merlot Drive. The RP stated that someone was using his card at the location. The officer attempted to contact the RP to no avail. The RP later returned the call. Investigation ongoing.
- WSP officer assist on Grant Avenue/Wine Country Road.
- An officer responded to an animal complaint at the 1900 block of Highland Drive. The officer noted a small dog in a kennel at the location with its basic needs not being met (food, water). The officer notified the owner and gave him a verbal warning to remedy the situation.
- Officers responded to an animal complaint on SR22. The officers noted a dog in a yard with its basic needs (food, water, shelter) not being met. The officer attempted multiple times to contact the owner to no avail. The dog was impounded and the officer left a notice at the home.
- An officer responded to an informational report given at the police department.

The RP stated that a male was at the facility making employees uncomfortable due to his suspicious actions. It was suspected that he was trying to steal an item as well. The manager at the location requested that he be trespassed from the facility, which he was.
- An officer responded to a report of narcotics at the 300 block of Wine Country Road. The RP stated that he witnessed the possible selling of narcotics. There was no video and no further information. The vehicle had left. This appears to be a recurring issue at the location.
- An officer responded to a report of an alarm at the 900 block of Campbell Drive. The resident stated there are no issues and that the alarm had gone off while changing the battery.
- Officers responded to a report of weapons at Park Avenue/Brown Street. The RP stated that they had witnessed a male pull out and brandish a firearm at a female. The officers detained the male while they questioned the female. The female denied the report. The male was questioned and then released. No crime at this time.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances near the Prosser Cemetery. The RP stated that they feel that someone in a blue sedan had been following them from Richland. There was no interaction with the other car, but they had slowed down when the RP turned into the cemetery. Vehicle was not located. Later in the day, the RP called back and stated that the vehicle was following her again, while she was walking. The RP did not respond to repeated
